Principal's Report

Good Evening Everyone!

I feel privileged to extend a very warm welcome to our distinguished Chief guests Shri Daya Prakash Sinha Ji, Prof S C Garkoti, my Colleagues on the dais Prof Mukta and Prof Dabas, Our Retired Faculty members and their families, esteemed alumni, my teaching and non-teaching colleagues and my dear students and parents to this 58th Annual Day and Prize Distribution Function of Ram Lal Anand College, which is a celebration of growth of college, and achievements of its students and staff in the current academic session. It has been a very fulfilling academic year for all of us.

He was honored with 'Hindi Vishwa Samman' by the honorable President of India Sh Ram Nath Kovind on 11th Vishwa Hindi Diwas. Sir, we are blessed with your gracious presence today. We are blessed to have amongst us Sh Daya Parkash Sinha Ji, a Padma Shri Awardee of the year 2020 and the Chairman of our GB for two years 2019-2021.

Our College has been greatly benefitted under the leadership and support of both the great personalities gracing today's occasion as our chief guest.

I also heartily welcome our Honorable Chairman, Governing Body, Prof. Satish Chandra Garkoti ji, Pro-Vice Chancellor, and Professor School of Environmental Sciences, Jawahar Lal Nehru University, New Delhi. He is a renowned ecologist with more than 30 years of research experience in the field of Forest Ecology, Traditional ecological Knowledge, Tree water relations, Plant invasions, and Ecosystem restoration. Because of his strong belief in Indian Traditional Knowledge and vast experience of Himalayan Ecology, Department of Science and Technology, GoI granted him funds of Rs 14 crore for a project "Network programme on convergence of traditional knowledge systems for integration to sustainable development in the Indian Himalayan region". His research guidance to so many research scholars led them to publish their research in very high impact Journals like PNAS, Scientific Reports, Catena, etc. He is a National Fellow of many National and International Ecological

Societies. His perseverance, far-sightedness makes him a true role model and a guiding force for all of us.

Sir, we are fortunate to have you with us today in the college.

Now, I will present the Annual Report of our college for the session 2021-22

Ram Lal Anand College was established in 1964 by Eminent Lawyer of the Supreme Court of India and a Great Visionary **Shri Ram Lal Anand Ji**. It started with just two pass courses, B.A. and B.Com and now offers **fourteen** Undergraduate courses in all the three streams, i.e. Humanities, Commerce and Science and **One** PG course in Hindi. Our college is fully funded by the UGC and is maintained by the University of Delhi.

In this academic session, the college continued its teaching – learning process and activities for holistic development of students in both online and offline mode due to COVID pandemic. As you will listen to the achievements and progress of the students and faculty, you will find that the Covid pandemic did not hamper the spirit of teaching learning process but it taught our students to utilize the time more effectively in their career and personality development and gave a chance to faculty to learn and explore new teaching pedagogies.

During academic session 2021-22, **923** students were admitted to different undergraduate courses and 14 students in PG with more than **2700 students** are presently enrolled in all three years put together. Five PhD students were enrolled under the supervision of the faculty members in various Departments.

The pass percentage of outgoing batch 2018-21 was 99.08%. Mr Akash Nair of B.Sc. (Hons) Geology, III Year was awarded the University Gold Medal for securing Top position in University examination. He was felicitated during the University of Delhi Convocation this year.

The outstanding academic performance of our students is very well reflected by receiving a number of academic scholarships/fellowships from various Institutions/organizations. Five students from Mathematics and Microbiology received DST Inspire Fellowship, 64 students received National Scholarships, 26 PMSSS and 8 e-district Scholarships. More than 20 students received scholarships from States like Bihar, Haryana and various other Govt Organizations.

In addition to the above scholarships, the college also provides financial assistance to the needy and academically deserving students. A fund of Rs 6 lakhs was disbursed to 90 students. The college also provided full tuition fee concession to more than 400 SC/ST students and full fee concession to 24 PwD students.

The laurels brought by the students were not restricted to academics only. Their performance in co-curricular activities and sports was equally outstanding and commendable. It is a matter of pride to inform you that more than 110 prizes/medals were brought by our students in various events organised at University, State and National Level. Many of the students attended prestigious camps and events on national importance. Some of the glimpses are

Subhag Singh, B.Sc (Hons) Microbiology awarded First Prize in Monologue Competition, at IIT, Delhi. Aakash Parihar, a member of art and culture society won Gold medal for the **Best Background Score for cinematography** (individual specialization: music compositing) and Silver medal in the *Best 2D animated short film.

Shravan, B.A (Prog.) won **Gold Medal** in Delhi state kho-kho championship. **Satish** Political Science (H) won Silver Medal in Delhi state kho-kho Championship. **Kajal** student of History (H) **represented** University of Delhi in North Zone Inter University Tournament. These sports star students were felicitated by the college through cash incentives and full exemption from payment of college fees.

Nine NSS volunteers represented Delhi contingent at National Integration Camp (NIC) held at Coimbatore. Two NSS volunteers Lokesh and Ravi Kushwaha represented the Delhi directorate at the North Zone Pre- RD Parade Camp held at Kalwar, Jaipur. Two students Ujjawal Sharma and Himesh Yadav joined defence services as lieutenant.

In its pursuits to train students to enhance their employability, college offered 13 add-on skill development certificate courses for free to more than 600 students. Free 60-hour coaching classes for CAT, UPSC and SSC+Bank PO entrance examination in online mode were organised. Students were also enriched through virtual visits to many laboratories and field visits to Uttarakhand; Himachal Pradesh, Atomic Mineral Directorate of Exploration & Research (AMD), Copper Mines, etc. More than 75 webinars/seminars were organised by inviting external experts in various fields. 4-6 weeks summer internship programme through its Research & IPR cell were initiated for giving research exposure to 56 students. Over 120 students received internship offers during an Internship fair- MILESTONE 22', organised by the college.

The Quality of Higher Education is ensured by those mentors who strive hard to acquire new knowledge and act as role models for their mentees. Their achievements have far reaching impact on the delivery and transfer of knowledge.

Our research activity exceeded pre-pandemic levels; faculty published 59 research publications, 2 books and 15 book chapters. The average impact factor of research publications and h index of journals of our science departments was 1.7 and 57, respectively. Most interestingly, 15 research/review papers out of these have been authored by our undergraduate students.

It is pleasure for me to share that two new research projects - Resistome Metagenomic profiling of bioaerosols in metro network in Delhi and Development of computational framework for COVID-19 multi-omics data analysis in collaboration with the Institute for Bioinformatics and Biotechnology, Bengaluru were granted by Indian Council of Medical Research with funds of Rs. 84 lakhs. At present the faculty has 3.85 Crore extramural funding for research. One of our faculty, Dr Arun Kumar Gautam, Department of Computer Science has been granted an Australian Innovation Patent on "INTERNET OF THINGS

SENSOR NETWORK BASED INTELLIGENT SYSTEM FOR MONITORING & SECURING SMART ENVIRONMENT FROM UNAUTHORISED OBJECTS”.

Seven Faculty members have been promoted from Associate Professor to Professor level; 7 from Assistant professor Stage III to Associate professor; 14 from Assistant professor Stage II to Assistant professor Stage III; and 16 from Assistant professor Stage I to Assistant professor Stage II in 2021-22.

Department of Microbiology received Best Department Award at state level for session 2020-21 by Microbiologists Society of India.

College has been recognised for best work in making the campus sustainable in the areas of sanitation, hygiene, waste management, water management, energy management and greenery by Mahatma Gandhi National council of Rural education, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education.

I would like to take this opportunity to brief you about the key developments and new initiatives taken by the college during the year in line with the 5-year Strategic Plan 2020-25 of the College approved by Governing body.

The college purchased 100 licences of Google Workspace for online teaching learning and renewed Zoom Pro package for large online meetings. We have upgraded our laboratories through purchase of equipment including 40 computers, smart boards, Fluorescence Microscope, BOD and Biosafety Level II cabinet. Two new research Labs have been added. College has become self-sufficient in energy generation through installation of 130 KV solar Panels. The college become a Barrier free campus (PwD friendly) with fully functional and operational lift. 20 new Inter Institutional collaborations have been established with three new MoUs signed. Very soon HT substation will be providing 24 hour uninterrupted power supply to the college. By 26th January next year you will wake up listening to “Radio RLA” through our community radio a unique initiative of the college. A grant of Rs 45 lakh has been sanctioned by Ministry of Culture for a studio theatre where our students will be trained in skills of drama, theatre, lighting, designs, etc. Two new computer laboratories are expected by the end of the next year. One auditorium with all projection facilities will be made operational very soon. The college has geared itself fully to implement NEP 2022 through UGCF 22 of University of Delhi. It is providing maximum curriculum flexibility by offering courses across the disciplines.

I would like to extend my gratitude towards all our talented teachers and hardworking non-teaching colleagues and students for their year round hard work and dedication without which any of the above achievements would not have been possible.

An event of this dimension cannot happen overnight. I thank the very motivated and dedicated Function Committee members who have worked very sincerely to organise this function and also to the Student Award Committee to decide Best Students of the year based

on their Academics, research and performance in extracurricular and extension activities in three years of undergraduate program.

Editorial team of the college including faculty and students has worked hard to bring out a wonderful edition of magazine '**Samdrishti**' which will be released soon. The other two publications of the department of Hindi Patrakarita Evam Jansanchar '**Sambhav**' and '**RLA Samachar**' which are important means to provide hands on training experience to our students will also be showcased.

I would also like to extend heartfelt gratitude towards the Chairman and all the members of Governing Body for working in the direction of strengthening and augmenting the college facilities and guiding us in all our endeavours to take this institution to newer heights.

I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks to our retired faculty members and their families, Ms Pabby, Sh Om Parkash Ji, Mrs Rani Gupta, Ms R C Mishra, Sh R K Aggarwal, Shri M S Verma for contributing to the college endowment fund and sponsoring Best student awards and scholarships.

In the end, I congratulate and give blessings to our three Best Students of the year and other best students in various fields, who have showcased remarkable talent and dedication in academics and extracurricular activities in their respective undergraduate programs.

I also congratulate all the students who have excelled in academics and are about to receive prizes shortly. I wish all the best to our students for semester end examinations scheduled in the coming months Nov-Dec.

Detailed Report

Centres and Cells

1. Internal Quality Assurance Cell

Coordinator: Prof. Purna Diwan, Department of Microbiology

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) serves as a pivotal entity within the academic framework of our institution, tasked with the overarching goal of ensuring and enhancing the quality of education and academic practices. Established with a commitment to fostering a culture of continuous improvement, IQAC functions as a proactive mechanism for planning, guiding, and monitoring quality assurance and enhancement activities. By engaging with stakeholders, implementing quality benchmarks, and facilitating feedback mechanisms, IQAC plays a crucial role in promoting excellence in teaching, research, and overall institutional performance. Through its systematic approach and collaborative endeavors, IQAC endeavors to uphold standards of excellence, accountability, and innovation, thereby contributing to the holistic development and success of our educational endeavors.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) Activities for the Academic Year 2021-22

1. On June 24th, 2021, the Department of Political Science, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), organized a webinar addressing copyright and plagiarism issues pertinent to teaching and research.
2. A webinar titled "Cyber Crimes in India: Modus Operandi, Prevention, and Punishment" was conducted by the Department of Commerce in association with IQAC on October 5th, 2021.
3. The Commerce department, in conjunction with IQAC, conducted a one-day workshop on filing Income Tax returns for salaried individuals for the financial year 2020-2021, held on December 15th, 2021.
4. Throughout the 2021-22 academic session, IQAC convened two meetings to ensure continuity in the teaching-learning process despite the challenges posed by the pandemic. Key initiatives undertaken during this period include:
 - Implementation of steps for the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) from 2022-23 as per the National Education Policy (NEP), faculty orientation, infrastructural enhancements, and initiation of the new appointment process.
 - Training over 600 students to enhance employability through 13 add-on skill development certificate courses, along with offering free 60-hour coaching classes for CAT, UPSC, and SSC+Bank PO entrance examinations.
 - Facilitating virtual visits to laboratories and field excursions, along with organizing more than 75 webinars/seminars.
 - Providing internship opportunities to over 120 students through an Internship Fair organized by the college.
 - Infrastructure upgrades including the addition of 15 new computers to the commerce lab, procurement of 100 Google Workspace licenses for online

- teaching-learning, renewal of the Zoom Pro package for large online meetings, lab equipment acquisitions, and completion of two Research labs.
- Ongoing construction of a Student Activity Room/Yoga Room and conversion of nine classrooms into smart classrooms. Additionally, efforts towards energy self-sufficiency through the installation of 130 KV solar panels, initiation of the Community Radio Station installation process, and the campus becoming PwD friendly.
 - Accomplishments such as undergraduate students authoring 15 research/review papers, training 56 students through summer internship programs, and securing two research projects granted by ICMR.
 - Completion of faculty promotions and recognition of the Microbiology department with the Best Department Award at the state level by the Microbiologists Society of India.
 - Recognition from the Ministry of Education for outstanding contributions towards sustainable campus practices.
 - Notable achievements, including Dr. Arun Kumar Gautam's grant of an Australian Innovation Patent and the continuation of yoga and aerobic classes in online mode.
 - Formation of the Swachta Action Plan Committee (Implementation and Monitoring) with subcommittees established for effective execution.
5. A meeting of the Governing Body was convened on April 6th, 2022, at 3:00 pm (conducted both online and offline) to deliberate and approve the introduction of six new courses in the College, as recommended by IQAC and the Staff Council. The proposed courses, including B.Sc. (Hons) Physics, B.Sc. (Hons) Chemistry, B.A. (Hons) Economics, B.Sc. (Hons) Environmental Science, B.A. (Hons) BJMC English, and B.A. (Hons) Psychology, received unanimous approval from the members.
 6. Throughout the academic year 2021-22, IQAC, in collaboration with internal and external experts, convened two meetings to propose quality initiatives aligned with stakeholder requirements and feedback.

2. Center for Human Values, Ethics and Life Skills

Coordinator: Dr Rita Jain

Co-Coordinator: Dr Sanjay K. Sharma

Ram Lal Anand College established the Center for Human Values, Ethics and Life Skills in 2018-19 on the recommendation of IQAC. The initiative aims to address the oversight of cultivating strong values and life skills amidst the competitive corporate world. Through a non-credit course, first-year students receive guidance on essential skills for personal growth and societal contribution, covering topics like time management, leadership, and stress management. The sessions successfully conducted during academic year 2021-22 are as follows:

1. Dr. Devendra Kumar Gupta, founder of Ladli Foundation, inaugurated the session on December 4th, 2021, attended by 355 students (84 females).
2. Mr. Govind Kumar Mishra, founder of "Leaders Avenue," led a session on self-awareness and self-esteem on December 8th, 9th, and 10th 2021, with 432 students in attendance (185 females).
3. Mrs. Meenu Bhargava, a public speaker, conducted a session on critical and creative thinking on December 22nd, 23rd, and 24th, attended by 407 students (300 females).
4. Dr. Ajay Sharma, a prolific author and senior trainer, addressed social and political responsibility on January 5th, 6th, and 7th, 2022, with 386 students present (270 females).
5. Mr. Suneel Keswani administered a session on emotional intelligence on January 19th, 20th, and 21st, 2022, attended by 429 students (280 females).
6. Dr. Rita Mishra, educator and founder of NGO Patang, focused on tolerance and equality on February 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, 2022, with 430 students participating (280 females).
7. Mahak Vaish, a motivational speaker and trainer, covered anger and stress management on February 16th, 17th, and 18th, 2022, attended by 421 students (190 females).
8. Dr. Bhavana Barmi, a clinical psychologist and leader, led a session on choices and decisions on April 9th and 16th, 2022, with 327 students present (230 females).
9. Mrs. Anuja Roy addressed harmony in society on April 23rd and 30th, 2022, with 382 students attending (128 females).
10. NSS RLA organized a workshop on emotional well-being on April 26th, 2022, attended by 85 students (44 females) volunteers, with Dr. Sanjeev Siddharth and Air Marshal Naresh Verma as speakers.
11. Mr. Avijit conducted a session on conflict resolution and empathy on May 7th and 14th, 2022.
12. Ms. Divya Shah focused on happiness on May 21st and 28th, 2022, with 367 students participating (225 females).
13. Rahul Kapoor took sessions on communication and negotiations on June 4th and 11th, 2022, attended by 328 students (165 females).
14. Dr. Seema Gupta, Associate Professor, discussed ethics on June 18th and 25th, 2022, with 385 students present (178 females).
15. Ms. Amita Khare led a session on storytelling on July 2nd and 9th, 2022, with 329 students attending (199 females).
16. Mr. Romey Kumar conducted a session on using criticism positively on September 23rd, 2022, attended by 73 students (22 females).

3. Research and IPR Cell

Coordinator: Prof. Vandana Gupta, Department of Microbiology

The Research and Intellectual Property Rights (RnIPR) cell actively engages with faculty members across departments to support them in crafting project proposals for external research funding. In a bid to bolster undergraduate research, the college introduced the "**College Research Grant**," offering seed funding of Rs. 30,000 to 50,000 for selected proposals. The RnIPR cell facilitated the proposal process, receiving 12 submissions, ultimately **recommending 8 proposals for funding**. Projects commenced on January 1st, 2020, with extensions granted due to college closures, ensuring continuation until December 31st, 2022. During the 2021-2022 academic session, the RnIPR cell hosted a webinar on IPR and Patents, featuring Ms. Latika Khanduja, a registered patent attorney on '**Why, What and How of IPR and Patents**' on 3 Sep 2021. Additionally, an offline seminar on Intellectual Property rights in Biological Sciences was conducted, with Dr. Chitra Arvind, a renowned speaker, sharing insights on "**Intellectual Property rights in Biological Sciences: A Kaleidoscope of Opportunities**" organized on 7 Apr 2022. Furthermore, the cell initiated a summer internship program, offering research exposure to 56 students, while an Internship fair, 'MILESTONE 22,' facilitated over 120 internship offers to students. These initiatives underscore the college's commitment to fostering research culture and promoting intellectual property awareness among students and faculty.

4. Centre of Entrepreneurship and Technology Development (E-CELL)

Coordinator: Prof. Perna Diwan, Department of Microbiology

Faculty Members: Dr Rita Jain, Dr Sanjay Kumar Sharma, Ms Deepti Gupta

The E-cell fosters entrepreneurship by providing students with networking opportunities, skills, and support to excel in the business world. It aims to uncover students' entrepreneurial potential, offering expertise through workshops and lectures. The objective is to inspire innovation, problem-solving, and the transformation of ideas into successful ventures.

Events organised during academic year 2021-22 are as follows:

1. The Entrepreneurship Cell organized an E-Summit on February 26th, 2021, on the Zoom platform, drawing over 300 participants under the theme "Meeting the Opportunities." Renowned speakers including Saurabh Jain, Nixon Joseph, Arjun

Vaidya, Deep Bajaj, and Anil Khatna shared their entrepreneurial journeys, enriching the session.

2. In collaboration with BIRAC-Tie, an Entrepreneurship Awareness Workshop took place on February 6th, 2021, via Zoom. Notable speakers like Mr. Pankaj Vermani and Taranjeet Kaur shared insights on transitioning from university to the real world and BIRAC's role in fostering startup culture, respectively. The workshop aimed to enlighten students about the entrepreneurial landscape.
3. E-Conclave, spanning from April 17th to April 20th, 2021, featured four events - Sport Auction, Corporate Auction, Mock Stock, and Pitch Preneur, conducted over Google Meet. A total of 58 teams participated, showcasing their skills in various entrepreneurial domains. Winners were determined based on their pitches and innovative solutions.

5. Media Production Centre

Coordinator: Dr Rakesh Kumar (Hindi)

The college is equipped with a comprehensive audio-video enabled media production center featuring cutting-edge cameras, microphones, mixers, and recording devices. This facility serves as both a practical training ground for students of mass media and an e-content generation hub.

1. The commencement of events occurred with a webinar titled 'Azadi @ 75: Responsibilities and Challenges of Journalism' as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav on August 9, 2021.
2. In observance of Mother Language Day, an event titled "Trauma Literacy in Poetry Recitation and Journalism" was conducted both online and offline on 21st Feb 2022. Professor Govind Singh, Director of the Radio and TV Journalism Department at the Indian Institute of Mass Communication (IIMC), along with senior journalist and writer Arun Tripathi, served as experts for this session.
3. A seminar addressing the topic 'Contempt of Court and Freedom of Expression' was organized on October 9, 2021. Supreme Court Delhi Advocate Rajiv Tiwari and News 24 Assistant Editor Prabhakar Mishra participated as speakers.
4. Under the joint collaboration with Vigyan Prasar, an autonomous institute of the Central Government, the department conducted a certificate course titled "Essential Skills in Science and Environment Communication." This course, spanning from October 9, 2021, to December 19, 2021, saw the participation of 80 students from various colleges of Delhi University. The curriculum covered a range of topics related to science and environmental communication over a duration of 40 hours.



5. A two-day workshop on 'Digital Safety and Privacy' took place on February 19 and 20, 2022, featuring Atul Anand as the subject expert. The workshop addressed critical issues such as data theft, online shopping security, password management, and safeguarding personal information.
6. On Mother Language Day, February 21, 2022, a "Mother Language Folklore Festival" was organized, aiming to elucidate the significance of mother languages, as explained by the course coordinator.
7. Furthermore, during the academic year 2021-22, the Media Production Centre comprehensively covered (through photography and videography) all major events including seminars, workshops, conferences, Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), organized by various departments, the IPR cell, and the IQAC, in addition to the college's Annual Festival and Annual Prize Distribution Function.

Departmental Reports 2021-22

1. Department of Microbiology

Teacher In-charge: Dr Sudha Chaudhry, Society Convenor: Dr. M Salome John

The Department of Microbiology commenced the academic year 2021-22 with a series of meticulously organized events aimed at enriching the academic experience and fostering holistic growth among students.

- Online Certificate Course: 'Basic Statistics for Biological Sciences' (July 5th - July 16th, 2021): Under the DBT Star College Scheme, a comprehensive 40-hour online certificate course was conducted, featuring distinguished resource persons including Dr. Rita Jain, Dr. Anupama Mukherjee, and Ms. Deboshree Das. Out of 70 participants, 59 successfully completed the course, earning graded merit certificates.
- The department organized various engaging activities, including an Essay Writing Competition as part of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav celebrations, and the Bio-matrix: An Online Science Quiz in September 2021, attracting participation from colleges nationwide. An online interaction with esteemed alumni provided insights into research opportunities.
- Collaboration with E-cell: Talk on BioNEST Facility (October 23rd, 2021): A talk shedding light on the BioNEST facility at the University of Delhi, South Campus, was hosted in collaboration with the E-cell. Led by Dr. Vijay Kantharia, CEO of BioNEST, the session garnered attention from 88 attendees and was lauded for its informative content.
- Orientation and Awareness-building Initiatives: Initiatives included an online departmental orientation program for newly admitted students in November 2021 and an enlightening session on Constitution Day, offering insights into the fundamental principles of the Indian Constitution.

REPORTS OF STAFF COUNCIL COMMITTIES 2021-22

ADMISSION COMMITTEE

Being a Covid19 affected academic session which started much delayed, yet saw a total of 925 students admitted to various undergraduate courses and 12 students to the post graduate level.

ALUMNI COMMITTEE

ENACTUS

In the session of 2021-2022, Enactus Ram Lal Anand achieved significant milestones. The new core team took charge in January, commencing with an orientation program that attracted over 150 participants eager to learn and engage. Following the orientation, recruitment forms were made available, resulting in over 100 student applications. After a rigorous interview process, 27 students were selected to form the Enactus team.

This year, Enactus Ram Lal Anand initiated two impactful projects. Firstly, Project AAKAR, officially launched on 10/03/2022, addresses the issue of plastic pollution. Through extensive research and experimentation, the team developed a method to recycle plastic bottle caps into practical accessories like keychains and coasters, aiming to create employment opportunities for beneficiaries. Secondly, THE FINESSE STUDIO, also launched on 10/03/2022, focuses on reviving the traditional art of pottery. The studio offers a range of activities, from live pottery experiences to month-long courses, to promote and preserve this cultural heritage.

Field visits played a crucial role in Enactus's activities this year, with over 10 visits conducted in a span of 4 months. These visits ranged from engaging with potters in the Kumhar colony to identifying communities for Project AAKAR's production setup.

Enactus RLAC + Hasratein (10/03/2022) marked the first major event of the session, held in collaboration with the Dramatics Society of Ram Lal Anand. The event featured stalls for both projects, with THE FINESSE STUDIO offering live pottery experiences and Project AAKAR organizing games to raise awareness about plastic pollution. The initiative garnered significant campus engagement, with over 200 bottle caps collected and conversations sparked about environmental conservation.

Following the success of the first event, Enactus RLAC at SGTB Khalsa (22/04/2022) saw participation in an event organized by Enactus SGTB Khalsa. This event showcased various Enactus projects and featured engaging activities to raise awareness. Project AAKAR also organized a lucky draw, offering prizes from their inaugural batch of in-house productions.

Enactus at Art for Change (11/06/2022) concluded the session with a workshop held in collaboration with 'Art for Change' at 'Samadhan: Centre for Human Resources'. The workshop, developed in consultation with beneficiaries, provided participants with a comprehensive pottery experience, receiving praise for its immersive and educational nature.

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Minutes of 9th IQAC meeting held online on 23rd May 2022

Attendees: Dr Rakesh Kumar Gupta (Chairperson), Dr Prerna Diwan (Coordinator), Mr Santosh Kumar Sharma (External Expert), Ms Ritu kalra (External Expert), Mr Abhilash Chakraverty (External Expert), Dr Rakesh Kumar (History), Dr Pardeep Kumar Sharma, Dr Mukta Datta Mazumdar, Dr Rakesh Kumar (Hindi), Dr Rita Jain, and Dr Neena Mittal, Prof Sanjay Kumar Sharma, Ms Deepshikha (English), Dr Ravish Lal, Dr Nidhi Yadav

Dr Arun Gautam expressed his inability to attend the meeting.

Decisions: (Refer to Appended Agenda of meeting **Annexure 1**)

1. Minutes of 8th Meeting of IQAC (held on 11th November 2021 were **confirmed**
2. Action Taken Report presented by IQAC Coordinator (appended as **Annexure 2**) on decisions taken in 8th IQAC meeting: **Noted and approved**
3. Quality Initiatives for session 2022-23:
 - (i) Implementation of Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF)-2022 as per NEP 2020 adopted by University of Delhi: Chairman apprised the house regarding salient features of UGCF mainly including multiple exit points for students, after one year (certificate); after 2 years (Diploma); after 3 years (Degree) and after 4 years (Degree with research). He also apprised the members that the faculty is involved in curriculum development for UGCF programmes in different departments. Chairman apprised the house that with UGCF, classroom and other infrastructural requirements will enhance and we may have to make the college working on Saturdays also. Enhanced requirement of classrooms will be taken care of, when we get the SPS Academic block from Aryabhata college.
 - (ii) Admissions on the basis of CUET Scores: It was informed by the chairman that CUET (being conducted by NTA) exam score will be considered for admission to various programmes in academic session 2022-23.

(iii) Orienting Faculty for UGCF-2022 based on NEP and Faculty Development programmes: Since NEP implementation will be a challenge because a number of course options needs to be offered to students, it was decided to orient faculty for UGCF-2022 based on NEP by inviting resource persons through conducting Seminar/workshop/FDP who were involved in framing UGC and drafting NEP document before the start of session.

(iv) National/International Conferences: The college has been inviting national and international resource persons for students and also engaging students in organising National/International Conferences to impart them the organisational, anchoring and public speaking skills. In the coming session also, proposals will be sought from departments for the same.

(v) Skill development Certificate courses for students to be offered in 2022-23 including Sports Journalism to be offered by BJMC proposed in last meeting. Microbiology has informed to offer certificate course “ Basic Statistics for Biological Sciences” this year. For other certificate courses, proposals will be sought from departments/societies.

(vi) Summer Research Internships for students : This initiative will be taken through Research and IPR cell. It was decided to offer 6-8 weeks summer research internships to students under the guidance of interested faculty members. This will pave way for establishing the research culture and facilities for the research component in the UGCF mode.

(vii) Trainings for laboratory and other non-teaching staff: It was decided that a two days “प्रशासनिक हिंदी कार्यशाला” will be organised for our college nonteaching staff and will be open to other college staff also. This will be organised by Hindi department in association with IQAC on 23-24th June 2024 for non-teaching staff.

(viii) Formation of New Committees including the ones proposed under Swatchta action Plan: Following new committee and subcommittees were proposed

a. Swatchta Action Plan Committee (Implementation and Monitoring) to look after all aspects of sustainable development.

- Campus cleanliness & Hygiene committee
- Clean energy & Conservation committee
- E-waste Management Committee
- Green Campus Committee
- Solid waste Management (including biowaste) committee

- Water Management committee (Recycling, safe drinking water, conservation and STP)
- (ix) Establishment of Career Development Centre with Samarth Bharat Team as Knowledge Partners: Chairman apprised the house that RLA is one of the 15 colleges selected for this proposed Career Development Centre by the university. This centre will strive to provide trainings, placements, internships, startup support including mentoring and incubation facility. For this college will be granted one lakh to start this centre.
- (x) Formulating Entrepreneurship Policy for college students: will be drafted by Convener, Centre for Entrepreneurship and Technology Development of the college
- (xi) Defining important days to be celebrated/observed annually: List of days decided to be celebrated/observed is appended as **Annexure 3**
- (xii) SOPs for all centres, committees and societies : will be drafted stating the aim, activities to be conducted and how to do the reporting.
- (xiii) Scheduling Audits: Electric & Fire Audit; Energy Audit; Green Audit; Administrative Audit in the coming session: In view of the unfortunate incidence of fire in Amphitheatre, due to short circuiting, it was decided to conduct fire and electric audit and to change all old wiring in the building. The 130 kv solar panels will be made functional soon and the HT substation will be linked to solar power points. It was also decided to organise Green Audit; Administrative Audit and academic audit in coming session.
- (ix) Appointment of Teaching staff on Permanent Basis: Chairman informed the house that University is moving ahead with the process of appointment of Teaching staff on permanent basis. The college has also sent roster to university, once it gets approved, the posts will be advertised.
