

"Remember, your duty is to serve us in our struggle to establish a swaraj, a state not ruled by external powers."

These words give a very clear reflection of how Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj stood by the idea of Swaraj. Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj was born as a son of what can be called 'feudal lord' at the fort of Shivneri. Chhatrapati Shivaji saw the vision of one unified India under its own rule. With an aim to turn this dream into reality Shivaji started unifying southern India under the banner of Marathas. His main obstacle however always stood in the face of Mughals, whom he fought bravely till his last breath. Shivaji never believed in creating a divide amongst his fellows or people who considered him as their leader. His rule was just and wise which garnered him the support of local population over time.

"I follow principles of humanity. I neither attack helpless civilians, nor do I take them as slaves."

Shivaji always believed in the welfare of his pupils. A Braveheart, an able leader. after Aurangzeb ascended the throne in the North, he moved ahead with the aim to conquer the Deccan kingdoms. He is ruthless in his quest and would leave no stones unturned.

How Shivaji Rajc ignited the feelings of swaraj?

Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj (February 19, 1627 – April 3, 1680) is a principle of effulgence, rather a divine inspiration. He is certainly not human, he is God. Shivaji Maharaj is a Primal God who took birth in a divine and pure culture. In history, no other religion has produced such an immaculate personality. One has yet to see a monarch who despite being powerful did not use his powers to torment, who despite being glorified was not arrogant, who conquered valorous enemies and who despite being a human functioned as a God !
