## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

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**Ram Lal Anand College** was founded in the year 1964 by Late Shri Ram Lal Anand, a senior advocate in the Supreme Court of India, in response to growing social demand in the sixties for providing educational opportunities at the university level. The college was initially managed by the Ram Lal Anand Trust and taken over by the University of Delhi in 1973 and thereafter has been run by the University of Delhi as a University Maintained Institution with 100 % funding from the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India.

The college is located in the picturesque surroundings against the backdrop of the Aravalli range in the neighbourhood of South Campus, University of Delhi and several other educational institutions and is connected to Durgabai Deshmukh, South Campus Metro Station located on Ring Road (Refer to Map on the Last page)



It has a vast campus, spread over ten acres of land with green lawns and elegant buildings of much sprawling architectural merit. The college is Wi-Fi enabled with excellent infrastructure, state-of-the-art Laboratories, Seminar Room, Amphitheatre, Library, Playground and Cafeteria. It is a multi-disciplinary, co-educational institution with more than 2700 students pursuing different programs in Humanities, Commerce, Management and Sciences. College is administered by a statutory Governing Body as per the University Ordinances and legislated by the Executive Council of the University of Delhi.

The college boasts of more than 100 highly learned and committed faculty members many of whom are PhDs with national and international post-doctoral research experience. Apart from their traditional role of disseminating knowledge, the faculty members inspire and guide students to organize and participate in different activities such as seminars, workshops, debates, theatre, and cultural activities including classical music and dance programs. Faculty



also guides students in various research and innovation projects. RLAC also provides a conducive environment for sports with its wide expanse of fields and specialised support. The college is proud to be one of the leading affiliates of the National Cadets Corps (NCC) and National Services Scheme (NSS) with an impressive number of cadets/volunteers enrolled each academic year. The college is deeply aware of the immense need to instil and generate human values and ethics, especially among the youngsters. In this regard, apart from the prescribed curriculum, the college had designed a compulsory course “Human Values, Ethics & Life Skills” for all the first-year students. The college provides job-oriented skills to its students through Add-on Certificate Courses. Students are also trained and encouraged to take up innovative start-up and research ideas. The college focuses on the environmental conscience of its students by practising good green initiatives at its premises. The college maintains a rainwater harvesting system, recycles RO water waste, recycles paper and E-waste, and composts organic waste of the canteen and leaf litter through a composting machine in the Herbal Garden. The college is also equipped with solar power panels. The college has recently started a unique venture in the form of community radio station at the frequency 90.0 FM known as Radio TARANG. It is the first community radio station of any college in Delhi University.

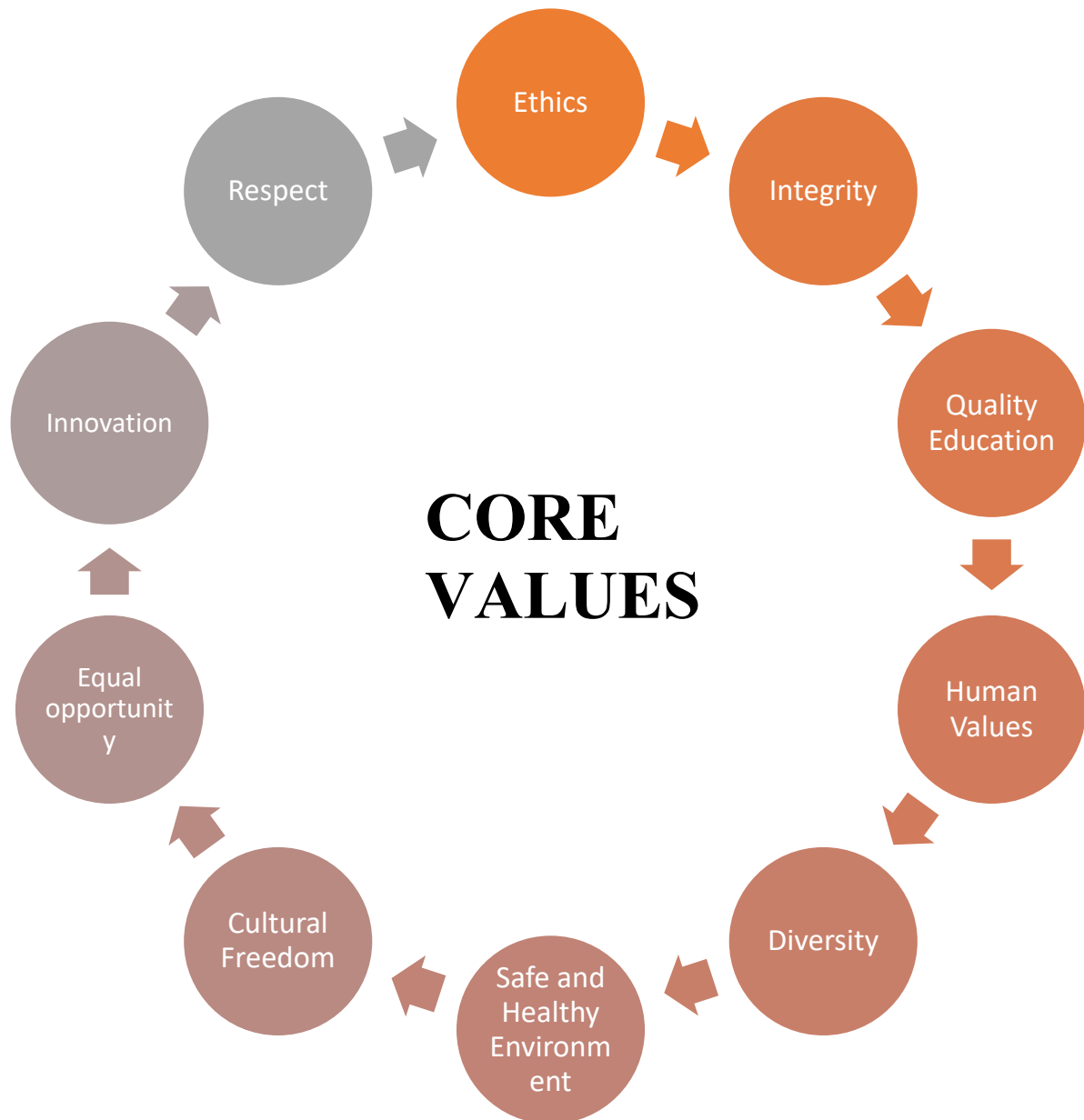

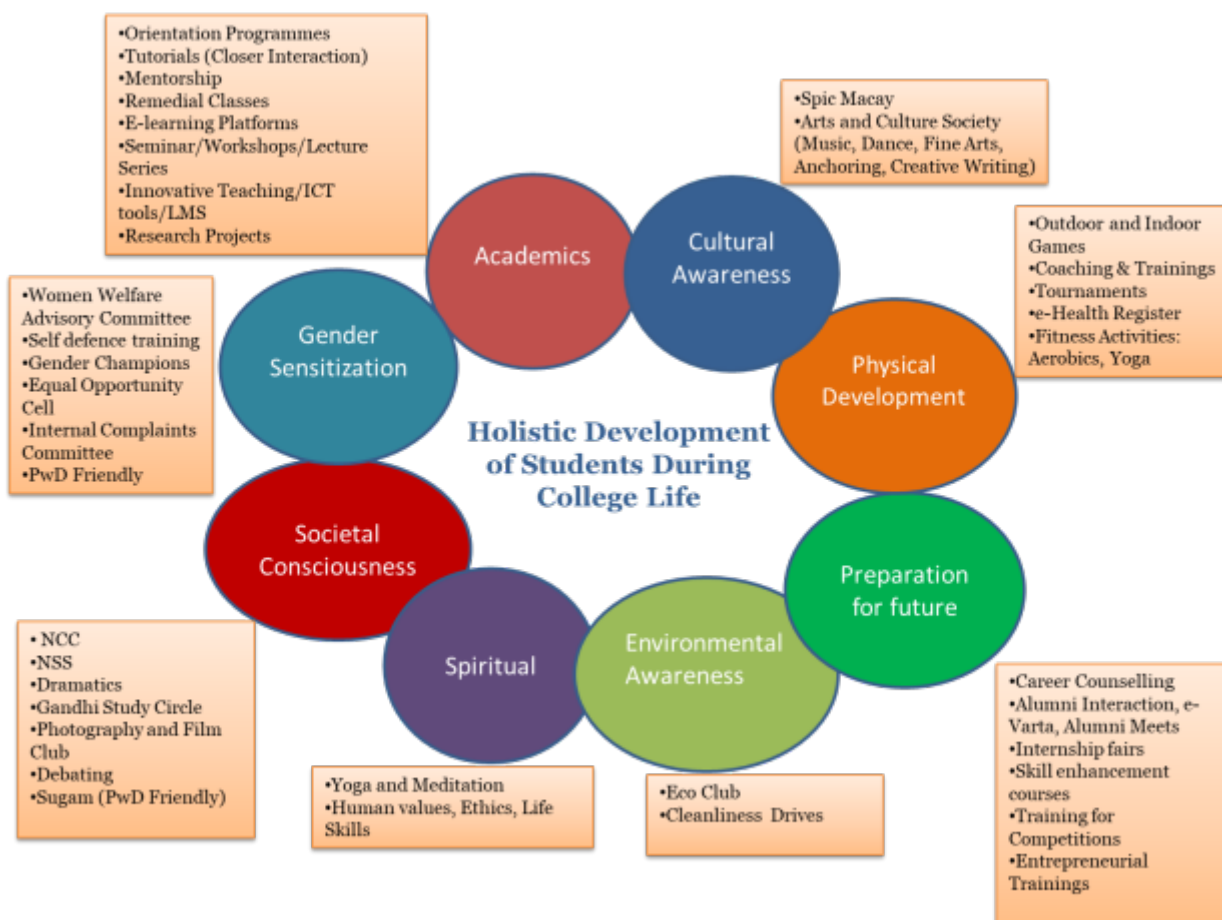

It is one of the most important contributions in the technology space of our college & university. We began airing on 13th Feb 2023. The state-of-the-art studio is specially designed to train budding journalists and also make available a platform to our faculty and students both.

The department of BJMC offers a **Skill Development Certificate Course** which trains students in production, radio jockeying, voice modulation, scripting, editing, interviewing and radio dramas.

नई दिल्ली। राजधानी दिल्ली के छात्रवला इलाके में एक 12 वर्षीय लड़के की बिजली के खंभे के संपर्क में आकर करंट लगने से मौत हो गयी। पुलिस ने यह जानकारी देते हुए बताया कि राजधानी में बीती शाम आंधी आयी थी, जिसके बाद यह हादसा हुआ। पुलिस के मुताबिक, मृतक की पहचान कैफ मोहम्मद के रूप में हुई है जो मंगलवार शाम को घटना के वकत छात्रवला इलाके के खैरा गांव में अपने घर के बाहर था। पुलिस के एक अधिकारी ने बताया कि राष्ट्रीय राजधानी में धूल भरी आंधी के दौरान यह एक बिजली के खंभे के संपर्क में आ गया और उसे करंट लग गया। अधिकारी ने बताया कि नाबालिग की आनन-फानन में आर्टीआरएम अस्पताल ले जाया गया।

कार्डिअक अरेस्ट के कारण मृत व्यक्ति के तीन अंग का इस्तेमाल, किसी अन्य जरूरतमंद व्यक्ति के लिए किया जा सकता है। इस कार्य से किसी की जान बचाई जा सकती है। एक मेडिकल स्टूडेंट के लिए मृत शरीर पर पढ़ाई करना ही उसकी जीविकोपार्जन है। देहदान के बहुत सारे फायदे हैं इसलिए हमें समाज में देहदान को सकारात्मक रूप से

बढ़ावा देना चाहिए। देहदान के प्रचार-प्रसार में एनएसएस और एनसीसी वॉलंटियर्स का एक अहम योगदान है। समाज में देहदान के प्रति शिक्षक तोड़ने के लिए युवा शक्ति महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभा सकती है। डॉ. एनएसएस प्रोग्राम समन्वयक, डॉ. नरेंद्र बिश्नोई ने विश्वविद्यालय में एनएसएस की महत्ता पर प्रकाश डाला। उन्होंने यह

नई दिल्ली। हेले... ने 90.0 फ़्रीक्वेंसी पर शुरू किया है। कॉलेज का यह रेडियो दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के रामलाल आनंद कॉलेज की कतिन ने अपना एक निजी समुदायिक रेडियो शुरू किया है। इसके माध्यम से इस कालेज तक शिक्षा, प्रसारण व अन्य अतिरिक्त वीडियो दर्शन, ऑडियो पर आधारित कार्यक्रम प्रसारित हो सकते हैं। कॉलेज का यह रेडियो 60 घंटे तक चलने का एक सख्त समुदायिक रेडियो है। करीब 60 घंटे को लगभग से हेले इस समुदायिक रेडियो पर पत्रकारिता के छात्रों को एक माह की ट्रेनिंग करने का अवसर भी मिलेगा।

From the upcoming 2024-25 Academic Session all three undergraduate batches in the college will be part of UGCF 2022 Programme Structure. **Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) – 2022 is formulated with a student-centric approach and provides flexibility in terms of choice of discipline(s) of study, developing academic pathways having creative combinations of disciplines for study with multiple entry and exit points, determining semester-wise academic load and the ease to learn at his/her pace, to the extent possible.**

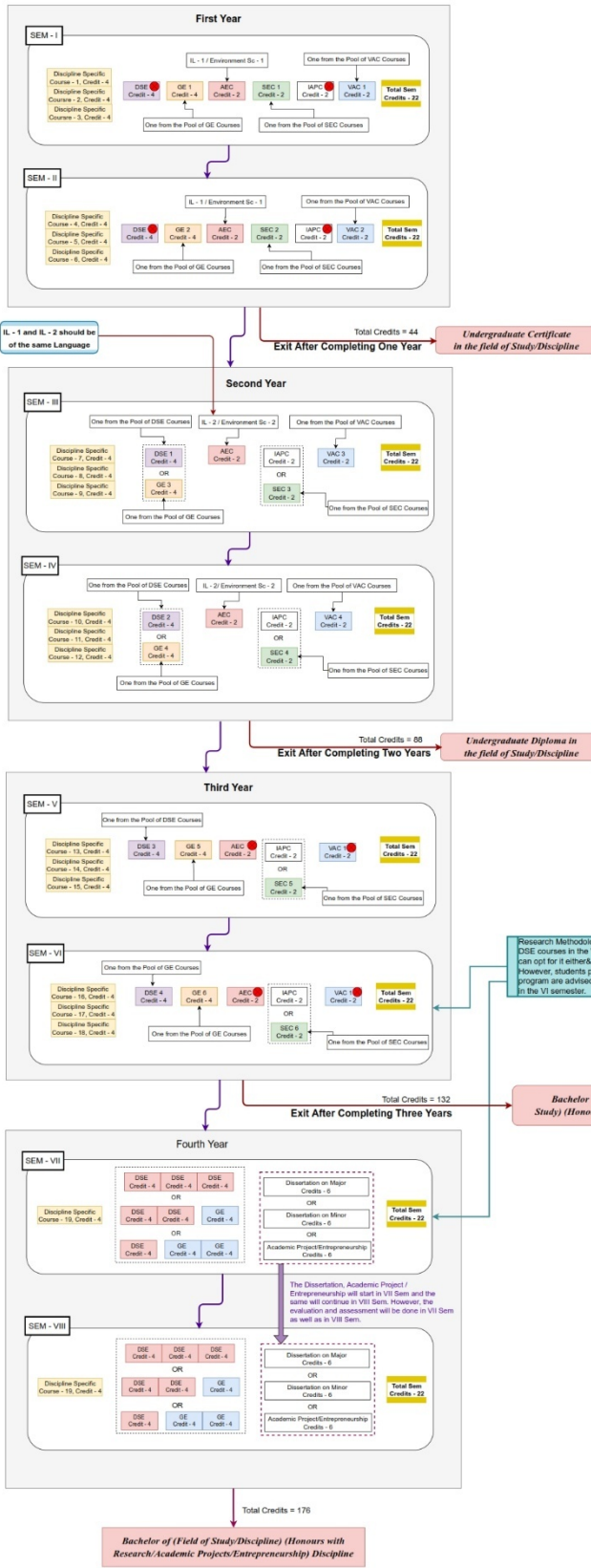
The UGCF - 2022 underlines the historical perspective, philosophical basis, and contemporary realities of higher education as enshrined in the National Education Policy (NEP) - 2020 and endeavours to synchronize these cornerstones while charting the road ahead for the state of higher education. To actualise the noble objective, as succinctly brought out in the NEP - 2020, the Delhi University has endeavoured to explore the possibility of further restructuring and refinement of its undergraduate curriculum framework in line with the objective and underlying philosophy of the NEP - 2020 to capture the imagination of the youth of our nation which depicts the contemporary realities of our demographic advantage globally. The resultant outcome of this comprehensive exercise undertaken by the Delhi University is the UGCF - 2022 which not only underlines the heart and soul of the NEP 2020 in letter and spirit but also goes on to create a teaching-learning framework at the undergraduate level to attract the young minds towards research, innovation, apprenticeship, social outreach, entrepreneurship, skill development and similar such areas of human knowledge and endeavour while imbibing the truly charged academic environ of the university and its constituent colleges. The new framework will allow students to collect credits in a designated academic credit bank which can be utilized as per the student's needs in the future.

The college has adopted and implemented UGCF 2022 offered by the University of Delhi in full letter and spirit from the session 2022-23. The 2024-25 academic session, will see all three undergraduate batches in the college as part of UGCF 2022 Programme Structure. In a single core discipline program, the student shall Major in the core discipline. However, if he/she wishes to Minor in another discipline then he/she has to earn 28 credits from GE courses of the second discipline.

In four years, a student will study the following number of DSCs, DSEs and GEs:  
 Total DSC papers : 20  
 Total DSE paper options : 10 (minimum to be chosen is 4)  
 Total GE paper options : 10 (minimum to be chosen is 4)

The student can Minor in another discipline, if he/she fulfills the following criteria:

**Seven GEs = Minor (7 x 4) = 28 credits**

Example: A student is enrolled in B.A. (Hons.) History and decides to pursue 4th year (sem VII + sem VIII).

If he successfully completes the 4th year, he/she will be awarded Major in History.

In addition, if the student successfully completes, seven GEs in Political Science, he/she will be awarded Minor in Political Science.

Research Methodology shall be offered as one of the DSE courses in the VI and VII semesters. Students can opt for it either&amp; in VI or VII semester. However, students planning to pursue 4 year UG program are advised to choose research methodology in the VI semester.



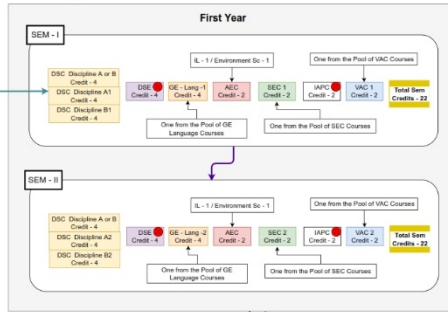

- 14 DSCs + 7 DSEs = 84 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 6 DSEs = 80 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 5 DSEs + Dissertation = 88 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 4 DSEs + Dissertation = 84 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 3 DSEs + Dissertation = 80 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 6 DSEs = 80 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 7 DSEs + Dissertation = 88 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 6 DSEs + Dissertation = 84 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 5 DSEs + Dissertation = 80 Credits

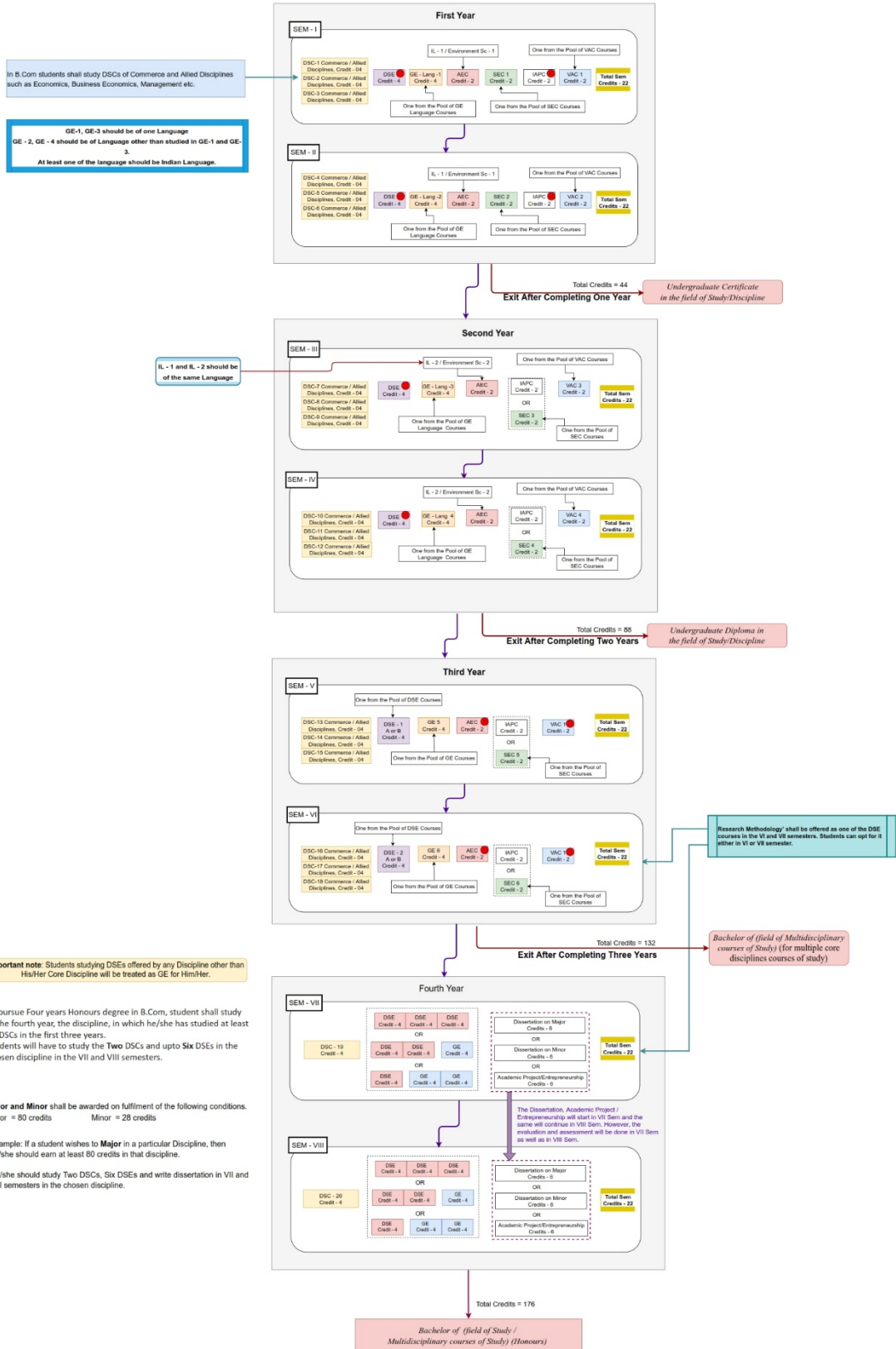

## **DEPARTMENT OF HINDI & HINDI PATRAKARITA EVAM JANSANCHAR**

Department of Hindi offers two undergraduate programmes B.A. (Hons.) Hindi & B.A. (Hons.) Hindi Patrakarita evam Jansanchar and a postgraduate programme M.A. Hindi affiliated with the University of Delhi.

### **HINDI**

Hindi & BJMC department is one of the most innovative departments of our college always brimming with curricular and co-curricular activities aimed at holistic academic development of students. The department has a versatile mix of well-experienced faculty excelling in both core disciplines as well as in the world of practical and experiential knowledge. In its pursuit of excellence, the department has initiated add-on courses like *ANUVAD* or Translation in collaboration with Hindi Anuvad Parishad to enrich students with bilingual potential.

Dept has organized special lectures by distinguished experts, eminent newsgroup editors, experienced bureaucrats, and professional journalists from diverse backgrounds & fields and also designed workshops for hands-on training to prepare our students for the newer career options in the digital and electronic world apart from taking up conventional opportunities. To make the course and teaching-learning more interactive the department organizes departmental inter-college festivals under the departmental societies named 'Hindi Sahitya Parishad' & 'Hindi Media Parishad'. The societies also screen films & documentaries to equip students with diverse perspectives.

After completion of this undergraduate programme, the possible avenues for students are government, administration, civil services, journalism, media, teaching, research, etc. Apart from that, one can opt for the job of an interpreter as well. Most of the media houses, publishers and literature houses offer such opportunities. The other career opportunities could be of a Content Developer, Reporter, Journalist, Teacher, Translator and Voice Associate in BPOs.

The Department specially offers a skill development, job-oriented certificate course in 'Hindi Anuvad' to the students of Hindi Honours. Students can make a career in translation as a large number of vacancies for translators exist in both the government and the corporate houses.

### **HINDI PATRAKARITA EVAM JANSANCHAR**

This course is run by the college under Self-Financed Model. The number of seats for admission each year is very limited which ensures that every student is given training in software and hardware used in the development of media content. The college has a dedicated studio with the necessary video and audio equipments required for broadcast and

recordings. In addition, there is a dedicated media lab with state-of-the-art computers having



an internet facility and software for text/video editing. Students are guided to undertake internships at different media schools during the summer and winter vacations. In recent times opportunities have been made available to students to take part in educative TV programmes on channels like IBN7 and TV Today. Prominent journalists and faculties from other Mass Communication Institutes are invited to deliver lectures and conduct interactive workshops for the students.

The Department has signed MOUs with media houses (Amar Ujala and Molitics) and social organizations (Sehgal Foundation) to provide hands on training to its students. A large number of our alumni have become reporters and journalists and are writing columns in prominent newspaper dailies.

Various job opportunities will be available for computer science graduates as Information Systems Manager, IT Consultant, Multimedia Programmer, Systems Developer, Web Designer and Web Developer.

Computer Science has many aspects; its focus is not on coding solely but on other aspects also. The department also offers certificate courses/seminars and workshops on theme areas every year. The department of computer science's focus area is cyber security. Also, the department would organize hands-on workshops in the upcoming months to make students and faculty aware of the basics of cyber security by using simple tricks on how one can prevent the systems from threat. The department recently conducted a certificate course in Data Science using Machine Learning and Artificial Intelligence.

## **DEPARTMENT OF GEOLOGY**

Geology – the science of earth and environment concerned with the processes and products of earth and atmosphere. It is embracing and extending its gamut into various fields such as Space Geology, Medical Geology, Urban Geology, and Agro Geology, and it is acquiring the status of people's science.

Geologists find answers to how –a variety of rocks are formed, they relate to different mineral deposits, the earth has developed through millions of years, life has evolved and become extinct, water migrates, mountains are formed and destroyed, earthquakes, floods, tsunamis occur, the relationship of the earth with the sun and other planets, the structure of the earth both external and internal were formed and so on. The department of geology offers various certificate courses and in house, trainings to enhance employability and to provide additional skills to the students. The students of our department perform excellently in academics; Ms Kastur Parida and Mr Akash Nair have secured the highest marks in the University of Delhi in Geology and were awarded the University Gold Medal and certificate in the session 2020-21 and 2021-22 respectively. A series of seminars/webinars are held during the academic session in which students get to interact with scientists and faculty from national/international institutes. The department under the NMHS project has successfully developed a Geo-site in Almora District, Uttarakhand where the department plans to hold International Winter School on Himalayan Geotourism and Geoheritage in this session. The following other initiatives have been formulated for the upcoming academic session:

- 1) Certificate Courses proposed in collaboration with institutions of repute like Geology Department, University of Delhi, Geological Survey of India, Indian Institute of Remote Sensing, etc are: Remote Sensing & GIS, Surveying tools in the Geological Investigations, Water Management, its Quality and sustainable use of water resources in urban areas, Advance instrumentation techniques used in Geological Research, Programming software (Python, R, Matlab) and its integration in Geosciences and Basic learning tools (Brunton Compass, GPS, and Stereographic Projection) in Structural Geology
- 2) The department plans to train students for the development of the E-Museum

## **DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY**

The microbiology programme got started in 1989 at Ram Lal Anand College and has vast prospects due to advancements in the field of Biotechnology. It is a broad discipline as microbiology has applications in many fields like medicine, pharmacy, dairy industry, clinical research, water industry, chemical technology, and nanotechnology. Department has been funded for financial support under Star status under the “Star College Scheme” by the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology (2019-21). Besides, the department also has extramural grants of more than 1 crore rupees for research projects from ICMR, DBT, ICSSR etc. Department of Microbiology received **Best Department Award at the state level** in the session 2020-21 by **Microbiologists Society, India (MSI) and Prof. Prerna Diwan was awarded Best Teacher Microbiology for the academic session 2021-22**. This was conferred based on the overall college performance including academic, extracurricular, co-curricular and research activities. **Sneh Priya**, B.Sc. (H) Microbiology III year, got MSI Best Student Award of Department of Microbiology for the session 2023-2024. 2 new PhD students have joined the department in the previous session. The students of our department perform excellently in academics.

The department of microbiology offers summer internships of 4 to 6 weeks to its students and enrolls students in extra-mural research projects. The department organised seminars/workshops/certificate courses in the areas of current research like probiotics and human health, metagenomics, drug design, bioethics and IPR, biostatistics and Python. Visits to educational institutes (UDSC/NDRI/IARI/RCB) and industries to view large-scale operations/fermenters/downstream processing (NDRI/JNU) are also organised every year.

Recently hands on training sessions on Fluorescence Microscopy, PCR, Anaerobic Gas pack system and biosamples for students, faculty as well as laboratory staff were organised. The department has established MOU with the Translational Health Science and Technology Institute (THSTI) and National Institute of Plant Genome Research (NIPGR) under Science Setu through which interactive sessions and lectures by eminent scientists are arranged for students. An MOU with Sustainable trust of India (SIT) was signed to promote sustainable development goals as envisaged by the UN in which students and faculty of the department are playing an active role.

The following two new activities have been planned for this academic session.

1. Publication of a Science-centric e-newsletter/e-magazine (biannual) compiled and edited by students (staff in an advisory role)
2. Short term-course on Planning and conducting survey-based/community health project



Microbiology has tremendous scope and a very bright future. Students can pursue M. Sc., or integrated M. Sc. And PhD in Microbiology and related disciplines from prestigious institutions like the University of Delhi, IISERs, IITs and other national and international universities. These students can make a career in research and non-research fields in a diverse range of employment sectors such as healthcare organizations, environmental organizations, industries like food, beverage, pharmaceutical, public health & hygiene, water and biotechnology companies, forensic science laboratories, publicly funded research organizations, higher education institutions etc.

The department has so far completed 9 innovation research projects and currently running two research projects. The department has recently purchased docking software for bioinformatics applications. A new research lab has been established with a BSL-2 facility recently.

## DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS

Statistics involves the collection, presentation, analysis and interpretation of data. Statistics has wide application in almost all spheres of knowledge like Industry, Commerce, Trade, Physics, Chemistry, Economics, Mathematics, Biology, Psychology, Astronomy etc. The curriculum here offers a broad application of statistics, focussing on specific statistical methods used in science, research and industry. In addition, students are given exposure to the software packages like SPSS and programming in R. The programme also allows choosing papers from other disciplines as generic electives.

With a bachelor's degree in Statistics, one can go for higher studies from premier institutions like DU, IASRI, ISI, IIT; PG in Operation Research, Applied Operation Research, MCA, MFE, MFC and MBA. Some of the important job roles are Data Scientist, Academician, Biostatistician, Content & Financial Analyst, and Actuary and in the government sector, students can join Indian Statistical/Economic Services, and Statistical investigators via Subordinate Statistical Services across the country. To make teaching-learning more interactive the department is IT-enabled with live broadcast features, also the department has started using a Benq-based **75" smartboard** on computer. Encouraged by its success the department plans to implement the technology in other classrooms made available to our department along with some other departments gauging its utility.



A range of events including **Interaction** sessions (online/ offline) with experts working in the field of statistics, **Industrial visits** are organised for students. Previously skill development **Certificate courses** in Python programming, machine learning, excel and tableau were organised for students. The department is engaging students in **community projects and summer research projects** of short duration every year.

The demand for mathematics is increasing day by day in the industry as well as in government domain. They require mathematicians for Big Data analysis, Analytics, Gaming-theory, Operation Management, Actuarial Science, Research and Development, Weather analysis, Security coders, etc. After pursuing Mathematics (Honours) students can get into the defence sector (DRDO), Insurance sector (Actuarial Science), the government sector (SSC, UPSC, RAW etc.), Banking sector, and of course into academics and teaching.

## Tier III Training by the Central Ground Water Board, Ministry of Jal Shakti

A Tier III Training was conducted by the Central Ground Water Board, Ministry of Jal Shakti, in collaboration with the Department of Geology. 124 students received training along with 24 faculty members was held on 29<sup>th</sup> November 2023. It involved groundwater hydrology, conservation and management, monitoring, quality assessment, the fundamentals of groundwater movement, aquifer characteristics, and recharge processes along with some case studies.

## ONGOING RESEARCH PROJECTS

To motivate and give exposure to students in academic research, high achievers are granted opportunities to work as Research Interns in extramural research projects granted to faculty members by different agencies. Also, the college has made provision for students to submit small research proposals under a faculty member for a small seed fund to carry out research in college. Research & IPR cell, Ram Lal Anand College continues to accept research proposals under the "College Research Grant Scheme" (CRG) after the successful completion of the first phase projects with encouraging outcomes in spite of the disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the first phase, more than 50 students received training on the conduct of research projects which resulted in a total of 5 international research articles, 11 international conference presentations, and 7 dissertations creating an innovative ecosystem in the college.

This initiative is in line with the New Education Policy which mandates research work through research projects to be undertaken by the students in their 4th year of study. CRG projects created a conducive ecosystem and continued to enthuse, motivate and facilitate the students and faculty members to initiate a research project and collect some preliminary data. It was also envisioned that this scheme would help the investigators to sharpen their proposal writing skills.

In the academic session 2021-22, summer internships was done by 56 students and in 2023 more than 50 students were trained.

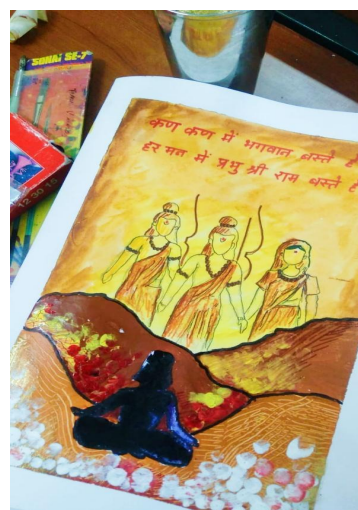
Under the banner of this society, inter-college quiz fests are organised, and the team of Quizzers, also participate in inter-college events and win accolades for the college.

## **INDUSTRY ACADEMIA INTERFACE**

In order to promote academic cooperation and to provide a platform for students to enhance experiential learning and hands on training, several MoUs have been signed by the college in recent years with IQAC of ten Colleges in Delhi (IQAC Cluster), S. M. Sehgal Foundation, Molitics, Amar Ujala Publications Limited, Virtual Labs, Calyxpod Solutions, School of Open Learning, University of Delhi and Family of Disabled (FOD).

## **MENTORSHIP**

Apart from curricular and co-curricular guidance, the college remains committed to the psychological and personality development of each student. In this regard, each student of the college is made formally associated as a mentee with a particular teacher who works in the role of a mentor. Apart from regular interactions, regular meetings are held between the mentor and mentee to ensure no student feels alienated in any way during college life. Mentor-Mentee meetings regularly take place at stipulated timings of 2 hours each week as per scheduled time-table. A list will be prepared within a month of the starting of the session wherein all first-year students will be allocated a faculty member each.

## **REMEDIAL CLASSES**

For slow learners, our faculty members take up remedial classes at the end of each semester. The schedule for the same is displayed separately by each department. The remedial classes are also helpful for such students, who miss out on classes/lectures due to their participation in inter-college co-curricular and sports activities.

## **PARENT-TEACHER MEETINGS**

The college prefers regular Parent-Teacher meetings which include department visits and an interactive session between the teachers and parents regarding the performance of the students. The college also collects feedback from parents through online and offline modes.

## **STUDENTS' FEEDBACK SYSTEM**

The feedback from students is collected online at the end of each semester of the academic session. The feedback forms are analysed to improve the teaching-learning process.

## **ENHANCED LEARNING OF STUDENTS**

For enhanced learning experience of students and faculty, Ram Lal Anand College has enrolled itself as

- LOCAL CHAPTER for MoE sponsored National Program on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL) which offers online courses. More than 400 enrolments were done in recent years out of these many students have successfully completed various categories of certifications like Elite+gold, Elite+silver, Elite etc. Several teachers have been awarded TOP PERFORMING MENTOR certifications. Ram Lal Anand College is the only college in University of Delhi to make its place in the list of **ACTIVE LOCAL CHAPTERS** issued by NPTEL in 2019. The enrolments are done twice a year. Students are encouraged to take up at least one course.
- The college also promotes enrolment of students through licenses received for free enrolment to various **American massive open online courses (MOOC) available on Coursera platform** of various fields including engineering, data science, machine learning, mathematics, business, financing, computer science, digital marketing, humanities, medicine, biology, social sciences. Earlier, college procured 1700 free licences for enrolment. Also, more than 750 certificate course completions took place including 13 specialised courses by students and faculty on Coursera platform.

## **ICT FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS**

The college has taken up the cause of technological advancements among all students very seriously. At present the college has **280+ computers** installed & functioning in college at various laboratories, library, departments, staff room, administrative and other formal

locations, etc. From the academic session 2022-23 nine Smart Boards have been put up in classrooms specially where lectures for science courses are held.

A dedicated *computer lab for students* is also functional and is exclusively available to all students of the college on every working day after 2 pm to learn and access the digital and virtual world. The computers are linked to the Delhi University server which provides students remote access to a large number of journals and books.

Further, the college duly follows the university-sanctioned scheme of providing **laptops** for educational purposes to each student in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year in the college on a returnable basis.

To complement the university's efforts the college has provided a **Wi-Fi-enabled campus**. The college has in total 40 ICT-enabled classrooms linked to LAN, of which 18 are **smart classrooms**, and well-equipped labs in the departments of BJMC, Computer Science, Commerce, Geology, and Statistics, Microbiology and Mathematics. All classrooms are IT-enabled.

During Covid pandemic, online teaching-learning continued, and the college enhanced its IT support and infrastructure. The students and faculty were provided with a G-Suite account facility with Institutional email IDs for online classes and to have Google classroom access. An FDP on ICT Tools and LMS was conducted for all faculty members before the start of academic session 2020-21 to facilitate online teaching covering all platforms including Google Meet, Google Classroom, Canvas, JioMeet, and Zoom, Photo and Video Editing tools.

For curriculum enrichment, the college offered 21 skill development certificate courses for students (without any additional fees for college students) in online mode to utilize the lockdown Period constructively.

The college has also expanded its Social Media reach by creating a Twitter handle: **@RLAC\_DU**

The college has its own **YouTube Channel** where pre-recorded lectures of our faculty members apart from other virtual creations are made available for a wider reach.

In our in-house state-of-the-art STUDIO the college screens and trains selective students from various departments who have interest in designing web based portals and programmes. Such students are formally guided to help them learn how to design and broadcast on the digital platforms and also on the **Community Radio Channel** hosted by the RLA College.

The college has taken the membership of ICT Academy for five years to provide support to students and faculty for industry engagement, skill development and academic training.

### **Laptop Bank:**

The university has provided substantial number of laptops to the college to distribute among needy students for their day to day digital /virtual educational requirements. Each student who has cleared the first-year exams is eligible to apply for a laptop. At the end of each



semester before the exams begin, the student has to return the laptop and receive clearance to become eligible to write exams.

## GENERAL RULES FOR STUDENTS

### COLLEGE TIMINGS

College functions from 08.00 AM to 8:00 PM and time table is prepared in accordance for both semesters, beginning from July and January. Each lecture/tutorial/practical is of one-hour duration.

### ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT

Students are required to fulfil the minimum eligibility requirements of attendance as stipulated by the University, to be eligible to appear in the Delhi University examination. They must also have satisfied the college authorities regarding general conduct and adherence to college discipline and fulfil other relevant criteria to enable them to appear in the University Examination. Any student who will be unable to fulfil mandatory attendance criteria will be debarred from writing the exams.



### **ERP**

Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) is software which is being used in the college primarily for the smooth conduct of everyday teaching-learning activities. Each student as well teacher is provided with a unique ID on ERP app. In this app, based on a web portal, every student and teacher remain connected. Real time attendance, information related to assessment, evaluation, activities of departmental societies, dissemination of important dates, etc. is provided on a regular basis. The name of software/app is “SmartProf RLAC” and URL of software is “<https://www.rla.mobiquel.com/smartprof/index.php>”.

### **DISCIPLINE, ANTI-RAGGING, AGAINST SEXUAL HARASSMENT**

Non-observance/violation of any of these rules will be treated as an act of indiscipline and necessary action will follow. The discipline committee of the college may impose a fine or in cases of gross indiscipline expel/rusticate a student. The student has to abide by the following ordinances of the University of Delhi, Ordinance XV-B, XV-C, XV-D (<http://www.du.ac.in>). Regarding discipline it is an utmost requirement that each student must act and behave in a manner befitting a student of this esteemed institution even when outside college campus.

### **MIGRATION**

Migration at RLAC is done as per the university rules and college has the right/discretion; if the strength of students in a course is less than sanctioned, then in-migration is allowed and if the strength of students in a course is equal to or less than the sanctioned strength, then out-migration is not allowed.

### **IDENTITY CARD**

Students are given BAR-CODED ID Cards and each student must carry their Identity Card to the college every day. They must produce the same whenever required to do so.

### **NOTICES**

Students are advised to check the Notice Board, ERP App, College and Delhi University Website, and Class Whatsapp groups regularly for any information. Though the college also informs the students through emails/ERP app, it will be the responsibility of the student wholly to keep himself/herself updated.

### **ORDER AND SILENCE**

Students must maintain decorum during online/offline classes and events. If anyone is found creating a disturbance or doing any mischief or causing disruption of any nature, then strict disciplinary action will be taken against such students leading up to suspension/dismissal/rustication from college depending upon the severity of wrong-doing. Students should not loiter in the corridors or talk loudly on the college premises.

### **MOBILE PHONES**

Use of cellphones in offline classrooms, libraries, laboratories, auditoriums, and seminar halls, especially during regular lectures/practical/tutorials/study/programmes/examinations etc. is strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be taken for any violation. Playing music on a mobile phone or any other device will attract disciplinary action.

### **NO SMOKING**

The College is strictly a smoke-free zone. Any act of violation will be penalized.

### **CLEANLINESS**

College premises including the lawns must be kept clean. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who deface or spoil the college property. Students are motivated to take part in cleanliness drives.

### **OUTSIDERS**

Outsiders are not allowed to enter the college premises. In case such visits are essential, they must seek prior permission of the principal and enter their details in the register kept at the main entry gate.

### **VISITORS**

Students are not permitted to receive or entertain visitors in the College. In case of extreme urgency, only parents/guardians may approach the Administrative Officer or the Section Officer (Admin).

### **PARKING**

Students are not allowed to bring their vehicles inside the college premises.

### **FEE PAYMENT**

At the beginning of each year every student is required to deposit the college fee through DU online portal. Delayed payment leads to penalty and further increase in fine. Students need to be careful about timely payment otherwise students may not be allowed to appear in exams.

ADMIT CARD: Student need to download admit card for each semester exam. While filling exam forms, students need to be careful about unique paper code and confirm it from college office. Correct information must be filled in exam form by the student for both theory and practical.

### **EXAM FEE DELAY FINE**

Every year in the months of March and September students are required to submit examination forms and deposit examination fee through online portal. Failing to do this within stipulated time will result in being debarred from appearing in the examination. Also, late submission of exam forms and fee will invite statutory fine/penalty.

### **LIBRARY RULES FOR BOOK ISSUANCE**

Books issued to students at the library must be returned within the stipulated time. A fine of Rs. 2 per day for first 15 days of delay and Rs. 5 for each further day will be strictly imposed on the students for each book not returned on time. Clearance will be provided to the student to be eligible to write exams only after all such dues are cleared from library. For detailed Library Policy please visit RLA College website.

### **DAMAGE TO PROPERTY FINE**

Any defacement/damage/misuse of college property as well as common resources of the college will be dealt with extreme seriousness. It will invite disciplinary action/punishment/penalty/suspension/rustication or even forwarding of the offence for legal action with the police.

# SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

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## EXAMINATION

Students are advised to download their Examination Admit Card well before the beginning of their semester-end examination. Students are regularly assessed and evaluated for semester results on various parameters like class tests, open-book exams, written assignments, projects, presentations, viva, PPTs, etc. Each student is expected to participate in all such activities so that he/she is assessed and evaluated appropriately.

## ABSENCE

1. If a student is absent for four consecutive lectures/tutorials/practical then he/she must write an application countersigned by one of the parents addressed to the college principal stating the reason for absence immediately when he/she returns to classes.
2. If a student is absent for medical reasons, he/she must write an application to this effect and produce a medical certificate immediately when he/she joins the college. These applications and the medical certificate must be submitted to the college office. Application at the end of the term/semester shall not be entertained.
3. Students short of required attendance (minimum 67%) will be detained from appearing in the End Semester Examination.
4. For such students who have to miss out on classes/lectures due to their participation in inter-college co-curricular activities, the college makes a special concession in attendance according to the university rules (Ordinance VII (2)).
5. The students are required to attend a minimum of 67% of lectures and tutorials and practical (wherever applicable) separately in all the papers held during a semester failing which he/she will not be allowed to take the Examination of the University.
6. The Examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester as per the University Academic Calendar notified by the University of Delhi.
7. **Passing & promotion criteria:** RLA College strictly follows University of Delhi rules, norms and eligibility criteria for passing and promotion of students from one batch to the next, in particular course and overall programme. Please visit Delhi University website for detailed information on the NEP 2020 based UGCF 2022 passing and promotion eligibility criteria.

**Under the UGCF 2022-23 new rules for Internal Assessment (IA) and Continuous Assessment (CA) marks calculation have been notified by the university;**

**The college has an elaborate and extensive procedure to conduct and evaluate students for their IA and CA requirements. Students are informed about this well in advance.**



**Internal Assessment:**

(i) Internal Assessment (IA) shall consist of marks secured in class tests, assignments/presentations and attendance. For instance, for an Internal Assessment of 25 marks, Class tests shall comprise of 10 marks, Assignments/Presentations shall comprise of 10 marks and attendance shall be for 5 marks. Similarly, for IA of 30 marks, 6 marks shall be for attendance, 12 marks for class test and 12 marks for Assignments/Presentations.

(ii) Six marks for attendance shall be distributed as follows:

Attendance cut-offs	Marks (out of 6)
More than 67%but less than70%	1.2 mark
70% or more but less than75%	2.4 marks
75% or more but less than 80%	3.6 marks
80% or more but less than85%	4.8marks
85% and above	6.0 marks

**Continuous Assessment**

Out of forty marks allocated for Continuous Assessment of tutorial, five marks shall be for attendance, which shall be distributed as follows:

Attendance cut-offs	Marks (out of 5)
More than 67%but less than70%	1 mark
70% or more but less than75%	2 marks
75% or more but less than 80%	3 marks
80% or more but less than85%	4 marks
85% and above	5 marks

\*There shall not be marks for attendance in Continuous Assessments for practical.

Practical marks for courses of total **four** credits, shall comprise of

- (i) continuous evaluation (25%),
- (ii) end term practical examination (50%)
- (iii) viva-voce (25%)

Practical marks for courses of total **two** credits shall comprise of

- (i) continuous evaluation (25%)
- (ii) end term practical /written exam (50%)
- (iii) viva-voce (25%)

**NOTE:**

1. Apart from the above, a university examination fee will be payable at the time of submission of examination forms during the month of Sept. /Oct for the odd semester and Feb/March during the even semester. The Fee detail will be notified on the Notice Board and website.
2. The amount of the fee has to be paid through DU online portal.

# INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

## LIBRARY

The total carpet area of the library is 1500 sq. mts out of which 500 sq. mts has been earmarked as reading space for students, of which 50 sq. mts for teaching staff and another 50 sq. mts for differently-abled. The total seating capacity of the library is 120. Its working hours at present are 8:00 am to 8:00 pm, and college plans to extend it further soon, except on holidays. A well-lit and fully air-conditioned library, it provides individual reading carrels, a lounge area for browsing and relaxed reading, and an IT zone for accessing e-resources. The college has subscribed to the latest journals, magazines and books for its students, faculty, and staff. Our library has approximately 67000 books, subscriptions to over 40 journals and 14 newspapers (both Hindi & English), 8 Kindle readers, 6 web-connected laptops, 2 desktops are specially provided with software to make them differently-abled friendly, 6 Daisy Players, KIBO Multilingual Keyboard Scanner & Reading Companion for the visually challenged students. The library is also digitally connected via N-List and has acquired Sugam Pustakalaya annual membership for VH students.

Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) of UGC has been subscribed to by the college. For remote access to the online e-resources/e-books/e-journal, the college provides Login ID and password to each student for the N-list portal. OPAC system is functional for easy access and location of books in the library. The Kindle section is operational to facilitate digital reading of books. More than two lakh books are now available on Kindle devices. For differently-abled students/faculty, a fully functional dedicated reading room is available having books (in Braille), laptops and software especially helpful for the visually impaired. Also, magazines for competitive exam preparation are subscribed to.

The library staff provides all help to students and teachers to locate, issue/return books and other aspects like using OPAC etc. The support staff ensures the smooth functioning of the library and takes care of security concerns therein.



## SMART CLASSROOMS AND LABORATORIES

The college campus, fully Wi-Fi enabled, has in total 40 ICT-enabled classrooms linked to LAN, of which 18 are smart classrooms, and well-equipped labs in the departments of BJMC, Computer Science, Commerce, Geology, Statistics, Microbiology and Mathematics. All classrooms are IT-enabled.

## **FACILITIES FOR PWD STUDENTS**

The students, staff and faculty of our college are highly sensitive to the special care needed for differently-abled students. The college has dedicated washrooms/restrooms, tactile paths, ramps, a hardware reading room and software in the library. Motorized wheelchairs are provided to the needful disabled students, the library also provides a scanner cum reader to the visually impaired students through which they can convert useful books into audiobooks. A centrally located elevator is functional for use by disabled students and staff members improving their mobility within the college.



## **DRINKING WATER**

Potable water is supplied through a well-maintained RO plant with 500 litres/hour capacity. Its TDS levels and safety are regularly monitored.

## **PHOTOCOPY SHOP**

In-house photocopy, binding and printing facilities are available at reasonable prices. Basic stationary-related everyday use items are also easily available at reasonable costs in the shop.

## **GIRLS COMMON ROOM**

Women students of the college have been provided with a spacious and comfortable girl's common room. This room is located on the first floor of the college building in close vicinity of the faculty staff room. This room is equipped with clean washrooms and comfortable seating. The Room has two Sanitary napkin dispensers installed. This room is properly ventilated to provide a friendly environment for students. It has been designed to provide a support network for female students as well as to give them a place to unwind themselves and indulge in informal discussions during available free time.





## **CANTEEN**

The college has a well-maintained, clean, hygienic, spacious canteen monitored by a team of faculty members. Our focus is less on junk food, and we try to promote healthy snacks and meals. With regards to this, our core policy is that everyone from the college fraternity can afford sumptuous and balanced food within a range of Rs. 40-60.



## **ACTIVITY CENTRES**

Considering the wide range of co-curricular activities taking place in the college, our students are provided with dedicated spaces. One activity centre is a huge hall with physical partitions created for different kinds of activities to take place simultaneously. Several of our budding artists spend passionate hours here every day to hone their skills in domains like theatre, music, dance, anchoring, painting, etc. Another activity centre for regular Yoga sessions for both students and faculty is under preparation right now and should be functional soon.



## **AUDITORIUMS**

The college has two auditoriums. Both are multi-purpose auditoriums with projection screens and wall-mounted LCD Projectors with a seating capacity of 120 in each of the two. In addition, the front lawns of the college are utilized for events involving large gatherings.



### **SEMINAR & COMMITTEE ROOMS**

The college also has an IT-enabled Seminar Room with a seating capacity of 70 for small events like debates, poster-making competitions, inter-college activities, Staff Council and committee meetings etc. The Committee Room is in the administrative block having a seating capacity of 25 people for meetings.





## **OPEN-ACCESS COMPUTER LABORATORY**

The computer laboratory (room number 15) is open to all students and staff on all working days after 2.00 pm.

The computers are linked to the Delhi University server which provides students remote access to a large number of journals and books.



## **SPORTS FACILITIES:**

Indoor: Among Indoor games, the college has in place facilities for table tennis, chess, carom, judo, weight-lifting etc. provided in the Sports Room.

Outdoor: Among outdoor games, the college has in place facilities for cricket, football, volleyball, kho-kho etc.

## **LIFT/ELEVATOR**

The college has a well-functioning **lift** especially meant for differently-abled students and faculty to facilitate their convenient movement across the floors in the college.
