


DR. RITA JAIN NSS PROGRAM OFFICER



DECLAMATION ON NATIONAL PRESS DAY










CENTENARY RUN

The significance of the day increases during pandemics, when orphan children are the most affected. The holidsy serves as a reminder that it is our responsibility to look after kids in difficult situations, particularly in the wake of the coronavirus outherak. The French organization, SOS Enfants en Detresses, started World Day of War Orphans. According to UNICEF data, over half of the casualties in conflicts fought in the 18th, 19th, and early 20th centuries were civilians, and this ratio gradually rose until 2001. 





RAKTVEER CONFRENCE




ANTI-TOBACCO DRIVE




INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY
