Ram Lal Anand College has following Modules currently operational (as below) of Management Information system: 1. There is a module for online payment of fees by students which take care of annual fees and examination fees charged by students through Adusys (UBI). 2. The college is part of Management Information system of University of Delhi, which gives it access to uploading of practical examination marks, Internal continuous evaluation data and printing of admit card for examination of students. 3. A dedicated admission portal of University of Delhi is in place for online registration, printing of admission forms and confirmation of admission to college. 4. The College has a dedicated module for staff salaries, arrears and income tax calculation, pension, Account ledger, cash book and bank reconciliation. Every month, this autogenerates and sends salary statements to employees. 5. There are modules linked for GeM, Eprocurement and Etendering. 6. Library is running with OPAC system functional for easy access and location of books in the library. 8. CCTV and security systems in place. 9. All notices to Faculty are sent through email.

Part-B

CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Ram Lal Anand College follows the curriculum developed by the University of Delhi which is delivered in a planned duly documented process. Following activities were taken towards effective curriculum delivery and documentation in the academic year 2017-18:

- a. Preparation of College Academic Calendar
- b. The workload and timetable were prepared well before the start of an academic session for smooth functioning.
- c. The timetable was uploaded on the college website and also displayed in front of all classrooms. Allocation of papers was made keeping the expertise and interest of teachers in mind. Hard copies as well as soft copies of room wise time table is provided to each faculty member on the first working day of the semester
- d. Lesson plans for each course developed

The students were given information about all these through College and Departmental Orientation programmes, department and college notice board and college website. Overarching theme of each paper is discussed with the students in the introductory classes. The relevance and context of each paper is conveyed to the students. Prescribed readings both essential and referential are listed for both Hindi & English medium students. The faculty members configures lectures in such a manner that they are able to finish their syllabus before the scheduled week of winding of the semester. The whole syllabus is divided into units along with the tentative number of lectures to be assigned to each particular unit. This helps in the organization of teaching module and also to keep pace with the target of finishing the syllabus in a comfortable mode.

Departments follow various curriculum delivery methods to suit the requirements of the courses and students including chalk and talk method, Bilingual lectures, one-to-one interactions, Power Point presentations with specialised videos (ICT based teaching), hands on training in labs, Enactment techniques, film screenings, Theatrical adaptations etc. Invited lectures are also organised along with educational field visits and excursions for experiential learning. These include visits to Heritage tours, instrumentation facilities of research institutes, libraries etc.

Students are also connected through social media platforms with the teachers and their peers. We also have mentor Sessions and interaction with Industry experts and alumni sessions for students. Departments ensured that prescribed course readings were made available in the college library. It also uploaded question banks on the college website. Faculty participated in every course meeting of the Department and these updates were also directed to students well in advance. Students were encouraged to use Online learning resources (INFLIBNET, SWAYAM, NPTEL). Departments organized tutorial and remedial classes for needy students to help them cope with the curriculum. To supplement theoretical knowledge with applications, students were made to work on projects and case studies. Extra reference material for improving the knowledge base and academic performance of the students. Co-curricular activities (seminars, talks, distinguished lectures, debates, study tours, mock parliament etc.) were conducted. Internal assessment was done through through class tests, group discussions, presentations, quizzes.

Slow and advanced learners are identified through class performance. A collaborative learning environment is created for slow and advance learners. Special attention is given to slow learners through remedial and doubt clearing classes. Simple language is used in the study materials, so that such students can understand it easily. Advanced learners are encouraged to take up research

work and present in seminars, symposiums. Internships opportunities are provided to students to encourage them to mould their passion into profession.

1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

IQAC collects the feedback through offline or online modes in the form of google form from Students, Parents at the end of each semester. Feedback is taken on curriculum, various aspects of college including academics, library, infrastructure, office, canteen, laboratory, library and administration. The suggestions obtained in the feedback are compiled and discussed in IQAC meeting and corrective measures are taken. 2.3.2 Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Yes, the college has a mentoring system for students that seeks to address academic, social, economic and personal issues of students. The meetings are held regularly. The students can further be also be referred to a Counsellor appointed by the college, should they require the need of specialized services.

This Mentor-Mentees concept ensures a constant interaction between the faculty and the students. The motto is to help students in infusion of knowledge, giving them psychological support and helping them in development of character. Each faculty member is assigned a group of students to discuss and counsel them on their academic and personal matters. The major highlights of the concept are: Bi-monthly interaction, though mentors are 24 X 7 approachable through email, Phone and WhatsApp groups; Register maintained with details of their mentees; One to one discussion and guidance over academic, financial, welfare/personal requirements, career and higher education requirements. Field tours also give a chance to students to interact informally with faculty members. Final year students are also mentored by alumni during alumni interaction sessions to help choose career options after completion of their graduation.

2.5.2 Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

Assessment and evaluation forms an integral part of the entire educational process. It is essential that, during and at the end of a course of study, both the teacher and the taught should evaluate how far they have succeeded in the attainment of the objectives of the course.

It is mandatory for all colleges to follow and adopt directions issued by the DU vide its ordinance VIII-E for Internal Assessment. The university has taken various initiatives from time to time to improve the level of education like annual system, semester system, FYUP and now CBCS. Application of internal assessment methods varies from teacher to teacher and course to course. Faculty members use both conventional and innovative evaluation methods in order to account for diversity in students' needs and abilities. Throughout the semester, academic performance of the students is evaluated by the teachers through various means like class tests, e-Quiz, Powerpoint presentations, group discussion, class tests, , class etc. Assignments are also given from time to time so that students solve the problems and form a solution bank. Some teachers make the students do projects, which are not a mandatory part of the course so that the students learn to apply the subject that they study in real life situations. Multiple sets of question-papers are set by faculty to expose students to a larger variety of questions. Students with weak communication skills in English are also helped by faculty of department of English. Teachers also conduct multiple tests and assignments to improve academic performance of students.

Institution adopt all the evaluation directions issued by the DU vide its ordinance VIII-E for Internal Assessment based on Comprehensive Continuous Evaluation (CCE) as prescribed by University of Delhi for 50 marks in Practical Examination (through number of practical done and attendance) is carried out. 25 marks in Theory Examination through Attendance, Class Tests and Assignments. As per the University provisions, 25 marks are allocated to an end-of-semester practical examination conducted in the presence of a University appointed external examiner. Students are made aware of the evaluation process in the orientation program at the beginning of session and also informed through Prospectus.

The entire IA calculation is shared with students and discrepancies are rectified before submission to the teacher-in-charge by respective faculty. The IA is displayed prominently on the notice board after moderation at the Departmental level, prior to submission to the University. A reasonable window is provided to the students to enable them to personally verify the IA marks and report any inaccuracies, discrepancies and inadvertent omissions to the IA Committee for necessary action. Students personally verify and put their signatures on a copy of the course-wise list of IA marks submitted to the University. Any errors detected at this stage are taken up by the IA Committee and /or Grievance Committee on a case-by-case basis after thoroughly going through previous records and suitably resolved. At the end of semester, internal assessment uploading on university portal is done by IA monitoring committee and final uploaded marks are again shown to students. Result Analysis done by departments is submitted to IQAC.

2.5.3 Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

Academic calendar issued by the University of Delhi is followed by college. The college adheres to its dates of commencing of semester classes, mid semester breaks, dispersal of classes, beginning and end of practical exam and theory exams. It is uploaded on the college website and the students are informed during both college and departmental orientations. College also prepares its own academic calendar and timetable for various courses which are publicized through college website, both college and departmental orientations. Each department also prepares its academic calendar describing tentative dates for all the activities including internal examination schedule, extra-curricular activities schedule and Internal Assessment schedule for the upcoming session. Information regarding Internal Examination, Assignment submission, Remedial class schedule etc. is displayed on dept notice board well in advance (apart from information through various modes, including What's App and email) for the students.

Departments prepare their End-Semester Practical exam schedule at least a month in advance before the commencement of Practical exams and notify them on departmental notice boards. Dates for the submission of internal assessment marks are notified by the college. IA marks are displayed on the notice boards as well as on the website and respective teachers take the signatures of the students so that if there are any grievances they can be sorted out before uploading of marks at DU portal. IA marks are moderated by Departmental IA Moderation committee submitted to College IA Committee, which verifies these marks and gets them uploaded on DU portal. Once the IA marks are uploaded, they are shown to students again. In case of any problem, they can approach IA committee or principal for clarification/ rectification.

4.4.2 Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. (*maximum 500 words*) (information to be available in institutional Website, provide link).

The college follows transparency in procedures and policies with respect to maintaining and utilization of physical, academic and support facilities for optimum use of the facilities for the benefit of the stake holders. Library Committee consists of teachers incharges of all departments formulates the library budget on the basis of which funds are earmarked for department wise purchase of books. Any additional funds received by the college for purchase of books are distributed to the departments in committee meeting. The process of purchase of books, its maintenance, weeding out old books are taken care of by the Librarian and the library staff. Books and journals purchases are based on the recommendations of the Committee and the faculty members. The Equal Opportunity Cell of the college also makes recommendations with regard to the facilities in the library for differently abled students and faculty members. These recommendations, after the approval of the Principal, are implemented by the Infrastructure Committee in consultation with the Library Committee and library staff. The Building cum Infrastructure Committee with bursar undertakes infrastructural needs of the college through meetings and recommendations are forwarded to Principal/Governing Body for approvals. In addition, departments (teaching and non-teaching) and IQAC send their requisition for specific requirements from time to time. Such requisitions are scrutinized by the committee and purchases are made after due approval from the Principal following the GFR rules. Workload and Academic Affairs committee takes care of Academic and support facilities. The other staff council committees such as Timetable Committee, Students Union Advisory Committee, Student Aid and Fee, Concession Committee, Women Welfare Committee, Sports Committee etc. looks after the academic, financial, cultural and sports needs of the students. Students and faculty members are encouraged to do research (guided by the Research Committee of the college). The ECA cum Arts and Culture Committee encourage students to take part in various cultural activities within the college as well as compete in the cultural festivals at the national level for their holistic growth.

College Caretaker also takes care of routine maintenance of classrooms, furniture, lighting, blackboard etc

College has an electrician who looks after routine maintenance of all electrical installations. Similarly plumbing and gardening work are taken care by specialized personnel under the supervision of Gardening Committee and Eco-Club. The classrooms and laboratories are maintained by the multi-tasking staff and the laboratory staff. College has maintained a complaint register with the caretaker and an easily accessible

Complaint Box has been installed. Building and infrastructure committee meets every month to go through complaints/suggestions/feedback received. Any minor repairs that need to be carried out are reported and the expenses for these are sanctioned by the Principal as per norms. In case of major repairs, the committee

puts forward a request for sanction to the Principal. There are also specified personnel for maintenance of sports ground and library. Voltage stabilizers and online UPS have been installed to safeguard the major electrical devices. The college has 160KV silent Electricity Generators with AMF Panel to ensure uninterrupted power supply. A staff member along with Caretaker and electrician monitors the functioning of this silent green DG set. Maintenance of the set is done by the concerned company through AMC. All the desktops with Printer and LAN are maintained through AMC with full time employee/engineer of company during the working hour. CCTV, Intercom and DG set are also taken care via AMC. Services of a Professional IT company have been used for maintenance and regular upgradation of College Website.

| 6.1.1 Mention two practices of decentralization and participative management during the last year (maximum 500 words) |

The college practices decentralization and participative management. The college has Governing Body, Principal, Staff Council Committees and Student Representatives, Teachers and Librarian, as per Statutes and Ordinances of the university, constitute the Staff Council. The Principal is the ex-officio Chairman of Staff Council. All the important committees of the college like Admission, Infrastructure, Student Union Advisory, Workload and Academic Affairs, Equal Opportunity Cell, Art and Culture and many others come under Staff Council. The duly elected Secretary of the Staff Council and its Chairman (Principal) supervises the functioning of these Committees. Each department has a society with faculty members and elected student members. The efforts and measures of our institution have been channelized and systematized towards academic excellence after the inception of IQAC in the college. All the Committees are required to give a detailed report in prescribed format of the events organized by them including feedback of students to the Secretary Staff Council and Coordinator IQAC. The faculty members take lead in organizing various academic and co-curricular activities in the college wherein students get a chance to enhance organizational skills besides getting an insight into new developments in the area of their interest.

Case Study 1: Before the start of every session, the Secretary Staff council writes to all the faculty members to submit their preferences for the staff council committees as member/convener/co-conveners. A deadline is given to submit their preferences for the same by email. All responses received from faculty are taken into account and a tentative list of staff council committees is prepared by secretary staff council in consultation with Chairman staff council (Principal). This list is shared with all faculty members and a meeting of staff council is convened to approve the formation of committees. Each committee constitution is discussed and suggestions from faculty

Case Study 2: Before the beginning of every session, the Convener, Workload and Academic Affairs Committee writes to the Teachers Incharge to submit workload of their respective Departments for the upcoming semester. Teacher Incharge, convenes a meeting of all faculty members of respective department to discuss the workload and calculates the workload. The calculated workload along with the minutes of the meeting is submitted to the Principal who forwards it to the convener of Workload and Academic Affairs Committee. Convener of Workload and Academic Affairs Committee convenes a meeting of Teachers Incharge and discusses it further and sends it to the Principal. This workload is placed in the Governing Body Meeting by the Principal for necessary approval. The requirement of additional teachers as approved is then met through seeking approval for advertisement and interview by selection committee.

| <u>BEST PRACTICE I: WOMEN’S SAFETY AND GENDER PARITY</u> |

Goal: To create a safe, secure and cohesive environment and learning space especially for female students as a necessary precondition to imparting quality education thereby creating a more conducive and inclusive culture of co-existence.

Context: Keeping in view the commitment to constitutional goal of equality among individuals irrespective of gender difference, Higher Education Institutions in India can play a seminal role in safeguarding the interest of female students against threats and attacks, both deliberate and incidental. In fact, the institutions can play a significant role in protecting and ensuring safety and security through the various mechanisms and relevant provisions in the best interest of the students. To attain this, the role and mandate of Women Welfare and Advisory Committee (WWAC) of the college has been radically revised to accomplish the stated purpose. The effort is directed towards institutionalizing the best practices that can not only protect and secure female students from any potentially threatening and dangerous situation but also to inculcate in them physical and psychological strength and a strong spirit to effectively handle any adverse situation.

The practice: The Women Welfare and Advisory Committee of the college through its administrative efforts have successfully achieved an absolutely safe and secure campus for students by installing mechanisms of strict check and vigilance of entry and exit of the students and outsiders in the college. The college boundary wall is adequately fortified to prevent any undesirable entry; entry and exit gates are secured to a necessary minimum number to keep strict check; sufficient number of security guards along with help from Delhi Police is deployed around the clock to regularly check visitors and entrants for identity cards and other necessary forms of verification; CCTV cameras are installed in good numbers to regularly monitor activities and movement within the college campus. Further, proper notice and information boards are installed at various strategic points on campus, particularly the frequently visited spots by students like the canteen, or the front stage assembly area etc. These boards with accurate information on helpline numbers, faculty members to contact in case of eve-teasing, harassment and other such accidents are properly displayed at all times. Apart from looking into the grievances/complaints of students, especially cases of gender discrimination of backward classes, WWAC in collaboration with various departments and committees regularly organises awareness programmes through lectures, seminars, talks, Self-Defence Training programmes, workshops, debates, film and documentary screenings etc. thereby facilitating a gender-sensitive environment enabling women and men to maximize their potential and work towards a holistic development of both mind and spirit.

Furthermore, in order to achieve and maintain a strong ethical, academic and work culture which is based on genuine inclusivity, WWAC of the college provides equal opportunities to all individuals irrespective of their economic class, caste, religion or ethnic background. In order to achieve gender parity in its true sense, the college gives 1% relaxation in cut-offs to all female students across all courses at the time of admissions every year. Gender sensitivity as an inherent value in all aspects is not just observed but also highly encouraged among students and other staff.

Evidence of Success: The Women Welfare Advisory Committee under its Convenor Dr. Vandana Gupta organized the following:

1. Self Defense programme for girl students from 18- 22 September 2017 in collaboration with Delhi Police and Women Power Association, an NGO based in Delhi.
2. Lecture on Cyber Security by the Cyber Security cell of Delhi Police.
3. Poster completion on the occasion of International Women's Day was held on the topic "Women in Science".
4. This committee in association with CSR Research Foundation installed a sanitary napkin vending machine in Girls student common room on 24 April 2018. Mr Deen Dayal Aggarwal, President CSR foundation introduced about CSR Research Foundation initiative "Mission AAA", Awareness, Availability & Affordability of sanitary napkins, promote Healthcare, Hygiene for women besides Gender Sensitivity and Women Empowerment at large.

Problems Encountered: There was issue related to time of self defense course so that maximum girl students could participate. The amphitheatre capacity being limited to 120, more students could not be accommodated in the lecture on cyber security in which a large number of students were interested

BEST PRACTICE II: SOCIAL JUSTICE, SOCIAL INCLUSION AND HUMAN RIGHTS

The Context:

In the past two decades, there has been an upsurge in development of global frameworks on human rights, anti-discrimination laws, and independent institutions aimed at protecting human rights. Social integration is understood as a dynamic and principled process of promoting the values, relations and institutions that enable all people to participate in social, economic, cultural and political life on the basis of equality of rights, equity and dignity. It is the process in which societies engage in order to foster societies that are stable, safe and just – societies that are based on the promotion and protection of all human rights, as well as respect for and value of dignity of each individual, diversity, pluralism, tolerance, non-discrimination, non-violence, equality of opportunity, solidarity, security, and participation of all people, including disadvantaged and vulnerable groups and persons.

Social inclusion is understood as a process by which efforts are made to ensure equal opportunities for all, regardless of their background, so that they can achieve their full potential in life. It is a multi-dimensional process aimed at creating conditions which enable full and active participation of every member of the society in all aspects of life, including civic, social, economic, and political activities, as well as participation in decision-making processes. The dominant view can therefore be understood as presenting a ‘discontinuous’ conception of the normative relationship between social justice and human rights. The dominant philosophical view thus presents a type of human rights-plus conception of social justice: social justice includes human rights but contains a further conception of equality rights that are not human rights.

The underlying theme and the vision of the College is that Education can contribute to achieve equal opportunity for social integration, but a level of social equity is also required to achieve the democratization of access to knowledge. It is necessary to develop educational policies that deal in a comprehensive manner with the factors that generate exclusion, discrimination or inequality. The College aimed at responding to students diversity, increasing their participation and reducing exclusion in and from education. It is related to access, participation and learning achievements of all students, with special emphasis on those who, for different reasons, are excluded or run the risk of being marginalized.

The Practice: From Integration to Inclusion

Integration and inclusion are movements with a different aim and focus, promoting different educational policies and practices. Going from integration to inclusion, there are certain characteristic that implies to the College. The Institution is continuously working towards:-

a. The shift from assuring the right of some traditionally excluded groups, to educating all students in mainstream that provide an equal quality education to all.

b. The shift from individualized actions for the “integrated students”, to the transformation of the

entire educational environment for them to respond to diversity and the needs of all.

Ram Lal Anand College's mission and vision is characterized by: A different view of education, based on diversity and not on homogeneity. Balance between what is common and what is diverse.

• It aims at identifying and minimizing the barriers students face to access, participate and learn. • Support systems that collaborate with teachers in responding to the diversity of students.

Ram Lal Anand College aims at • Building a comprehensive approach of inclusive education with a wide participation. • Developing policies with inter institutional coordination at every level. • Moving forward from standardized strategies to approaches that consider diversity and social cohesion. • Promoting flexibility and diversification of the educational provisions and rights of the students. • Reviewing policies and procedures for admitting students • Designing curricula, teaching strategies and assessment systems that consider diversity • Reviewing the funding schemes to make an equitable distribution of the resources. • Analysing decentralization models to prevent the widening of inequalities. • Ensuring support systems to the departments that most need them. • Paying special attention to the affective and emotional aspects.

Evidences of Success:-

While focusing and keeping the above mentioned vision and mission of the College, the College is able to successfully achieve the following:-

- Renovation of Library is done and the college campus has been made completely wi-fi enabled to enable students to derive maximum benefits;
- College provided financial assistance to needy and academically deserving students in the form of fee concession. A total of Rs 2,30,000/- was disbursed this year among 143 students as financial aid in this academic session. Twenty three students have been selected for Full fee concession from Delhi Government. Financial transparency is maintained and governance is practiced in day to day functioning of the College.
- A Certificate Course on "Heritage and Tourism Management" has been started by the College. After the completion of the Course, the interested students got the opportunity to work with the Nijhawan Group of companies. This enabled the students to have a field experience and exposure which is highly needed for a successful career.
- The Women's Welfare society organized One Week Self Defence Programme for girls with lectures on Gender Sensitization.
- An Awareness Campaign was organized for educating students in issues related to Health which is a prime indicator in the delivery of human rights.
- Medical facility and Counsellor services available to all in college
- The Society Sangosthi also organized the First Dr Ambedkar Memorial Lecture entitled "Dr. B.R. Ambedkar and Making of the Modern India" in collaboration with the Department of Hindi Patrakarita evam Jansanchar on April 12, 2018.
- Film Club "Parda" organized short Film Making Competition on different social issues which were highly relevant in issues related to Social Inclusion and Human Rights.

- Talk entitled “Interpreting Gandhi in Contemporary Indian Society” was given by Prof Ramesh Bhardwaj, Director, Gandhi Bhawan on 28 February 2018.
- Talk entitled “Constitutional Vision of Justice in India” by Prof Bhushan Tilak Kaul, Chairperson, Delhi Judicial Academy was held on 31 October 2018 under monthly lecture series by Sangosthi.
- Nearby slum adopted for conducting literacy programs, drives on hygiene and health awareness

Problems Encountered: There has been delay in renovation of library as it is being handled by an outside agency. Limited capacity of amphitheatre for events. Slum population was not very receptive in the beginning and had to be approached and counselled many times.

Ram Lal Anand College is a premiere institution of higher education truly dedicated to imparting quality education and inculcating best values, ethics and environmental consciousness in students. Environmental protection forms one of the prime focus areas of the institution’s moral and ethical practices. The institution, through various committees and activities organised at college level, engages students in a plethora of initiatives to efficiently promote environmental protection and evoke environmental consciousness among students. Green Audit of the college has been conducted through outside agency and the recommendations are being effectively implemented.

The college has a dynamic Eco-Club which has lived up to its idea for reforming through activities within the college locale and to instil the practice of protecting the environment from pollution and destruction among the students and to encourage them to play a more active role in making the campus the best green campus. Besides, studying a mandatory course on Environmental Studies, students are sensitized towards the deteriorating environment through various lecture series and awareness campaigns. This year Eminent Environmentalists Mr Bharat Dogra, Prof Radhey Shayam Sharma, Principal Scientist A Arunachalam visited the college and inspired and guided students regarding various aspects of Environmental protection and conservation.

Raising awareness about waste management is being done at the college level itself. Marking India’s 70th independence and following Prime Minister Modi's call for 'A Clean and Green India', the Eco club of the college, in collaboration with the Cleanliness Committee and NSS Unit installed blue and green garbage and recycling bins at various locations in the college campus for proper segregation of waste and to spread awareness about efficient waste management. Proper measures are taken to ensure the mounds of segregated waste is sent for recycling and used to make compost through composting machines installed in the campus. Eco Club organized a “Waste Management Awareness Drive” in the college on the 20th of September 2017 where volunteers visited all classrooms and discussed the issue and its importance with all students.

On 27th of September 2017, the Eco Club organised One-day seminar on the topic “Nurturing Ecology: Human Practices and Conservation” with eminent personalities Shri Bharat Dogra ji, a journalist and activist, Dr. Mayank Kumar, esteemed professor of Delhi University and Ms. Tamanna Sharma, director at Earthling. Through their informative and focused speech and

discussion, the students gained a serious insight into how human practices affect the ecology simultaneously making them aware about their responsibility towards saving and taking care of nature. Students under NSS worked at International Book Fair with the theme Environment and climate. As a part of our well-established best practices of the college, Rain Water Harvesting system is functional since 2010 with trench capacity of 8,000 liters.

Most of the Students and Staff use car-pooling or public transport facilities. NSS and NCC units also regularly organize cleanliness, and Clothes Donation drives to develop environmental consciousness and sensitivity in students. The college actively discourages the use of plastic in canteen. The college has a 2500 sq.mt. spread of lush Green Campus with an excellent variety of trees and shrubs. The tree census of the college is also completed with proper naming of the trees with their scientific names that have been put up. Several Tree Plantation drives were also conducted this year under NSS and NCC. Moreover, the college is also currently trying to meet its 20% power requirements through LED bulbs. The college is also doing Paper recycling in collaboration with an NGO. The college office and departments are also meticulously trying to reduce paper consumption by adopting digital tools. The college conducts E-Waste auction through tendering to Govt. Authorized vendors. In another attempt, “Best out of E-Waste” competition was held on 4th September 2017 to develop awareness on this issue.

- Motivate students for self-employment & to enable them to emerge as entrepreneurs. Awarding Innovative ideas of students through Centre for Entrepreneurship and Technology Development.
- Empower students with latest technology/ software & guide them for online courses and provide them the platform to use e-resources for research and curriculum enhancement

within the college.

- To aware our students about environment and its importance through active participation in Cleanliness drive, Plantation drive, Geo tagging, Field Trip, etc.
- Attempts to be made to formulate a comprehensive module which would train students to meet linguistic/scholastic deficit and exclusive classes for them can be organised to help them realize their potential.
- Registration of Alumni Association Under Society Act and organising Alumni lecture series in every department to broaden the knowledge horizon.
- More Focus on career counselling and placement cell : placement drives, internship fairs, career counselling workshops and MoU for managing placement/internship schedules and records Faculty, students, alumni parents and employers.
- New sports for girls to be introduced
- Infrastructural: Library upgradation, Development of area outside canteen to increase the seating capacity, purchase of equipments for media lab.
- To encourage the non-teaching staff In house Training programs for non-teaching staff: ICT tools, Administrative rules, GeM, E-tendering to be conducted for them
- To empower faculty about emerging trends in their profession for academic advancement Faculty development programs on modern innovative teaching methods including LMS, ICT tools, OBE, emotional intelligence, Research Proposal Writing, IPR Related issues, Quality Assurance in HEIs to be conducted
- Motivating faculty to submit research project proposals and for organizing Seminar/conference/workshop: DBT, ICSSR, ICHR, PAI etc
- The college will strive to develop E-content for platforms such as e-PG-Pathshala, CEC, SWAYAM and MOOCs.
- The college also plans to conduct outreach programs involving students and faculty which would be under the ambit of social responsibility. An attempt would be made to educate the illiterates in the slum adopted, to develop consciousness towards environment and to conduct drives for increasing understanding of hygienic conditions.
