B.A. (HONS) HISTORY

PROGRAMME OUTCOME (PO) (BOTH FOR HONS. AND PROGRAMME)

Students with Bachelor of Arts, Programme at the end of the programme will be able to comprehend the following:

PO1-Comprehend Indian and world history-

The aim is to provide advanced knowledge of Ancient, Medieval, Modern and the Contemporary World along with the extensive exposure to Indian History.

PO2- Understand the nuances of the discipline

The students are given a firm grounding in the discipline of history and its method; which acquaint them with the latest theoretical advances in the field.

CO1 History of India

It covers time period from prehistoric past down to the emergence of civilization and states

CO2 Social Formation and cultural Patterns of the Ancient World

It illuminates fascinating journey of the human past, beginning of agriculture, Bronze age civilizations, Greco Roman antiquity and European feudalism.

CO3 History of India (750-1206)

It emphasizes the constituents of the early medieval times especially regional configurations as well as the transitions towards it.

CO4 Rise of Modern West

It deals with European history from the decline of feudalism in the late middle ages to the beginning of industrial capitalism.

CO5 History of India (1206-1550)

It engages with political, social, economic and cultural history of Delhi Sultanat and also helps to understand the rich Islamic cultural foundation.

CO6 History Of India(1550-1750)

The political, economic ,religious and cultural progress of the Mughal rule are the highlight of this paper and also dimensions of regional state formation in the 18th century.

CO-7History of India (1750-1950)

It makes student understand the process of colonization ,its ideological impetus ,the impact of British colonialism on different groups of society and maturity of responses in terms of anti – colonial national movement

CO8 History of Modern Europe

This paper maintains a chronological continuity with rise of Modern West providing insight to processes of historical significance like French Revolution, ideas of nationalism and liberalism, Colonialism, Imperialism and World war.

B.A. (PROGRAMME)

CO9 History of India from Earliest times up to 300 CE

Apart from giving an overview of the historical time period it covers the issues related to sources, methods and interpretation in history writing.

CO10 History of India from C.300 to 1206

It starts with the rise and growth of Guptas ,regional formation and culminates with the Turkish invasions.

CO11 HISTORY of India 8th to 18th century

It gives a comprehensive overview of thousand year period of Indian history including both Delhi Sultanat and Mughal dynasties.

CO12 History of India from 1707 TO 1950

It deals with the emergence of autonomous states and provides linkages of how European powers and British groups facilitated colonial rule and the struggle for independence.

CO13 Issues in World History

It gives a synoptic view of issues of modernity, colonialism, feminism, globalization, ecological and human rights and cultural transformation.

DISCIPLINE ELECTIVE

CO14–History of United States of America (1776-1960)

It enables student to link American history with European and Indian histories shedding light on the republican period, American democracy, foreign policy, industrialization, women and religious and cultural trends.

C015-History of USSR (1917-1964)

It examines the political social and cultural developments in Soviet Union highlighting social tensions and political inconsistencies that spurred radical change in the government of Russia.

CO16 History of Modern China (1840-1960)

It provides a broad canvas of nation building in China starting with opening of trade links, relevance of Marxism in China and Chinese Communist revolution.

CO17-History of South East Asia

It provides an overview of South East Asian countries delineating their main historical trends . It examines the idea of one Indic belt /the process of Indian-ization , the spread of western religions ,the intrusion of Western Colonialism and the politics of nation formation, war and independence.

C018 Some Aspects of Society and Economy of Modern Europe :15th -18th century

It covers broad historical knowledge about feudalism, renaissance, scientific developments, economic development with emergence of capitalism and industrial revolution.
