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Principal's Report

Good Morning Everyone!

I feel privileged to extend a very warm welcome to distinguished guests, my teaching and non-teaching colleagues and my dear students to the 55th Annual Day of Ram Lal Anand College, which is a celebration of growth of college, and achievements of students and staff in the current academic session. It has been a very fulfilling academic year for all of us.

On this occasion, we are honored to have with us our esteemed **Chief Guest, Dr. Ramesh V. Sonti, Director, National Institute of Plant Genome Research**. I take this opportunity to share with you, his endeavors and experiences. Dr. Sonti completed his PhD in the area of bacterial genetics from the University of Utah, USA. He did post-doctoral research in plant genetics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, USA. He worked as Chief Scientist and Group Leader at the CSIR-Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology in Hyderabad before joining the present assignment as Director, National Institute of Plant Genome Research. His research interests are understanding the mechanisms in plant-pathogen interactions and marker assisted selection in rice improvement.

Dr. Ramesh Sonti is a recipient of the most Prestigious **Shanthi Swarup Bhatnagar Award** in Biological Sciences in addition to the National Bioscience Award and J. C. Bose fellowship. He is an elected fellow of Indian National Science Academy, National Academy of Sciences, Indian Academy of Sciences, National Academy of Agricultural Sciences, and Telangana Academy of Sciences. Dr. Sonti and his collaborators have jointly developed and popularized an Improved disease resistant rice crop variety, Samba Mahsuri, for which they have received the CSIR Award for S & T Innovations for Rural Development (CAIRD)-2014 and the Biotech Product Process Development and Commercialization Award-2016 by Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. Under his dynamic leadership, NIPGR has received a large amount of funds for research and infrastructure development. The institution is achieving new milestones and touching new horizons in the field of plant research.

His perseverance, far-sightedness makes him a true role model and a guiding force for all of us. Sir, we are fortunate to have you with us today in the college.

I also heartily welcome Honorable, Chairman Governing Body Prof. Binay Kumar, Professor at the Department of Physics & Astrophysics, University of Delhi. Prof.

Binay Kumar is an eminent, internationally renowned Scientist and a teacher since 1992 with more than 150 research papers and review articles in high impact International refereed Journals (Citations: ~2700; h-index: 29; i10-index: 80). His Research Interests include Crystal Growth, Nanoparticles, Ceramic, Piezo-/Ferroelectricity, Energy Harvesting, Sensor & Communication Devices. He has handled 6 Major Projects with more than Rs.3 crores of funding from DST, DRDO and UGC and R & D Grants from Delhi University. He is known as a great mentor and kindhearted guide among his students. Our College has been greatly benefitted under his leadership and support and is growing day by day. **Sir, we are indeed honoured by your gracious presence on our 55th Annual Day.**

We are blessed to have amongst us, Ms Lalita Nijhawan, Director Nijhawan Group and a great social worker focussing on gender equality and girl education. India. Ma'am, we welcome you heartily on this occasion. Now, I take great pleasure in presenting the Annual Report of our college for the session 2018-19

Ram Lal Anand College was established in 1964 by Eminent Lawyer of the Supreme Court of India and a Great Visionary **Shri Ram Lal Anand Ji**. It started with just two pass courses, B.A. and B.Com. and now offers **fourteen** Undergraduate courses in all the three streams, i.e. Humanities, Commerce and Science and **One** PG course in Hindi. Our college is fully funded by the UGC and is maintained by the University of Delhi.

During the current academic session 2018-19, **815** students were admitted to different courses and a total of **2100 students** are presently enrolled in all the three years put together. This year with the special efforts of admission committee and Equal Opportunity Cell, we could enhance the tally of PwD students to 11, providing free education to all of them. The college has been the partnering institution with AICTE to provide education to J & K students under Prime Minister Special Scholarship Scheme (PMSSS). The College admitted 6 students this year under this scheme. University of Delhi selected our college as the **screening cum selection centre** for admission to undergraduate UG programmes to all DU colleges on the basis of Quiz under ECA Category.

I would like to share with you the **achievements of our students, faculty and staff:**

At the end of 2018, **599** students appeared in the University final year examinations. I am very happy to report that the pass percentage was **91.8 %** out of which **59 %** students obtained I division and **31%** obtained II division. A comparative analysis of results with all neighbouring and many popular colleges shows that the students of our college are outperforming all of them.

This outstanding academic performance of our students is very well reflected by receiving a number of academic scholarships/fellowships from various Institutions/organizations. The Prestigious DST Inspire fellowship of Rs. 80,000 per annum has been awarded to 8 students of our college this year. 7 students have received scholarships each of Rs 1 lakh per annum with full fee concession under J&K PMSSS scheme, five students of North East got UGC Ishaan Uday scholarship @ Rs 54000/- per annum. 25 students got scholarship under different state and central Government schemes. Six students of Department of Microbiology got a fellowship of Rs 2500/- per month under DBT sponsored extramural research Grant. Nikhat Parveen of BA (Hons) Pol science I Year got a scholarship of Rs. 9000 from World Brotherhood organisation. In all 130 students received such scholarships.

In addition to the above scholarships, the college also provides financial assistance to the needy and academically deserving students. **Rs. 2,69,000/-** has been disbursed to a total of **52** students as financial aid in this academic session. 39 students were given full fee concession. 404 SC/ST students were exempted from paying tuition fees this year.

The laurels brought by the students were not restricted to academics only. Their performance in co-curricular activities and sports was equally outstanding and commendable. A total of 15 prizes were won by the students of ECA Committee in inter-college competitions of arts and crafts, dance and music. Priya Kumari was awarded second prize in Painting competition at the renowned annual festival of IIT Bombay. Hitesh Taneja received III prize at International Day for preservation of Ozone Layer, organized by Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate change. 10 prizes won by the students of debating society in national and Inter-college competitions. Shreya Uttam of BJMC was awarded third prize of Rs 11,000/- in a national debate competition in which 54 students from 11 states participated. The students of Quiz and Chitra society also won 15 prizes at

various competitions. In all more than 60 prizes were received by the students under above categories.

NCC cadets represented the college under 7th Delhi battalion in various National Events and Camps such as OTA SSB COURSE, CM RALLY, THAL SAINIK CAMP and PARASAILING CAMP. Many of these cadets were selected as the best performers during these camps. Gourav Sinha, NSS volunteer was selected to attend ten days NSS Adventure Camp in Himachal Pradesh and pre-Republic Day camp of North Zone in Rajasthan. He was one of the five NSS Volunteers selected from Delhi region. Another NSS volunteer Keshav Goyal was one among the ten students from all DU colleges who was selected for the National Integration Camp held at Mohali Chandigarh.

6 medals were won by our sports students in inter college tournaments in Judo and Boxing. 3 students were selected to play at All India University level in Judo and Ball Badminton. Shubham our best sportsperson won Gold medal in Judo in Khelo India National Youth games held at Pune. These sports star students were felicitated by the college through cash incentives and full exemption from payment of college fees.

The Quality of Higher Education is ensured by those mentors who strive hard to acquire new knowledge and act as role models for their mentees. Their achievements have far reaching impact on the delivery and transfer of knowledge.

It's a pleasure for me to share that a total of 6 Research proposals were submitted to ICSSR under IMPRESS Scheme for funding by our faculty this year. One Research Proposal entitled "**Study of varied complexities of North East region and role of National Cadet Corps to integrate it strongly within the national mainstream**" submitted by Dr. Sanjay Kumar Sharma as Project Director and Dr. Rita Jain as Co-Project Director was successfully approved for funding of Rs. 4.99 lakhs for one year. The other submitted proposals have cleared the stage II of the selection process and are under consideration. Mr Vinay Kumar of Department of Economics has received a research award under DAAD Exchange Programme to University of Buenos Aires, Argentina. Dr Parul Gaur of Department of History obtained an amount of Rs. 67000 from ICSSR to present her research paper in International Conference at Oxford University Church, Oxfordshire UK.

Dr Ravish Lal of Department of Geology got INQUA award of 1400 Euros to present his research paper in the 2019 congress held in Dublin, Ireland.

In this session, our faculty has published 18 research papers/articles in highly reputed and refereed journals, 6 books and 14 chapters/e-modules. Faculty members have presented 33 research papers in various International and National Seminars/Conferences. 5 faculty members have attended three weeks refresher/orientation courses. One PhD student has been awarded PhD degree under the guidance of Dr Rakesh Kumar, Associate Professor in Hindi and three more PhD students have been registered under Dr Rakesh Kumar, Dr Sanjay Kumar and Dr Archana Gaur of Department of Hindi. Six office and library staff attended upgradation training programmes conducted by the colleges and University of Delhi.

I would like to take this opportunity to brief you about the key developments and new initiatives taken by the college during the year

This year we are able to fulfil a long standing requirement of UGC i.e. accreditation of the college by National Accreditation and Assessment Council (NAAC). The college has been **Accredited by NAAC and got a CGPA of 2.84 with grade of B++**. Two major features of the college identified by the Peer Team were 1) the Staff and students along with the Principal work as a cohesive group and 2) Green and clean campus and very aesthetically maintained. I extend my heartfelt thanks to all the students, faculty and staff involved in the preparations of NAAC evaluation for showcasing our strengths and setting an example of team work. The college is taking all necessary steps now to achieve a better score in the next cycle.

Our college was selected as one of the five **Nodal Centres in Delhi by NSS Directorate** to host District Youth Parliament (DYP) competition to select the best ideas of youth for the future development of our Nation, a thought of our honourable Prime Minister.

A new **Centre for Human Values, Life Skills and Ethics was established in the college** which has started a non-credit 40 hours course on Human Values, Ethics and Life

Skills for Ist year students.170 students have attended this course and will be awarded a certificate soon.

For enhanced learning experience of students and faculty, Ram Lal Anand College enrolled itself as **Local Chapter** for MHRD sponsored National Program on Technology Enhanced Learning (**NPTEL**) and appointed Ms. Sweeti Yadav, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics as single point of contact (SPOC). A total of 731 students and 18 faculty members of ten departments enrolled in different courses on NPTEL and 105 students registered for certification exams and 52 successfully completed the courses in first phase. Rupendra Yadav of BSc (Hons) Mathematics topped in Linear Algebra course on NPTEL. This is a very promising beginning in the direction of curriculum enrichment and we will certainly see more enrolments next year.

The college has started regular in-house training programs for faculty and non-teaching staff from this session. Four Faculty Development Programme on “**Writing Research Proposals and Addressing IPR Related issues**”, “**Quality Assurance in HEIs: Reorienting Teaching-learning Paradigm**”, “**Emotional Intelligence**”, and **HADOOP** were conducted. A total of 142 faculty members from RLA and other colleges have been benefited through these programme. One **Training Program** entitled “**ICT tools for Beginners**” was organized for non-teaching employees of different colleges and universities. 35 staff participated in this programme.

Alumni Association of college has been formally registered under the Societies Act this year. The Association organized its first Alumni meet which was attended by Around 120 alumni. From the corpus fund collected from Alumni registrations, Alumni Merit scholarships of Rs.3000 each have been started for toppers of all programs and this year 31 scholarships have been awarded.

Three Add on Skill development certificate Courses in association with industry were successfully conducted. These are “Hospitality and Tourism Management” in collaboration with Nijhawan Group, “Hindi Anuvad” in collaboration with Hindi Anuvad Parishad and “Data Analytics” (SQL, advanced Excel and R programming) in association with Step Up Analytics. **110 students have been trained in these industry/job oriented skills.**



Out of the first batch of certificate course in Heritage and Tourism Management last year, 75% students got placements in tourism industry. The college highly appreciates and extends its gratitude to Mr Ankush Nijhawan, Director, Nijhawan Group and TBO Company and his team for their efforts in providing logistics for hands on training and placements as per our MoUs terms and conditions.

In order to promote academic cooperation and to provide a platform for students to enhance experiential learning and hands on training **Five MoUs have been signed by the college in this year with the following: IQAC of ten Colleges in Delhi (IQAC Cluster), S M Sehgal Foundation, Molitics, Amar Ujala Publications Limited and with School of Open learning, University of Delhi**

As part of MoU signed last year under “Science Setu” program with THSTI, 25 students of Microbiology participated in conference in “Immunocon-2018” and 11 students participated in a three-day lecture on “Overview of Cellular and Molecular Immunology”. Five students were selected as summer interns at THSTI.

With the dedicated efforts of Infrastructure Committee, a number of infrastructural projects have been completed and handed over including **Renovation and extension of Library into one of the best libraries of University of Delhi and Colleges, Administrative office, Accounts office, amphitheatre and laboratories.** A herbal Garden has been developed near the canteen to promote Indian Ayurvedic system of medicine. Organic waste composting machine has been installed in the college and waste segregation is being practiced. The college laboratories were enriched with latest computers and other equipment. The landscaping of the college lawns has been completed. The college exterior has been completely transformed, students are enjoying the enhanced visibility of the college and proudly sharing the pictures on the social media. A number of places in the college have become selfie points.

A number of upgradations have been done in the library. **INFLIBNET** has been subscribed by the college for remote accessibility of reading material to students and faculty. OPAC system has been made functional for an easy access and location of books in the library. **Kindle section** has been opened for digital reading of books. More than two

lakh books have been uploaded on the Kindle devices. A dedicated reading room for PwD students with books in brail and for faculty has been made functional in the library.

Some quality initiatives recommended by IQAC of the college have been instituted. One such initiative was **Bimonthly Cleanliness Drive** involving one department at a time to inculcate a sense of responsibility amongst the students. Under this initiative, departmental faculty and students participate in campus cleanliness drive according to a schedule prepared in advance. An encouraging number of 55 faculty members and more than 500 students participated in these drives. The Academic and green audit of the college has been done. Many of their recommendations have already been implemented.

Another important initiative is the start of granting **Seed money to fund Small Research Projects** to faculty members from college resources. The guidelines for this will be formulated by Research and IPR cell of the college. The college will be providing seed money and facility to students and faculty to develop their innovative tech ideas into a prototype.

With the mandate of Govt of India to promote innovations and Startup culture, Centre for Entrepreneurship and Technology Development (E-Cell) under its business incubator scheme, invited **innovative ideas/business plans from students** for new startups. This year we received 10 such proposals from students which were evaluated by Mr Digvijay Singh the COO, India Angel Network. Shubham Raj of B.Sc. (Hons) Computer Science has been selected for Best Startup Idea 2019 award carrying a cash prize of Rs. 5000 along with mentorship and incubation support. Before doing this, more than 10 founders of various new and successful startups were invited to share their experiences with the students.

175 students were selected this year for summer internships out of 250 students participated in the two days Internship Fair organized by Career Counselling and placement cell of the college. A total of 57 students from different departments completed summer Internships in 2018 at various institutions during May-July 2018. A large number of students were hired by companies like Amazon, Intellicon, etc. through campus placements.

As an index of growth and prosperity of college, I would like to proudly share that a total of About **24 lakhs of funding** has been generated by the college this year from non-

government (sponsorships) and government sources other than UGC, for organising various activities.

In addition, long pending outstanding dues of property Tax of SDMC of Rs 60 lakhs as on 31st March 2004 were cleared after continuous persuasion of UGC. Similarly, a long pending grant due since 2015 of Rs 52 lakhs in support of Department of Geology was received from UGC after lots of liaisoning. 7th Pay commission for teaching and non-teaching staff has been implemented.

RLA College is committed to inculcate moral values, a sense of responsibility among the students and their holistic growth. To achieve this goal college organised several activities on social issues under dedicated NSS unit, NCC unit and many staff council committees. Some of these activities are awareness rallies or events on cleanliness, cancer, conservation of water, Second Anniversary of Surgical Strike, spinal injuries, voter awareness, 15 days educational camp for the children of **our adopted** slum in South Moti Bagh, a Week Long Self Defence Training for girls, North East integration programme under “Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat”, panel discussion on issues of PwD and reservations, Ahimsa rally on 100th Kasturba Gandhi Death Anniversary, commemorating the 100th Anniversary of Jalianwala Bagh massacre and seminar on Nationalism, Patriotism, Human Values and gender equality and other issues.

Union and its Advisory Committee in association with Arts and Culture Society and North East Society. The festival showcased the outstanding talent of the student participants from 20 colleges of University of Delhi in various competitions like western dance, choir, battle of bands, folk dance, street play, quiz, debate, photography, videography, etc. The role of elected office bearers of the Students Union in the college functioning through various committees was very positive and commendable.

SPIC MACAY RLA Chapter organized a musical concert by one of the top soloists of India Pt. Shubhendra Rao with Sh. Pranshu Chatur Lal. His music was a great experience and instilled the value of Indian Culture in the minds of students.

Many seminars/workshops were organized to enrich the students with recent advances in their respective fields and connect with Eminent Personalities and Academicians. Being a long list of events, a few are being mentioned here. **Department of Microbiology**

organized a **National Seminar** on “**Probiotics: Ameliorating the Burden of Lifestyle diseases**” through a funding support of Rs 1,00,000 from Probiotic Association of India. The Department of Political science collaborated with Indian Institute of Public Administration for conduct of a one-day National Consultation/workshop on “**Ambedkar’s thoughts on Socio-Economic Transformation**” and got a partial funding of Rs 25,000 for the same. Department of Computer Science organised a national seminar on **Ethical Hacking in collaboration with ICT Academy**. Gandhi Study Circle organized a national seminar entitled “Understanding Gandhi” for which it got funding support of Rs. 55,000 from Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti, Rajghat, New Delhi.

Department of Physical Education organised a fitness camp for students and staff of college for awareness of physiological parameters BMI, Body Fat etc. **I am proud to share the observation of this fitness camp that more than 85% of students were found healthy on these parameters.** A **painting workshop** for students entitled “For the love of Art” was held with the themes like Indian culture, women empowerment, yoga and Meditation and Village sports. These paintings have been placed on the walls of Arts and Culture activity Hall in the central lawn and have become the centre of attraction and have been appreciated by all the visitors to the college. 3-day Yoga Work shop on the International Yoga Day, one-week theatre workshop and many one day seminars were conducted by almost every department, cell and society.

A large number of eminent personalities from various walks of life and great academicians were invited to motivate and guide our students. Some of them are Dr Mahesh Sharma, MP Rajya Sabha; Prof Achyutanand Tiwari, ex-Vice-Chancellor, Makhanlal Chaturvedi University, Bhopal; Prof Bhagwan Lal, Chairman, National Commission for Backward Classes; Prof Binay Kumar, our honourable chairman; Ms Lalita Nijhawan, GB Member and Director, Nijhawan Group; Prof Ramamurthy, National Chair, THSTI, Prof Sushma Yadav, VC, Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila University Haryana; Prof Sheela Reddy, Ambedkar Chair, IIPA; Prof Sachidanand Joshi, Director, Indira Gandhi National Center for Arts, Delhi; Dr Thokchom Meinya, Loksabha MP, Manipur; Ms Monika Arora, Advocate, Supreme court.



Field trips were conducted for students of various departments to enhance curriculum-delivery and bring a practical perspective to classroom teaching. This year students were taken to various Institutions/Industries like Yakult Industry, IARI PUSA, National Seismic Centre, IMD Delhi, Atomic Mineral directorate, Babasaheb Dr B.R. AMBEDKAR Memorial, Delhi and various sites of cultural and historical significance in Rishikesh, Chittorgarh, Udaipur, Datia-Jhansi-Orchha Belt of Madhya Pradesh, Dalhousie, Dharmshala, etc.

Editorial team of the college including faculty and students has worked hard to bring out a wonderful edition of magazine '**Samdrishti**' which will be released soon. The other two publications of the department of Hindi Patrakarita Evam Jansanchar '**Sambhav**' and '**RLA Samachar**' are important means to providing the hands-on training experience to our students and will also be showcased. The college is in the process of getting these periodicals registered for ISBN number.

I greatly acknowledge the **Discipline Cum Anti Ragging Committee** that worked throughout the year to maintain discipline and a peaceful environment in the college.

I would like to extend my gratitude towards all our talented **teachers** and hardworking **non-teaching colleagues** for their year-round hard work and dedication without which any of the above achievements would not have been possible.

An event of this dimension cannot happen overnight. Center for Human Values, Ethics and Life Skills

Coordinator: Dr Rita Jain; **Co-Coordinator:** Dr Sanjay K Sharma

A new centre “**Center for Human Values, Ethics and Life Skills**” has been started in the college in **in 2018-19 on recommendation of IQAC** with the following objectives:

To develop critical ability in students to enable them to distinguish between values, ethics and professional skills

To ensure sustained happiness and prosperity which are the core aspirations of all human beings

To facilitate development of a holistic perspective among students towards life, profession and happiness

To equip students suitably to make good decisions and solve problems in their academic, professional careers as well as their personal lives

Course offered by the centre: The centre has introduced a compulsory Non-credit course on Human Values, life skills and ethics for I year students. The classes were held for 6 weeks with 4 sessions of 2 hours per week. Dr. Rita Jain (Coordinator), Dr. Sanjay K Sharma (Co-Cordinator), Dr. Deepti Bhardwaj, Dr. Alankar, Dr Swagata and Dr. Purna Diwan volunteered to take classes for this course.

Following experts were invited to deliver lectures and conduct workshops for students:

1. Mrs Meenu Bhargav (Karan Consultants for Counselling) on Emotional Intelligence
2. Mrs Neera Sud from Steel Authority of India on Stress and Anger Management
3. Mr Rajeev Nagpal from Steel Authority of India on soft skills

4. Dr Rajesh Bhatt, From Indian Institute of Technology, New Delhi on Stress and Anger Management

Outcome: 170 students of II Semester attended this course with 16 hour of practical training utilizing 4 hours for report writing to complete this course and be awarded a certificate.

Centre for Entrepreneurship and Technology Development (Entrepreneurship Cell)

The goal of this centre has been to create a progressive platform that would allow us to bring the best of the entrepreneurship community to the students of Ram Lal Anand College that includes multiple invited lectures and motivational dialogues from some of the successful entrepreneurs/CEOs in addition to organising workshops, business competitions and interactive sessions. Following events were conducted under the aegis of this centre:

- E-Cell hosted its first event of the year entitled “Startify19” on 21st February, 2019 with young speakers from entrepreneurial community including **Ms. Tanya Kathpal** (Founder, Eat My News), **Mr. Robin Jha** (CEO, TPOT), **Mr. Aditya Arora** (CEO, FAAD) and **Mr. Dheeraj Jorwal** (Founder, Brandzup) to make a connect with undergraduate students.
- An business Intercollege competition **ENIGMA** involving two rounds: Bid with Wit and Damage Control, was held on 21st February, 2019 with active participation of students from colleges like Maitreyi College, Jesus and Mary College, Moti Lal Nehru College, Ramjas College, Satywati College and many more. The event had a footfall of more than 200 enthusiastic students. The winners Raghav

During academic session 2018-19, Research and IPR cell in association with Centre for Entrepreneurship and technology Development conducted two days faculty development program on “**Writing Research Proposals and Addressing IPR related Issues**” from 29-30th March, 2019. This FDP saw good response from faculty members across different disciplines and colleges. Eminent speakers from various disciplines- Prof. JS Viridi [Head and Prof. (Retd.) Department of Microbiology, University of Delhi], Prof. TKV Subramanian (Head and Prof. (retd.) Department of History, University of Delhi), Dr. Sanjeev K Varshney (Director, International collaboration, DST) were invited for talks. They provided a deep insight on how to write an effective research proposal. In furtherance to imparting skills on writing research proposals, Dr. Chitra Arvind (Lex IP Care) and Dr Ashutosh Pastor (Program Manager for BIG and Incubation Manager at FITT, Incubation Centre, IIT Delhi) were invited to deliberate upon various forms of intellectual property rights, patents, entrepreneurship, incubation centres and start-ups. The program was attended by 35 faculty members and ended with elaborate interactive sessions on both the days.

A workshop on “**Intellectual Property Rights and Entrepreneurship: How to kick start your start-up**” was organised on 30 March 2019 for students. Minutes of Third IQAC meeting

Meeting date: 11 July, 2018 at 11 am

Attendees: Dr Rakesh Kumar Gupta, Principal and Chairman IQAC; Dr Purna Diwan, Coordinator, IQAC; Dr S.C. Dabas, Dr Rakesh Kumar; Dr Sanjay Kumar Sharma, Dr Mukta Dutta Majumdar, Dr Neena Mital, Dr Pradeep Sharma.

Dr Rakesh Kumar (Department of Hindi), Dr N.K.Pandey, Ms Ritu Kalra expressed their inability to attend the meeting.

Agenda Item 1: The chairman opened the meeting by welcoming the members and the coordinator presented the Action taken report.

Agenda Item 2: Quality initiatives to be taken for the coming session 2018-19

- a. After detailed discussion, It was decided that since Chinese and Japanese languages are in high demand in current scenario and are not being offered in neighbouring colleges, the college can start certificate courses with prior approval from GB. To begin with, a certificate course can be started in session 2019-20 followed by introduction of diploma course in session 2020-21 along with certificate course in self-financing mode. The classes can be scheduled on weekends with visiting faculty members from university of Delhi departments. For these courses **Dr K. G. Tyagi and Dr Alankar will be Coordinator and Co-Coordinator respectively.**
- b. It was decided that **IQAC** will organise two days FDP on Modern/ Innovative Methods of Teaching in this session. This will cover access/utilization of E-resources, LMS, lecture recording, ICT tools etc. **Dr Purna Diwan, Dr Kusum Gupta and Dr Salome John** will be involved organising this event. The chairperson informed the house that a FDP has already been scheduled in

September/October 2018 on “Emotional Intelligence” in association with ICT Academy. **Dr Vandana Gandotra** will be Incharge for the same.

- c. **IQAC** will also conduct One Day Training Programs for Non-Teaching Staff covering the following topics:
- GeM: Government E-marketplace
 - E-Tendering/procurement
 - Medical Reimbursement Rules and Guidelines
 - Administrative works
 - Professional Ethics
 - Gender sensitivity and sensitivity towards PWD and weaker sections of society.
- Dr Prerna Diwan and Dr Sanjay Kumar Sharma will be Coordinator and Co-Coordinator respectively for this event.**
- d. Additionally, a 5 day workshop for Non-teaching staff on ICT tools will be organised in this session by IQAC. **Dr Prerna Diwan and Ms Nupur Tyagi will be Coordinator and Co-Coordinator respectively for this event.**
- e. Committee decided to introduce Human Values and Life Skills courses for students of I year to be offered in semester II. For this one or two periods per week will be allotted. **Dr Rita Jain and Dr Sanjay Kumar Sharma will be Coordinator and Co-Coordinator respectively for this course** and they will decide all the modalities and curriculum for the same.
- f. It was decided that for Mentorship scheme, all students will be assigned mentors by the **Principal**. Each Faculty member will be assigned 16-17 mentees from other departments and 7-8, final year mentees of their department. This will take care of career counselling that is the requirement of III year students. A register will be provided to all teachers to maintain the

records of mentor-Mentee Meetings and remedial classes. **Dr Mukta Dutta Majumdar** will be Incharge for this scheme.

- g. A meeting of **IQAC Coordinator** with the last year's and present society conveners/department TICs will be convened regarding report writing for the events/activities conducted.
- h. It was decided that **CCPC** should explore the possibility of coaching classes for entrance examination on weekends between 9-1 pm by calling teachers/Experts from outside or from the college. These classes will run in self financing arrangement with prior approval from Governing Body.
- i. Members apprised the house that steps need to be taken to improve the documentation and record keeping for academic, administrative, research and extension activities on a regular basis. It was decided that a proforma for report writing be provided to all teachers by **IQAC**. Since it is difficult to get data from students who graduated, hence all students of III year will be asked to register for College Alumni Association by submitting a form with all their details including mobile no, email id, permanent and corresponding address to the college office. A form will also be filled by the students at the time of collection of degree certificate, with all details including their current affiliation and exams passed/appeared for updating their previous information. It was also decided to add an amount of Rs 500 / as alumni registration fees in III year fees.
- j. Steps will be taken to properly maintain Faculty conference/s and publication records with proofs on a regular basis. A detailed record of payments made to faculty members to present papers in conferences will be maintained yearwise by the office. A separate list of publications be prepared each year for papers in UGC listed and non-listed refereed journals along with impact factors. Book publications/chapters be categorised under national and international publishing Houses.

Agenda Item 3: Any other Matter

Following decisions were taken.

- a. It was decided to hold atleast two **Parent-Teacher meetings** in coming session, in Oct/Nov and Mar/April for odd and even semester respectively. For this detailed department wise schedule will be displayed on college website well in advance and information will also be sent to parents by SMS. **Dr Kusum Rani Gupta and Dr Parul Gaur will be Coordinator and Co-Coordinator respectively for these events.**

- b. A fresh proposal for introduction of B.A. (Hons) Economics will be submitted to the University. **Dr Rakesh Kumar and Dr Sunenyana Sharma** have been assigned the responsibility to prepare this proposal on the lines as was earlier recommended by GB in its meeting held on 20October 2015.

- c. A new **high efficiency scanner** will be purchased for office to digitalise all documents. All GB meeting minutes till date will be converted into digital formats

- d. A **Sports Facility Development Committee** was constituted to prepare a plan for next 5 years identifying new games for which facilities can be developed. **Dr Pradeep K Sharma, Dr Sanjay K Sharma and Convener, Infrastructure committee** will be members of this committee.

- e. The **departments** will be asked to write and submit proposals to various granting agencies to organise National/ International Seminar/ Conferences/ symposia in the college. The department will also be asked to conduct atleast one Alumni and current students interaction per semester by inviting well established Alumni of the college.

f. The **office** will be asked to prepare a complete list of students admitted in I/II/III year from 2017-18 onwards with their admission forms, Class XII certificate and category certificates scanned and stored in digital format, submitted to IQAC for verification. If possible registration forms may be directly downloaded from DU portal to save the information in digital format.

g. Results of the session 2017-18 will be analysed by the **Coordinator, IQAC** and first ten positions in University of Delhi in all three years will be identified and documented.

ACTION TAKEN REPORT

presented on 11 July 2018

1. The information for feedback submission was sent to students via sms and so far 305 students have filled and submitted the general feedback form and 150 students have submitted the feedback on curriculum at the end of session 2017-18.
2. More Focus was given on career counselling and placement as recommended by IQAC. A number of placement drives were conducted in academic session 2017-18 for the students by CCPC of the college. Big companies like Amazon, Tech Mahindra, KPMG, Smart Schools Inc Ltd. conducted interviews and a total of 160 students were offered jobs. A Soft skill Assessment and Development of all 3rd Year Students and I year students of BMS was also arranged by Abbscissa HR Consultants Pvt Ltd. An Internship Fair was organised in the college in which 18 companies participated and selected 300 students for summer internships. A three day workshop on career opportunities in today's world and preparedness strategies was also organised inviting professional career counsellors. College also signed a MoU with CALYXPOD Talent Solutions Pvt. Ltd. on 1st December 2017, to manage placement/internship schedules and records
3. College has made provision to provide Computer and Internet facility to students in room no 15 (earlier 16) after 2pm on all working days.
4. Area outside canteen is being developed to increase the seating capacity and a kiosk for coffee/snacks and Mother Dairy Booth is being started to provide some healthy options to students and staff.
5. Governing Body has approved the proposals for M.A. English, M.Sc Statistics and M.Com in its meeting held on 29.6.18 and will now be sent to University for further approval.
6. Update on Extramural Funding and Research Activities: A Research Proposal submitted by Dr Prerna Diwan, Dr Rakesh Kumar Gupta and Dr Kusum Gupta was successfully approved for funding of Rs 8.00 lakhs for one year by the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Govt. of India.
In this session, faculty has published more than 18 research papers/articles in highly reputed and refereed journals. Seven faculty members have published their books with

renowned publishers. Faculty members have presented research papers in various National and international seminars/conferences.

A number of national/international seminars were organised in the college (listed below)

- Department of Microbiology organized an International Seminar on “Infectious Diseases: Current Strategies for Diagnosis and Therapy” with eminent speakers from France and Belgium on 2nd February 2018.

- National Seminar entitled “Synchronization of devices using cloud” organized by Department of Computer Science on 21st February 2018, Eminent speakers were: Mr. Himanshu Chawla, CEO Iris Global Solutions, Mr. Rahul Aggarwal, CEO i2k2 Solutions, Ms. Swati Thomas, Founder Aemidio Services, Mr. Anand Babu, Strategic Relationship manager, ICT Academy
- Department of Geology organised seminar on 22nd September 2017, eminent Speakers: Dr. Neeru Rawal, (Scientist G), Atomic Mineral Directorate of Exploration and Research delivered a lecture on “Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy and Distribution of nuclear deposits in India’ and Mr. Pradeep Pandey, Scientist (H), Atomic Mineral Directorate of Exploration and Research delivered a lecture on “Various techniques for exploration, technologies”.

NAAC has sought some clarifications from the college, which are being taken care off. The NAAC visit for Qualitative Assessment is expected soon.

Agenda Item 1: The Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming the members and the coordinator presented the Action taken report.

Agenda Item 2: Reporting Matters

The chairman apprised the house about the following:

a. College was accredited by NAAC for 1st cycle with a grade of B++ and CGPA of 2.84. The criteria conveners were requested to go through their respective criteria grading and prepare list of quality initiatives to be taken to improve the scores for the next cycle.

b. Academic Audit of the college was conducted by two Eminent Academicians Prof A. P. Padhi, Ex-Vice Chancellor, Behrampur University, Orissa and Dr S. P. Agarwal, Principal, Ramanujan College (NAAC A Grade College), University of Delhi.

c. Green Audit of the college has been conducted and its recommendations have been submitted to Eco Club to make future plan and work upon the recommendations as far as possible.

d. Research Committee has been converted to "Research and IPR Cell" to promote research/Innovation culture in the college, conduct workshops on IPR and Plagiarism polices. The cell has planned a FDP in the month of March 2019 regarding research proposal writing and IPR. This cell will also prepare guidelines for small projects to be funded by college for students and faculty members. The cell will also emphasise on good quality publications by faculty.

e. Three MoUs have been signed with the following organisations:

f. Library Upgradation:

i. INFLIBNET has been subscribed by the college for a period of one year and students and faculty have been informed about it. A common user name and ID has been shared with students for usage of the facility. During Semester break, teachers and students will be provided with User name and password.

ii. Troodon software for automation of library has been upgraded. OPAC system is made functional for an easy access and location of books in the library. It was decided that the college will provide identity cards with bar coding which will facilitate the digital issue and return of books.

iii. Kindle section has been opened for digital reading of books in the library. More than one lakh books have been uploaded on the Kindle devices. Departments will be requested to provide a list of books prescribed in the curriculum so that the digital copies of same could be bought from Amazon and are made available to students and faculty for reading.

iv. Two library staff members Shri Avinash Sharma and Shri Tuk Narayan have completed one week training program on KOHA for automation and digitalisation of Library from Raja Ram Mohan Roy Library Foundation, Kolkata

v. Separate wi-fi enabled computer section is available for INFLIBNET accessibility of journals and books through DU internet.

vi. A dedicated faculty reading room with the above facilities has been made functional. Teachers will be requested to use this space for their academic development.

vii. On the request of students special funds will be allocated to subscribe to the magazines required for competitive examinations. A request will be made to faculty to provide a list of such magazines. The provisions will be made from the next session/Year 2019.

Agenda Item 3: Following decisions were taken to comply with the quality enhancement recommendations /suggestions given by NAAC peer team in its report:

- a) The college will explore the possibility of starting job oriented B.Voc courses along with a PG Diploma in Media studies. Two courses that could be started are Hospitality and Tourism Management and Health Care Management. The proposals will be made ready so that the same could be submitted to UGC for approval whenever there would be a call. The syllabus for PG Diploma in Media studies will be designed by Dr Rakesh Kumar, Hindi and may also be submitted for approval by UGC. The members also decided to work on starting a certificate course on Health Care Management to meet the requirement of Patient Care Executives, PCE in Private Hospitals. The qualifications of these executives are graduates in any discipline with good communication skills. This course will provide an edge to our students in getting PCE jobs on its successful completion.

- b) Course wise feedback system will be adopted by the college and the Feedback forms will be modified for the same. Feedback will be taken for the odd semester in this format.
- c) Institution will take necessary steps to raise funding for organising seminars, conferences and symposiums by obtaining funding from DST, DPT, CSIR, ICSSR, ICHR, etc. The chairman requested Sports In-charge Dr Pardeep Sharma to explore such possibility from Sports Authority of India and Dr Seema Gupta to explore from Ministry of Ayush (for Yoga) and ICMR for medical statistics. Faculty from Social Sciences and languages had been requested to apply for grants to conduct seminar/conferences to ICSSR under IMPRESS.
- d) Faculty will be oriented on Outcome Based Education (OBE) in the upcoming FDP on modern Innovative methods of teaching in March 2019.
- e) The college has enrolled as a local chapter on Swayam-NPTEL (e-learning platform). Dr. Sweeti Yadav, Assistant professor of Department of Mathematics will be coordinating as SPOC and faculty will be encouraged to register for online courses offered by NPTEL to be started in Jan/Feb 2019 to mentor students for the same. The students will be informed about these courses through SMS and Notices on college Website and Notice Board.
- f) Regarding strengthening of laboratories, members pointed that the laboratories are currently well equipped as per the prescribed syllabus and further expansion was not possible due to space constraint.
- g) Seed money to be provided to the faculty to encourage young qualified teachers to do research. For this it was decided that student fees must be revised by creating separate heads as follows:
- i. Research and IPR cell: INR 200 per student per year to be utilised for granting small seed money to faculty for short term/summer research projects and to conduct various research events. This seed money could be utilized for generating preliminary data sometimes required for submission of full proposals to various Government Agencies. The money could also be used to fund Patent applications if any.
 - ii. Centre for Entrepreneurship and Technology Development: INR 50 per student per year for conducting workshops and to promote innovation and entrepreneurship.
 - iii. Centre for Education and Training in Disaster Management: INR 50 per student per year to promote awareness among students to deal with disasters, training them to seek career opportunities and to make them brand ambassadors to spread awareness among public about Disaster prevention, management and rehabilitation.
- h) The sports activities for girl students to be improved: Dr Pradeep Sharma informed the house that soon they are going to introduce a few team sports for girls including Kho-Kho. It was also decided to keep some vacancies in sports quota for new sports to be introduced in the college for girls.
- i) Career development and placement cell will chalk out a plan for strengthening this cell and begin orientation of students from 1st year itself. It was decided that the cell will emphasize upon the training of students for soft skills and personality development a main skill lacking among job requiring students.



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Agenda Item 4: Student Feedback Report of 2017-18 was presented. It was found that there was improvement in student responses on various parameters as compared to last feedback report of 2016-17. The house decided to take the following remedial measures through respective committees:

- a) More Focus on career counselling and student placements. It was informed that the committee of CCPC has collected enough feedback from students on this issue and will come out with career counselling and placement requirements of students.
- b) More maintenance and cleanliness of the college and monitoring of regular cleanliness and maintenance of college washrooms. Teams of faculty and students will be constituted to check the cleanliness of washrooms and the college area on regular basis which will report any negligence to the Principal.
- c) Implementation of modern techniques for teaching, involving tools, equipment and other means, beyond chalk and talk. The faculty will be requested to use ICT tools in their teaching.
- d) Upgradation of sports facilities. It was felt by the members that unless the construction by Aryabhata College is completed further expansion may not be feasible.
- e) The seating capacity of canteen to be increased by developing the area outside canteen. A Nescafe and Mother Dairy booth will be installed. Convenors Student Union Advisory and the canteen committee will look into the matter taking into account the rental rules of Government of India.

Agenda Item 5: Departments will be asked to fill the AQAR for 2017-18 by 15th January 2019 and all these reports will be compiled by IQAC for submission to NAAC.

Agenda Item 6: Dr Rakesh Kumar (History) and Dr Prerna Diwan will look into the requirements of NIRF and ISO (ISO: 9000 - 2015) certification, respectively.

Agenda Item 7: The Principal and Chairman IQAC will prepare the Strategic Plan of College.

Agenda Item 8: Status Update: The proposals for introduction of PG Courses have been submitted and are being followed at the University. Dr Sanjay K Sharma and Dr Pradeep Sharma were requested to take necessary steps to register the Alumni Association of the college

Agenda Item 9: Administrative Audit of the college will soon be planned per NAAC Guidelines.

Agenda Item 10: Course on Human values, Ethics and Life Skills to be introduced from the coming semester. It was decided to keep two lectures per week for theory and to organize some workshops by outside experts in consultation with time table committee. The students will be evaluated based on test/assignment and project work. Faculty members will be requested to take these classes based on their interest. It will be a compulsory non-credit course for every students of Semester II. No fees will be charged from them for this course. The faculty engaged in the delivery of the course will not be paid any extra remuneration/honorarium.



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Agenda Item 11: The proposal for certificate and diploma level courses in Chinese and Japanese languages received by IQAC were discussed and approved. The certificate course in both languages will be started from the session 2019-2020 and diploma courses will be introduced from session 2020-2021 after approval from GB. The faculty for teaching these courses will be provided by Department of East-Asian Studies.

Agenda Item 12: PTM which could not be conducted in October-Nov 2018 due to NAAC visit will be conducted in the months of March-April 2019.

Agenda Item 13: Dr Seema Gupta will supervise the digitalisation of documents of students by office staff.

Agenda Item 14: The college has planned a joint five days FDP on Modern Innovative Methods of Teaching-Learning with SGND Khalsa College (Part of IQAC Cluster) in the month of March 2019.

Agenda Item 15: The college will organize a five day workshop on automation of library using KOHA and other softwares like TROODON, LYPSIK, etc. The college will apply for grant to organize such a workshop to Raja Ram Mohan Roy Library Foundation.

Agenda Item 16: Keeping in view of the busy schedule of Dr Manish Pande, External Expert, IQAC, who has not been able to attend any of the meetings of IQAC, it was decided to put some new members in his place including some of the RLA Alumnus from corporates. Also as per the recommendations of NAAC regarding keeping a commerce stream faculty member in IQAC, it was decided to include Mrs Srishti Bhatia as member.

The chairman thanked all the members for their remarkable insights provided during the meeting.

6. Mentors have been assigned to all college students by the Principal. A register has been given to all teachers to record the details of meetings conducted.
7. A series of meetings of Principal, IQAC Coordinator and NAAC coordinator with TICs and Society conveners was held and a format for report writing for various events have been given to all faculty members.
8. College has introduced Alumni Registration fees of Rs 500/- for all final year students and a form for their records will also be introduced from this session

Minutes of Fifth IQAC meeting

Meeting Date: 9th May, 2019 at 11 am

Attendees: Dr Rakesh Kumar Gupta, Principal and Chairman IQAC; Dr Purna Diwan, Coordinator, IQAC; Dr S.C. Dabas, Dr Rakesh Kumar (Department of History), Dr Rakesh Kumar (Department of Hindi), Dr Sanjay Kumar Sharma, Dr Mukta Dutta Majumdar, Dr Neena Mital, Dr Pradeep Sharma, Dr Seema Gupta, Dr Rajesh Sachdeva, Ms Ritu Kalra, Ms Renu Bhatnagar, Ms Srishti Bhatia

Dr N.K.Pandey could not attend the meeting.

Agenda Item 1: Minutes of 4th IQAC meeting were confirmed.

Agenda Item 2: Chairman, IQAC presented the Action taken report including status of tasks completed as per the recommendations of NAAC Peer team, Academic Audit and Green Audit. Following points arising out of Action taken reports were also discussed:

- **Course wise feedback** system will be introduced. It was decided that Dr Seema Gupta and Dr Purna Diwan will take care of the modifications to be done in existing Google feedback form providing the students to tick the course options. TICs will be entrusted with the responsibility of sending the link to students for filling of feedback form. Feedback form will also be developed for Parents, alumni, employers for which Ms Ritu Kalra will be giving her inputs. The feedback forms will be given to students going for internships also.
- Dr Vandana Gupta and Dr Rakesh Kumar (HS) will prepare the syllabus for the certificate course on Health Care Management in consultation with Ms Ritu Kalra as per the industry requirements. This course will be of 120 hours to be run during one year, with one month of internship in a hospital setting. On similar lines, Dr Rakesh Kumar (HN) will work on proposal for PG diploma in mass communication/media studies in Hindi.
- A detailed discussion on problems faced by CCPC and steps to strengthen was done. Following decisions were taken to be followed by CCPC:
 - i. Preparation of an e-brochure of college (profile and achievements) to be sent to companies.
 - ii. Data will be collected from all III year students on their preference for pursuing higher studies or jobs after graduation and further on their interest for nature of jobs and expected salary bracket through email. Generate database of companies suiting student requirements.
 - iii. Negotiation with companies to hold interviews at their office, in case number of candidates for campus interviews is less.

- iv. Focus on soft skill training of students from I year onwards including basics such as introducing oneself, email etiquettes and resume writing.
 - This can be done through small video clippings in classroom before the lectures.
 - v. To get record on number of students completing internships, CCPC will connect with companies to get their certificates sent directly to college.
- Regarding guidelines for small in-house research grants, Chairman informed the house that Research and IPR cell is in the process and have already conducted one meeting for the same. The projects will be funded in two categories:
 - i. Projects submitted by student will have a maximum of team of 4 students and one mentor
 - ii. Project submitted by Faculty will have a maximum of 4 students
 - To enable use of ICT tools by Faculty, faculty will be requested to incorporate at least 4 power point presentations for curriculum delivery. The college will facilitate the preparation of Power point presentation for those faculty members who submit their content for the same.
 - 23 seats will be allocated in admissions to various programmes in sports quota. For girls, Kho-Kho and Taekwondo will be introduced from 2019-20 session. 12 seats will be reserved for women category (4 for Kho-Kho, 4 for Taekwondo, 4 for Judo). It was decided to urgently look into the possibility of constructing changing room for girls in sports ground and near amphitheatre for boys.
 - Faculty research publications will be maintained under three categories :
 - i. Publications in UGC Approved list of Journals
 - ii. Publications in Refereed journals
 - iii. Publications in Scopus List
 - Similarly the books and chapters published by faculty will be categorized into local, national and international publishers. Faculty presentations in conferences will be categorized under National and International heads.
 - The formats for obtaining this information from faculty will be suitably modified for the same by IQAC.

Agenda Item 3: The College will conduct administrative Audit with Ms Ritu Kalra, Mr Santosh Sharma, Air Marshal (Retd.) Mr Naresh Verma as external experts. Internal Academic audit will be conducted by IQAC two members sub-committee with IQAC Coordinator Dr Purna Diwan and Dr Rakesh Kumar (HS). TICs and the next faculty member in seniority will take care of documentation at departmental level for AQAR.

Agenda Item 4: following decisions were taken for forthcoming admissions after reviewing admission process 2018-19:

- More realistic cut-offs for admission will be decided from the 1st cut off list to ensure maximum allocated seats to be filled under SC/ST/OBC category. This will be placed in Admission committee.
- To improve the visibility and popularity of college, counselling sessions for parents and students will be held for admission seekers in the college from 10 am to 1pm during registration days. This will be publicized through media, website and banners. A new admission counselling committee will be constituted in Staff Council for the same.
- Prospectus committee will also develop Handbook of Information to be given to Parents and students on orientation day. Prospectus cum annual Report Committee will be responsible for preparation of the same.

Agenda Item 5: After detailed discussion following new Quality Initiatives were decided to be undertaken in the coming session 2019-20:

Capacity Building Quality Initiatives for students

- Open House sessions/counselling sessions will be held for admission seekers before the start of the admission process in the college. The schedule of such session of open house will be made available in advance on the college website and prominently displayed outside the college.
- Department of Hindi will offer Summer internships to students on Hindi translation of Documents of college (Prospectus, handbook, brochures and Annual reports)
- Department of Microbiology will offer internships to students on Water Quality Monitoring (Regular water testing by Microbiological and chemical Techniques)
- As the college has already installed composting machine, student teams will be guided by Eco Club faculty members for Solid waste treatment. These students will be felicitated on annual day.
- More focus on NPTEL registrations (Best practice). Students will be encouraged to register for exams.
- More digital books prescribed in the syllabus of various courses will be subscribed and uploaded on Kindles.

Capacity Building Quality Initiatives for Faculty/Non-teaching staff

- Department wise proposals will be taken for organisation of 2-5 days FDPs/training programs.
- More emphasis will be given to ensure better utilization of IT enabled class rooms by faculty. Every faculty member will be requested to submit at least four PPTs to the IQAC related to his/her course or any other way of using digital mode.
- A half day compulsory session on LMS and power point will be conducted for all faculty members during admission days in the First week of July 2019

- Training programs for non-teaching staff on Administrative rules, GeM and E-tendering, ICT tools –level II will be conducted this year for which Dr Purna Diwan and Dr Sanjay Kumar Sharma will be Coordinator and Co-Coordinator respectively. Dr Archana Gaur will be Coordinator for training Program on the Use of Hindi in official Communications for Non-teaching Staff.
- A Workshop on library automation using KOHA and other software with funding support from UN info centre, Delhi Public Library Association/Raja Ram Mohan library.
- Faculty will be requested to create their Research gate/Google scholar profile through research and IPR cell. Plagiarism software will be made available to the faculty and students.

Academic Quality Initiative

- Faculty members will be requested to prepare Lesson Plans for their courses in advance and submit the same for the coming semester.
- For attendance management, ERP system software will be utilized. The faculty will be providing username and password to upload student attendance on a regular basis and students will be provide with password to view the same on the portal.
- PTM will be scheduled after semester break in each semester. The Department faculty members will have the student's attendance and performance in DU exams and internal assessment for information to parents.
- Students will be issued Bar-coded Student ID cards , the quotation for the same has been obtained from different vendors.

Outreach/extension activities related Quality Initiatives


- An orientation program to be separately conducted for all registered NSS volunteers to inform them of its benefits and activities. NSS criteria for best student award to be defined by the program Officer.

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Action Taken Report to be presented in 5th IQAC meeting on 9th May 2019

• Agenda Item 2

- The green audit recommendations have been forwarded to Co-Convener Eco-Club, Dr Parul Gaur and Dr Swagata Karmaker and have been asked to chalk out a plan for its implementation.
- Research and IPR cell organised a 2 days FDP entitled “Writing Research Proposals and Addressing IPR Related issues” from 29-30th March 2019. 25 teachers have been trained through this Program.
- An amount of Rs 4 lacs have been allocated by the college to fund **Small Research Projects** from faculty members and students. The guidelines for the same is being formulated by Research and IPR cell of the college.
- Under the MoU submitted following activities were conducted:
 - S M Sehgal Foundation: One day seminar on Gramin Vikas Patrakarita with Ms Sona Sharma, Project director, Population Foundation of India and Pooja Murada, Director, Communications at S. M. Sehgal Foundation. (Date 29.1.2019)
 - Mollitics: One day seminar cum workshop on digital media and editing softwares with Mr Neeraj Jha, Editor in Chief , Mollitics , Snehit Sharma, Founder Woodo Digital and Irshad Ali, Video Editor Mollitics (date: 15.1.2019)

- Dr Rakesh Kumar, Hindi for PG Diploma in Media studies.
- **Initial Discussion on Course wise feedback** system have been done and will be discussed in detail in 5th IQAC meeting regarding its implementation and modifications to be done in existing feedback form. Mechanism for Feedback from all other stakeholders, Parents, alumni, employers is being developed.
- **Funding for organizing Seminar/conference/workshop**
 - **Department of Microbiology** generated funding support of Rs 1,00,000 from Probiotic Association of India to conduct a **National Seminar on “Probiotics: Ameliorating the Burden of Life style diseases”**.
 - The Department of Political science collaborated with Indian Institute of Public Administration for conduct of a one day National Consultation/workshop on **“Ambedkar’s thoughts on Socio-Economic Transformation”** and got a partial funding of Rs 25,000 for the same.
 - Gandhi Study Circle organized a national seminar entitled **“Understanding Gandhi”** for which it got funding support of Rs. 55,000 from Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti, Rajghat, New Delhi.
 - Department of History organised a seminar entitled **“Indian Cultures: Traditions and Practices (Recent Reflections)”** sponsored by ICHR on March 16, 2018 with a grant of Rs 32,000/-.

Approx. 24 lakhs of funding has been generated by the college this year from non-government (sponsorships) and government sources other than UGC, for organising various activities including research/awards, etc.
- Faculty were oriented to the concepts of Outcome based education (OBE) in the one week FDP organised by IQAC entitled **“Quality Assurance in HEIs: Reorienting Teaching-learning Paradigm”**. Another half day compulsory session on LMS for all faculty is planned in summer vacation.
- Under NPTEL local chapter, a total of 731 students and 18 faculty members of ten departments enrolled in different courses and 105 students registered for certification exams out of which 52 have successfully completed the courses in first phase. Rupendra Yadav of BSc (Hons.) Mathematics topped in Linear Algebra course on NPTEL.
- College is starting to grant
 - Fund for Small Short term Research Projects to faculty members and students from college resources. The guidelines for this are being formulated by Research and IPR cell of the college.
 - The college will also be providing cash prize, seed money to students and faculty to develop their innovative tech ideas into a prototype through Centre for Entrepreneurship and Technology Development. In the current session, the centre invited **innovative ideas/business plans from students** for new startups and received 10 such proposals from students which were evaluated by Mr Digvijay Singh the COO, India Angel Network. Shubham Raj of B.Sc. (Hons) Computer Science has been selected for Best Startup Idea award 2019 carrying a cash prize of

Rs. 5000 along with mentorship and incubation support. Before doing this, more than 10 founders of various new and successful startups were invited to share their experiences with the students.

- Dr Pradeep Sharma will be informing the house on new sports for girls to be introduced from the next session in the meeting.
- 175 students were selected this year for summer internships out of 250 students participated in the two days Internship Fair organized by Career Counselling and Placement Cell of the college. A total of 57 students from different departments completed summer Internships in 2018 at various institutions during May-July 2018. Students were hired by Amazon, Intellicon, through campus placements.

Agenda Item 4

- **Bimonthly cleanliness drive** involving one department at a time to inculcate a sense of responsibility amongst the students has been initiated this year. An encouraging number of 55 faculty members and more than 500 students participated in these drives
- The faculty was oriented to new ICT tools for teaching in the one week FDP
- The contract for installation of Nescafe booth was granted, however because of non-compliance of conditions, it has been cancelled.

Agenda Item 5

- AQAR from departments have been received and the information is being compiled.

Agenda Item 6

- A half-day session on understanding the requirements of NIRF and ISO certifications has been planned for which experts are being identified. A session on Qs ranking was done for the faculty members in March and the proposal is being sought from the agency for the same.

Agenda Item 7

- Suggestions have been sought from all faculty members for preparation of Strategic plan of the college through email and from other stake holders through website notice.

Agenda Item 8

- **Alumni Association** of college has been formally registered under the Societies Act this year. The Association organized its first Alumni meet which was attended by Around 120 alumni. From the corpus fund collected from Alumni registrations, Alumni Merit scholarships of Rs.3000 each have been started for toppers of all programs and this year 31 scholarships have been awarded.

- The experts for administrative audit has been finalised and will be discussed.

Agenda Item 10

- A new **Centre for Human Values, Life Skills and Ethics** has been established in the college which started a non-credit course on Human Values, Ethics and Life Skills for I year students. The classes were held for 6 weeks with 4 sessions of 2 hours per week. Dr Rita Jain (Coordinator), Dr Sanjay K Sharma (Co-Cordinator), Dr Deepti Bhardwaj, Dr Alankar, Dr Swagata Karmakar and Dr Prerna Diwan volunteered to take classes for this course. 4 experts were invited to deliver lectures and to conduct workshops for students. 170 students of II Semester attended this course and will be required to take 16 hour of practical training at their own end or through college and will utilize 4 hrs for report writing to complete this course and will be awarded a certificate on successful completion.

Agenda Item 11

- Proposals for Certificate Course in Japanese and Chinese language have been approved by GB and have been forwarded to college branch, DU and the Department of East Asian Studies for approval.

Agenda Item 12

- PTM could not be conducted in the last session due to paucity of time and new schedule will be soon put up for the coming session.

Agenda Item 13

- The digitalisation of necessary documents for one year has been completed and rest is underway.

Agenda Item 14

- IQAC organised a one week **FDP organised entitled** “Quality Assurance in HEIs: Reorienting Teaching-learning Paradigm” from 15-19 march 2019 in association with SGND Khalsa college under IQAC cluster MoU. 41 teachers were trained on modern innovative methods of teaching.

Agenda Item 15

- Workshop on library automation using KOHA and other softwares in association with UN info centre and Delhi Public Library Association/Raja Ram Mohan Library **will be organised in July 2019. A proposal is being prepared for funding from Raja Ram Mohan Roy Library Foundation.**

82 students have been trained in these industry/job oriented skills. Out of the first batch of certificate course in Heritage and Tourism Management last year, 75% students got placements in tourism industry.

A total of 142 faculty members from RLA and other colleges have been benefited through these programs.

- One Training Program entitled “ICT tools for Beginners” was organised for non-teaching employees of different colleges and universities. 35 staff participated in this programme.
- A total of 6 Research proposals were submitted to ICSSR under IMPRESS Scheme for funding by our faculty this year. One Research Proposal entitled “Study of varied complexities of North East region and role of National Cadet Corps to integrate it strongly within the national mainstream” submitted by Dr. Sanjay Kumar Sharma as Project Director and Dr. Rita Jain as Co-Project Director was successfully approved for funding of Rs. 4.99 lakhs for one year. The other submitted proposals have cleared the stage II of the selection process and are under consideration.
- Mr Vinay Kumar of Department of Economics has received a research award under DAAD Exchange Programme to University of Buenos Aires, Argentina. Dr Parul Gaur of Department of History obtained an amount of Rs. 67000 from ICSSR to present her research paper in International Conference at Oxford University Church, Oxfordshire UK. Dr Ravish Lal of Department of Geology got INQUA award of 1400 Euros to present his research paper in the 2019 congress held in Dublin, Ireland.
- Faculty has published 18 research papers/articles in highly reputed and refereed journals, 6 books and 14 chapters/e-modules and presented 23 research papers in various International and National Seminars/Conferences. 5 faculty members have attended three weeks refresher/orientation courses.
- One PhD student has been awarded PhD degree under the guidance of Dr Rakesh Kumar, Associate Professor in Hindi and three more PhD students have been registered under Dr Rakesh Kumar, Dr Sanjay Kumar and Dr Archana Gaur of

Department of Hindi. Six office and library staff attended upgradation training programmes conducted by the colleges and University of Delhi.
