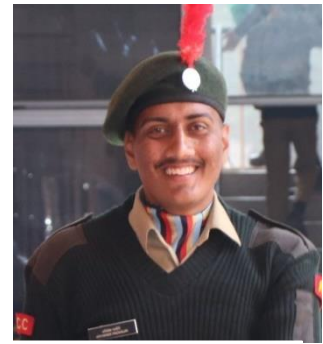

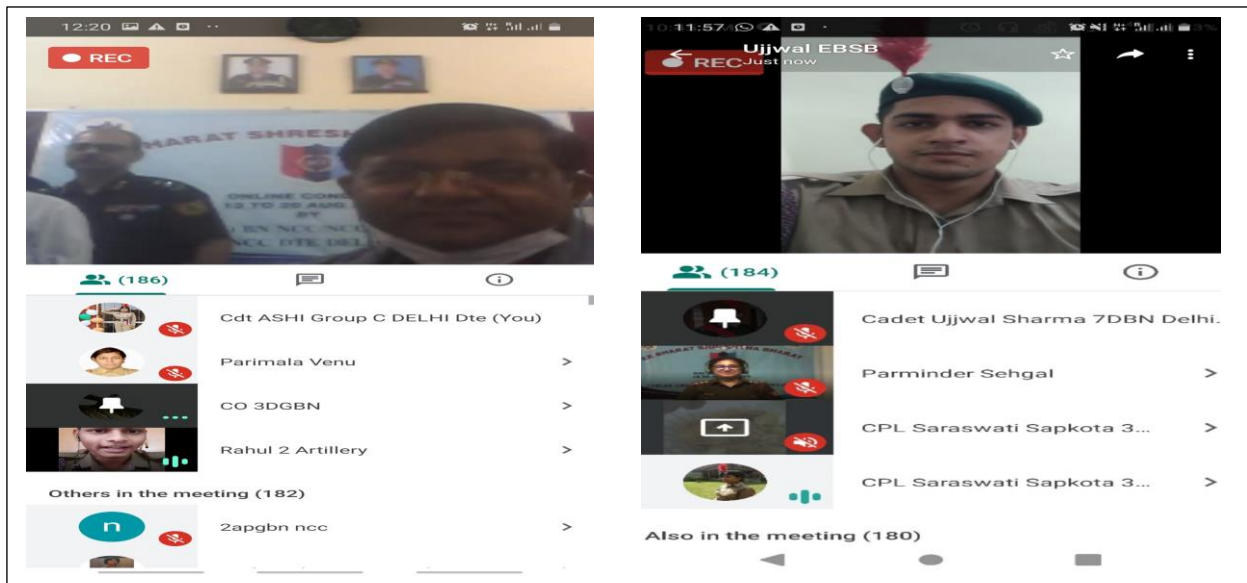

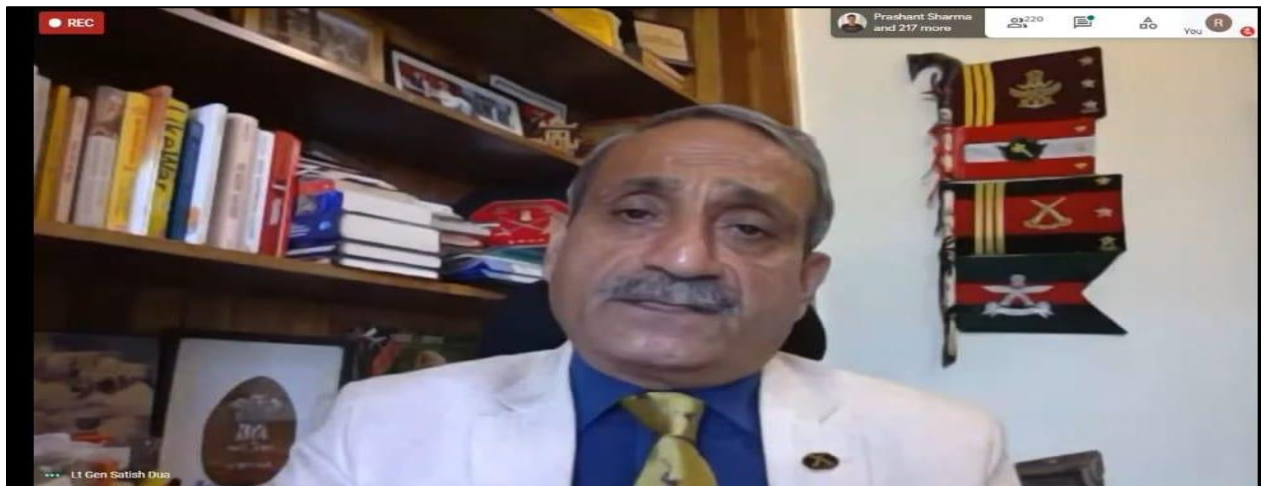
**"ROLE OF NCC IN NATIONAL INTEGRATION"**

Ram Lal Anand College NCC organised a Two Day Online National Conference on "Role of NCC in National Integration." Under the guidance of principal, Dr. Professor Rakesh Kumar Gupta the conference was organised on Google meet and also was live streamed on you tube . The conference was a huge success. It also included paper presentation by Associate NCC officers and intellectuals from various backgrounds. The sessions were coordinated by Capt (Dr) Sanjay Kumar Sharma, Dr Archana Gaur and Dr Devendra Jha. Twenty research papers also came from various states.

**HONORABLE LT GEN. SATISH DUA**

Lieutenant General Satish Dua, PVSM, UYSM, SM, VSM, retired as the Chief of Integrated Defence Staff. The Integrated Defence Staff is responsible for synergizing capability development, perspective planning and jointness amongst Army, Navy & Air Force. A counter-terrorism specialist, General Dua was the Corps Commander in Kashmir, who planned and executed the Surgical Strikes in response to the terror attack at Uri. He has commanded his Battalion as well as a Brigade in active militancy in Jammu & Kashmir on Line of Control, (LoC). As a Major General, he raised and commanded a new Counter Terrorism Division of Assam Rifles in the North East to coordinate operations in three states of North East.

Lieutenant general Satish Dua in his address focused on the NCC Cadet's Participation in the Indo – Sino War of 1962 when cadets did patrolling, helped ordinance factories and helped army in search and patrol the areas. Gen Satish Dua also mentioned the hard fought battle of Kargil and sacrifice of Indian soldiers in the war. He said at the very young age of 23 – 24 year Capt Vikram Batra who said "YE DIL MANGE MORE" after wiping out the enemy troops in Kargil and gave the supreme sacrifice for the country. He also remembers the attack of Uri on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2016 which was a Dark Day for the country as 18 soldiers lost their lives and in response after 10 days terror camps in Pakistan occupied Kashmir were neutralised by doing surgical strikes by the Indian Army.

Gen Dua also emphasised that the power of youth. He said, "When I say youth, young people like you fill my heart with confidence, you will drive the growth story of India, you will drive the world forward, you will take India forward, and you will do this by doing whatever you do in the best possible manner. The growth story of India needs each one of you, you need all the skill sets, everyone doesn't have to join the Army, I find students boys and girls walking up to me saying sir I want to join the Army, you are welcome. Or somebody says I couldn't join, I tried, I'm overage or something, and before I end, this is what I say to everyone, and I will say this to you: YOU DON'T HAVE TO JOIN THE ARMY TO SERVE THE COUNTRY, THE GROWTH STORY OF INDIA NEEDS EACH ONE OF YOU, THE DOCTORS, THE ENGINEERS, ANALYSIS, MECHANICS, DESIGNERS, ALL SKILL SETS ARE REQUIRED, DO YOUR BIT, DO YOUR BIT, WHATEVER YOU DO, DO IT TO YOUR BEST OF YOUR ABILITY, AND IF YOU WANT TO SHOW RESPECT FOR A SOLDIER, BE A GOOD CITIZEN, THAT NCC TEACHES YOU VERY WELL, BE A GOOD CITIZEN, BE A CITIZEN WORTH DYING FOR."



**MAJOR GENERAL VIKRAM DEV DOGRA, AVSM (Retd )**

- Major General Vikram Dev Dogra, AVSM served in the Indian Army for over 37 years. Recipient of the Sword of Honor and Presidents Gold Medal at the Indian Military Training . He commanded The Poona Horse, 180 Armoured Brigade on the western front and an infantry division part of a strike corps. He gained combat experience in J&K and as Military Observer in Angola where he oversaw cessation of hostilities as part of UN peace keeping forces.
- He leads by personal example and completed Ironman Austria at the age of 58 in 14 hours and 20 minutes on 01 July 2018 to become the first Serving Indian Army officer and the only general in the world to do so. Not one to rest on his laurels he once again participated in Ironman Germany and bettered his own time by 40 minutes finishing in 13 hours 40 min.

Major General Vikram dogra in his address emphasised that the importance of perseverance , commitment , time management , discipline , optimism and self belief . he said that during your whole life never stop dreaming big and make your dream your goal . he said that ; I too had a dream , my dream at the age of 58 was to do the Iron man and like was brought out in the introduction the Iron Man is the most grueling one day endurance event in the world. It comprises of a swim, which is either in the Lake or in the ocean of 3.86 kilometers, followed by a cycling ride of 180.2 kilometers and then you have to do a full marathon of 42.2 kilometers , all to be done one after the other and you have to complete it within 17 hour.

He also focused on the role and strength of youth. He said that Confidence in yourself that Yes I can do it . Most important – the day you lose confidence in yourself you will not be able to pursue your dream. So use optimism and visualization as a way to keep your self-belief going Age is just a Number –you are never too young or never too old to ever do anything. He reiterate that PATIENCE , PERSEVERANCE , COMMITMENT , FOCUS and if you make a cocktail of all this that you start using it to follow your dream then I can assure you that you will achieve your dream and if not so at least you will be very close to it . His address motivated all the cadets to dream big and achieve it.





### **AIR MARSHAL NARESH VERMA**

- Air Marshal Naresh Verma (Retd) served in the Indian Air Force for 40 years. Prior to his retirement he held the appointments of Director General (Administration) and AOA of the Indian Air Force. He is an alumnus of National Defence Academy, Pune. Air Force Administrative College, Coimbatore and National Defence College, New Delhi. After his retirement he was appointed as Member, Armed Forces Tribunal, and Chandigarh Bench. Later he held the position of Director, India International Centre from 1st July 2015 to 31st Dec 2018 He has been the President of Delhi Gymkhana Club 1st Oct 2011 to 30th Sept 2013
- Director General, IFAAD (International Foundation for Aviation, Aerospace and Drones)

Air Marshal Naresh Verma in his speech mentioned Core Values which could be inculcated in NCC. i.e To instill patriotism and to contribute to national development. Respect for diversity in religion, language, culture, ethnicity, lifestyle and habitat. To instill a sense of national unity and social cohesion. Commitment to learn and adhere to the norms and values enshrined in Constitution. Understanding the value of just and impartial exercise of authority, Readiness to participate in community development and other social programs, a healthy lifestyle free of substance abuse and other unhealthy practices, Sincerity to the needs of poor and socially disadvantaged fellow citizens, Inculcating habits of restraint and self awareness, Understanding the value of honesty, truthfulness, self sacrifice, perseverance and hard work, Respect for knowledge, wisdom and power of ideas.

He also emphasised that the Role and responsibilities of youth --To contribute to family and self-development and to promote social and intergenerational, understanding as well as gender equality, To extend respect to teachers, elders, parents and family in consonance with our cultural norms and traditions, To uphold the unity and integrity of the nation, maintain peace and harmony, observe the fundamental duties and respect the fundamental rights and freedom guaranteed under the constitution to all sections of the people. To respect others faiths and beliefs in the religious, Cultural and Social sphere and different schools of thought, and neither exploit nor be instrumental in the exploitation a fellow citizen or other person specially women, To promote and practice appropriate standards of ethical conduct in individual and social life, to maintain honesty and integrated off character and be committed to fight against all norms of corruption, social ills and practices. To preserve and protect the environment. To commit themselves to creating a discrimination and exploitation free environment and to devote their time and energy in nation building activities. His speech was very informative and helpful for all the cadets and student.



**MAJ. GEN. DILAWAR SINGH DURING NATIONAL CONFERENCE**

- Major General Dilawar Singh is an Indian Army Veteran, Triple Post Graduate, Double MBA, Qualified Army Commando, Counter Terrorism World record holder, Awardee of Parakram Padak and numerous Medals by President of India, Life Time Achievement Award by Raksha Mantri , BRICS Awards for Youth Empowerment & Corporate Excellence
- NYKS, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports Govt of India and Additional Director General NCC Gujarat Dadra Nagar Haveli, Damian and Diu.

Major General Dilawar Singh in his speech focused on the peace and cooperation and Role of youth in nation development. He said it is important to know how peace and development can be promoted. We will have to make sure that under no circumstances there is discrimination on the basis of religion, cast, and social status. We should be careful from whoever talks in favour of it and convince people that if we want India to grow, to become a new India, everyone must work together in harmony, empowering the nation and the youth. There should not be any divisiveness amongst us. Our country's CQMH, ABDUL HAMID, received Param Veer Chakra by destroying enemy tanks in Kargil war. In our country, there is BANA SINGH, a Sikh, who earned the Param Veer Chakra. There is no religion, caste or group which has restrained them from serving the nation.

He also emphasised that the importance of Character , he said "if you have lost money, nothing is lost" because it can be recreated, "if you've lost health, something is lost", "but if you lose character everything is lost" the key of character are :-

- a. Integrity b. self-discipline c. Selflessness d. Conscience e. knowledge F. Skill G. Attitude

In the end he said The If you need to make your identity, your country needs you, it's facing a lot of challenges. If the youth does not step forward now, and stop the bad people, you will not like what your next generation will have to face. You must lead now, we had as much as we could, now you have to. And always remember this one thing, 'NATION FIRST CHARACTER MUST'



**HONORABLE COL. SONAM WANGCHUK (MVC)**

- Colonel Sonam Wangchuk, MVC is an Indian Army veteran, who served with the Assam Regiment and the Ladakh Scouts. He was awarded the Maha Vir Chakra, India's second highest award for gallantry in the face of the enemy, during his successful operation in the Kargil War
- Col Wangchuk attended the Officers Training Academy in Chennai and was commissioned into the 4th battalion of the Assam Regiment
- He served in Sri Lanka as a part of the Indian Peace Keeping Force In 1999, at the outbreak of the Kargil War, then Major Wangchuk led an operation against Pakistani troops in the Chorbat La pass

Col Sonam Wangchuk in his address focused on the importance of national integration, Fundamentals of national unity, Relevance of NCC in unifying the nation and Aims and ethics of NCC. He himself was the the part of National Cadets Corps. He said that the NCC creates awareness amongst youth about the diverse heritage of our country and thereby fosters national integration. It helps cadet to experience living together, cooperating with each other harmoniously though they come from different background and different states and that is where they learn to work in harmony, unite and give their best possible contribution to the nation.

He also emphasised that the Aims and ethics of NCC i.e. To develop character, comradeship, discipline, leadership qualities, secularism, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service amongst the youth of the country to create a human resource of organised , trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks and spheres of life and always available for the service of the nation in any kind of contingency. Today the NCC is ready and prepared to face a crisis in the country due to the COVID-19 pandemic and china's face off and to provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces. The army, air force and naval personnel provide them the ethos and motivate them in the right direction and it helps them in giving proper guidance in joining the armed forces.

In the end of his speech he shared his experience in the Armed forces and the Battle of kargil War and sacrifices of the soldiers in the war . he said In army the officer adopts the religion of the troops because it all question of working as a team , thinking alike and sharing mutual values which develops a secular outlook in us because of those experience I am more richer today.

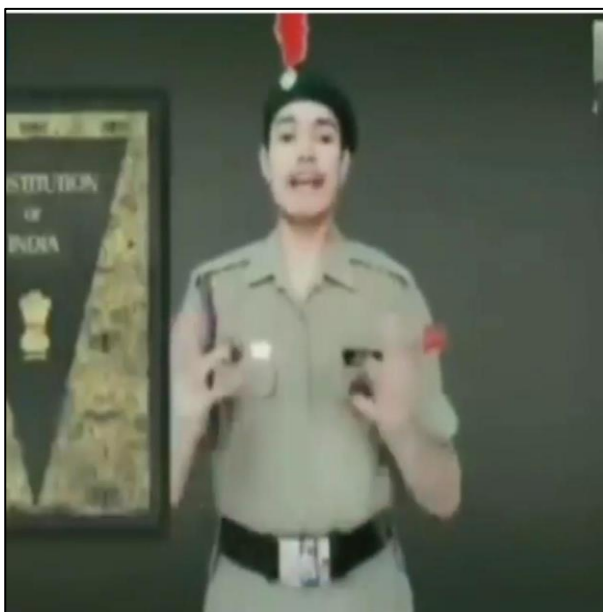
# CONSTITUTION DAY

## (14 – 16 JAN, 2021)

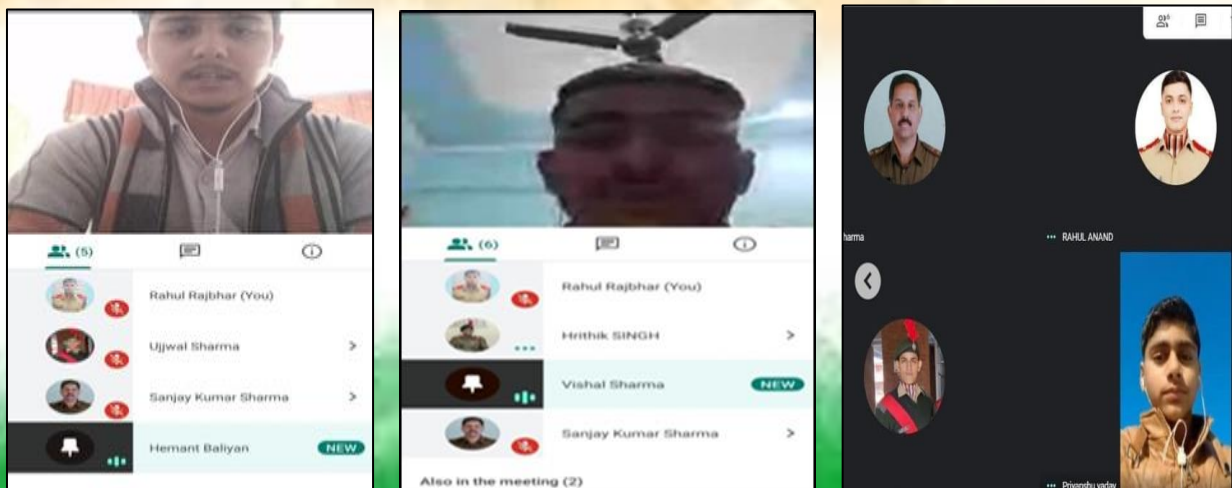

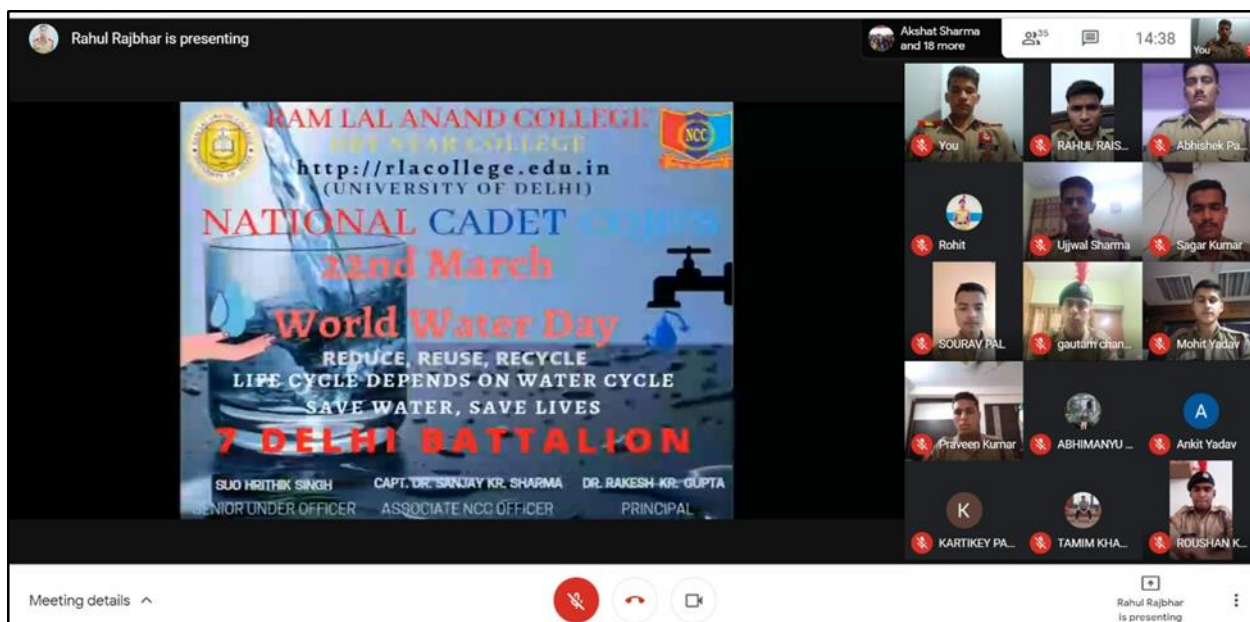

## **WORLD WATER DAY**

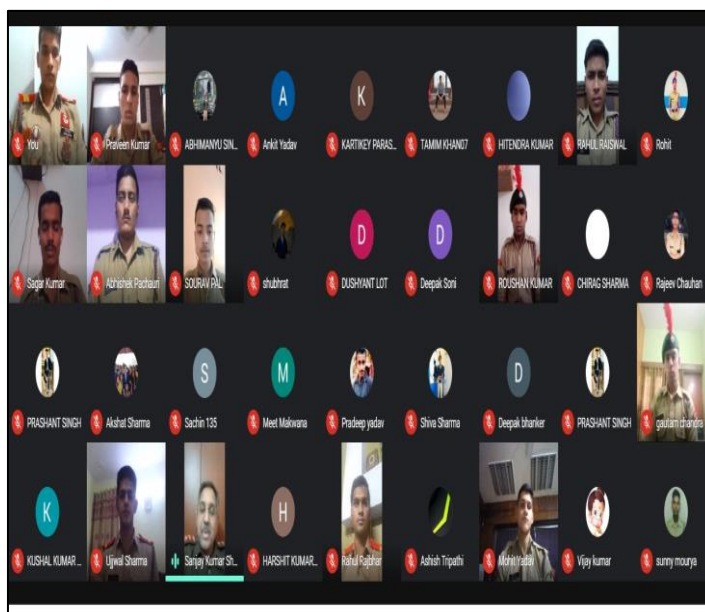
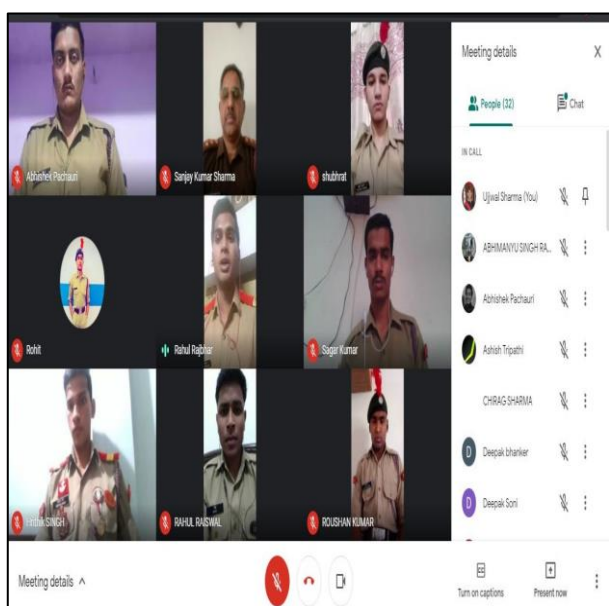
**(22nd March 2021)**

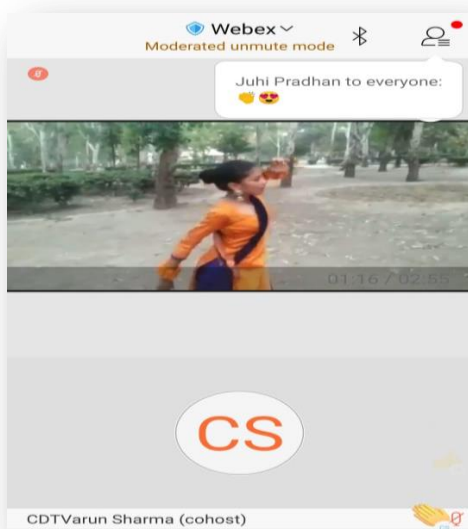


## ONLINE - EK BHARAT SHRESHTHA BHARAT (EBSB) PHASE -VI CAMP (19 April to 23 April)

# WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY

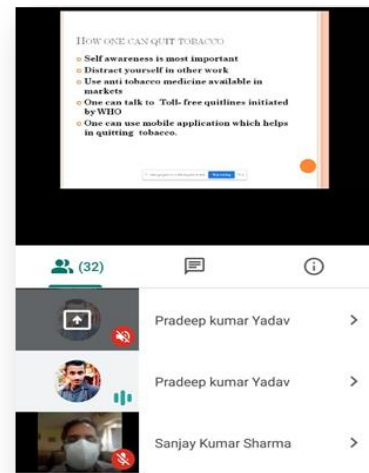
(9 June, 2021)

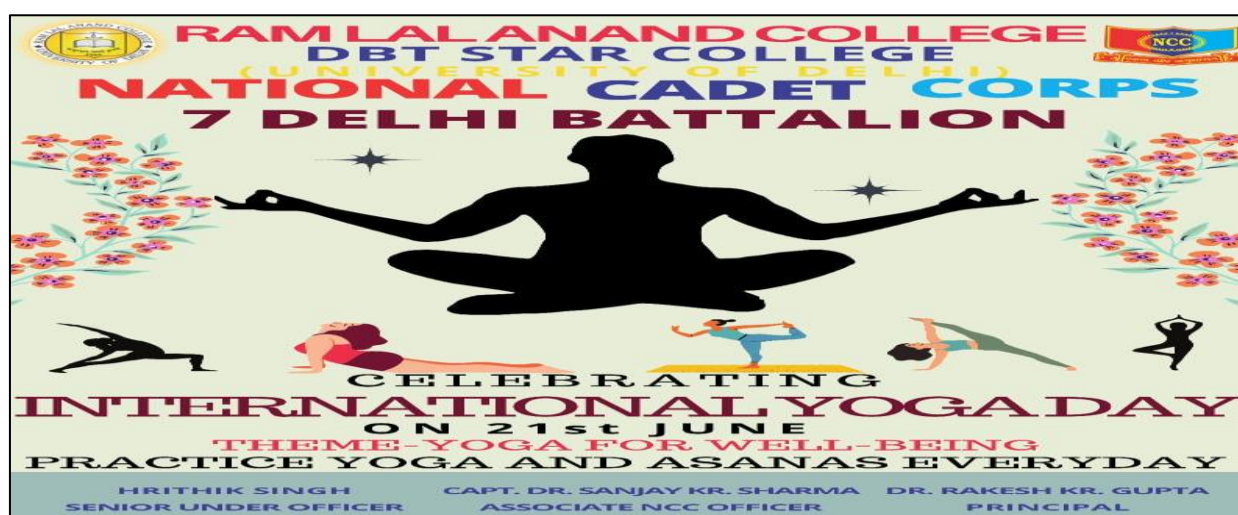

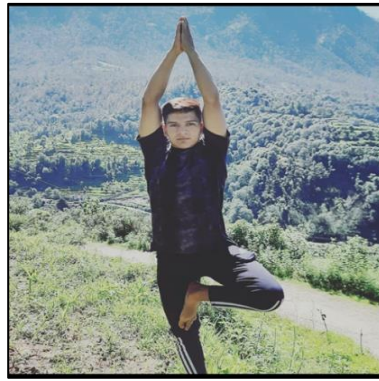

Result of the batch 2018-21 was declared in the month of august and 9 cadets passed with “A” grade and one Cadet with “B” grade.

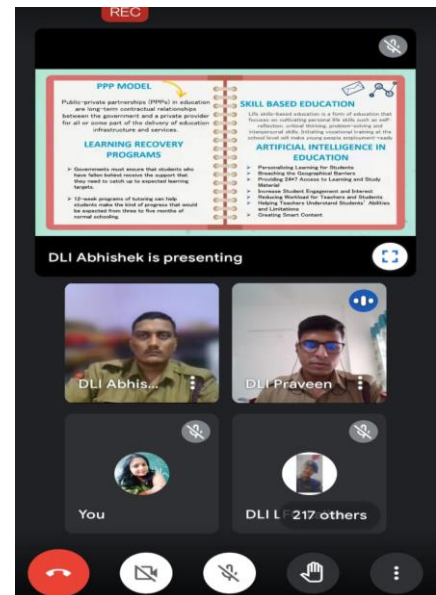
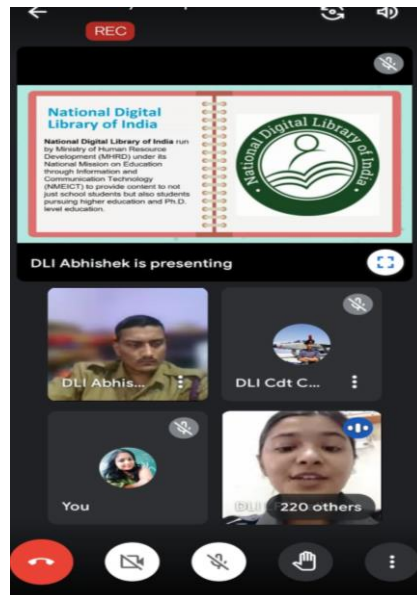
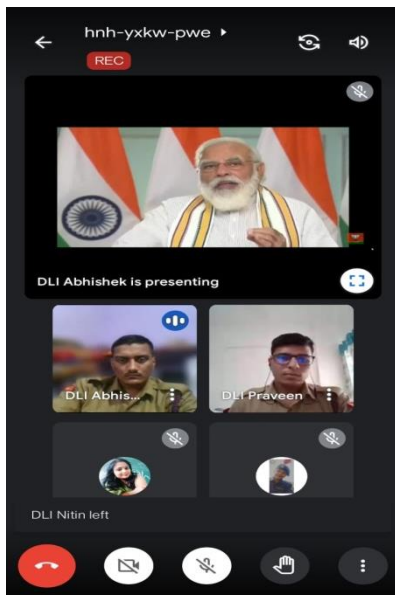

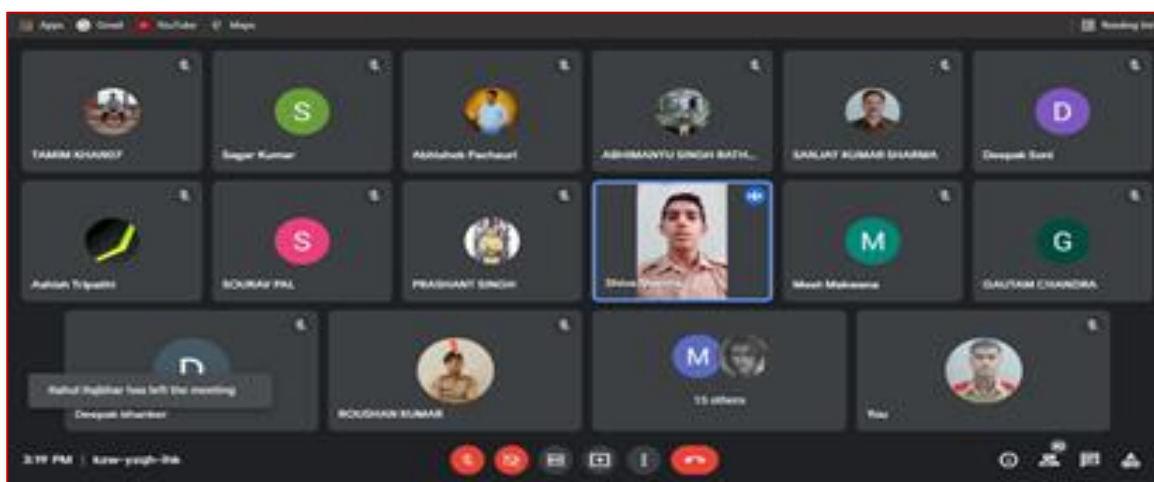
## KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS

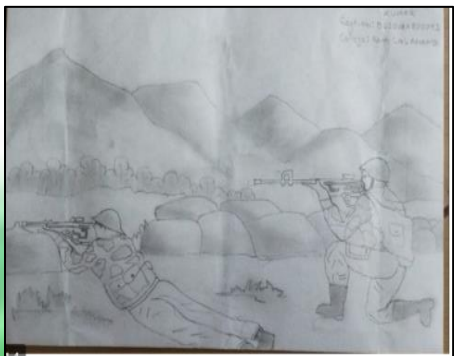
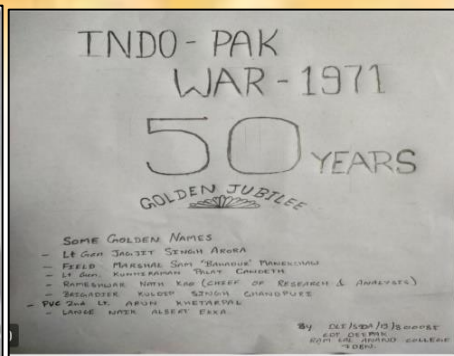

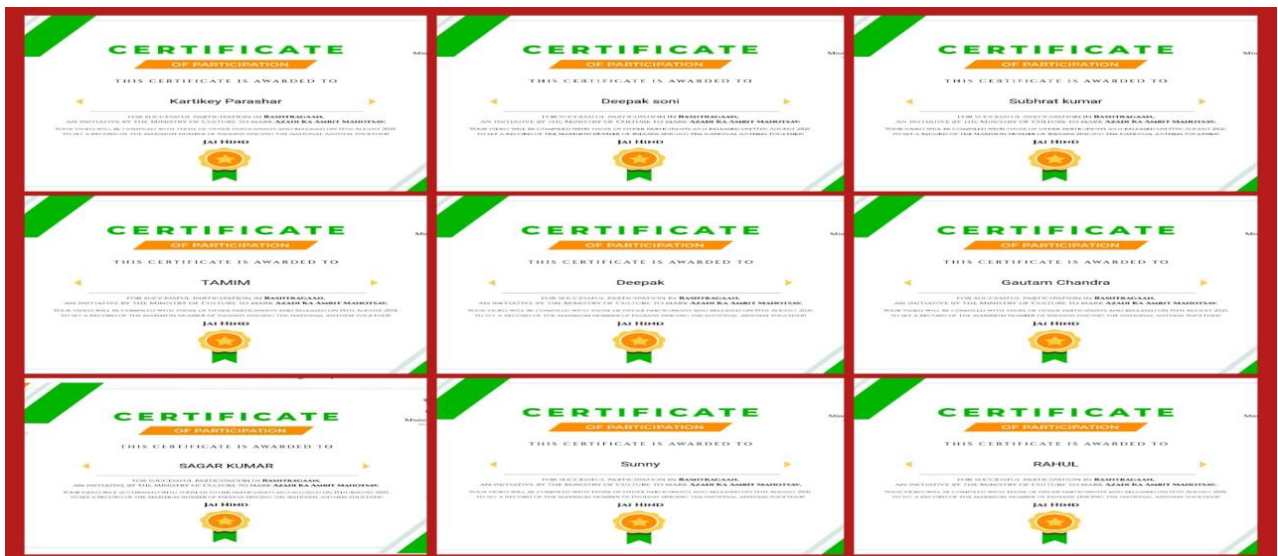


# RASHTRAGAAN

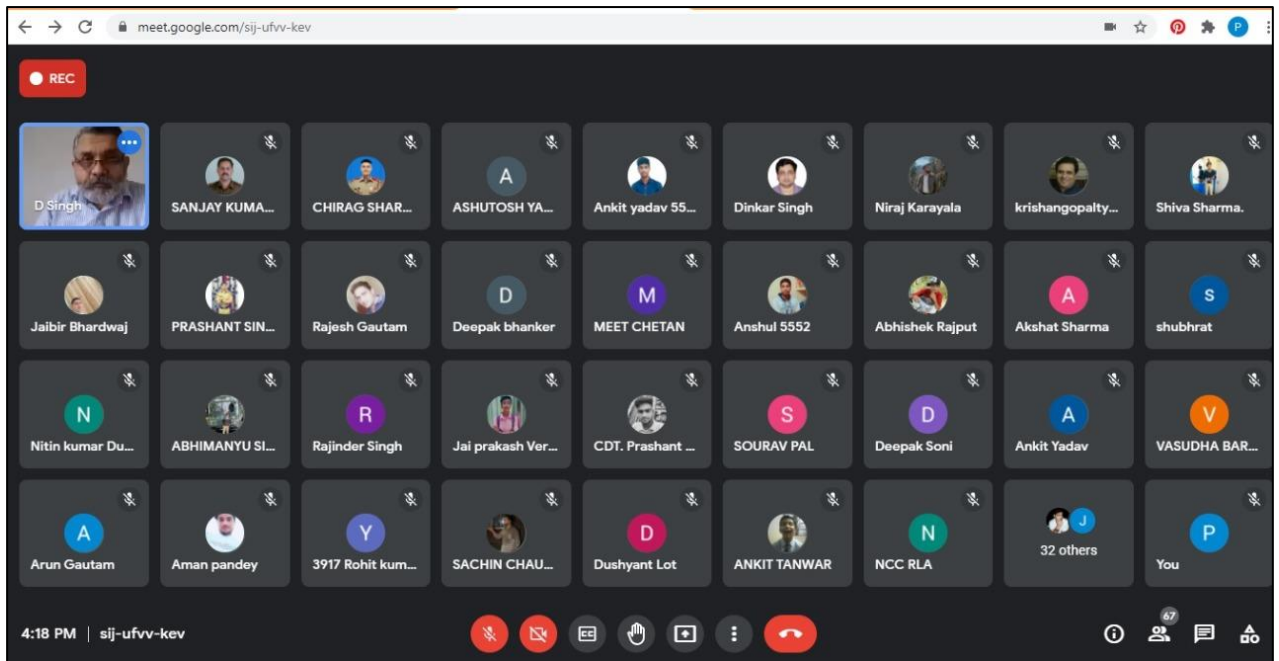
# WEBINAR ON YOUTH FOR NATION BUILDING

## युवा मेहनत से बदल सकते हैं देश की छवि

रामलाल आनंद महाविद्यालय में 'राष्ट्रीय एकीकरण में नेशनल कैडेट कोर की भूमिका' विषयक दो दिवसीय नेशनल कॉन्फ्रेंस संपन्न

आप हार मानना चाहते हैं, पर यदि वह समय आप अपने पर संयम साधकर अपने कर्ष्य को लगातार करते रहें तो आप लक्ष्य को पक सकते हैं। कर्नल सोमन वांगचुक ने एकीकरण के शाब्दिक अर्थ को स्पष्ट करते हुए अपने वक्तव्य की शुरुआत की व युवाओं द्वारा किए जाने वाले कर्ष्यों को राष्ट्रीय एकीकरण से जोड़ा। समापन सत्र में एयर मार्शल नरेश वर्मा ने कहा कि किसी भी राष्ट्र को एक करना चाहते हैं तो आपके अंदर अनुशासन का होना अत्यन्त आवश्यक है। अनुशासन ही एक देश को सुन्दर भविष्य दे सकता है। विवेकानंद और डॉ. अमूल कलाम आजाद का उदाहरण देते हुए कहा कि एनसीसी का प्रशिक्षण फौज, सरहद व समाज के अन्तर्गत भी इस्तेमाल में लाया जा सकता है। जीवन में अनुशासन, कर्मठता व देश के प्रति प्रेम भावना व कुछ कर गुजरने का
