

Annual Report (NSS) 2021-22

The National Service Scheme (NSS) was launched in the year 1969, also Mahatma Gandhi's birth centenary, in 37 universities with the primary goal to let community services become a source of personality development of student volunteers. As of today, the scheme runs in all Indian states and universities under the guidance of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. Its motto, *'Not Me But You'* helps students prioritize their community above themselves, and assists them in including it in the problem-solving process.

The NSS unit of Ram Lal Anand College has been extensively working to promote a holistic development environment for its student volunteers in preparation of their future, with an emphasis on community services.

The session of 2021-22 has been fruitful under the guidance of the NSS Program Officer, Dr. Rita Jain, who led the team to explore innovative ways to give back to the community. She was assisted by the following Office Bearers and Group Leaders, who had been selected for their positions based on a vivid history of selflessness, experience, and a strong work ethic:

Anisha Gupta, Aryan Singh, Deepali Sharma, Dimple Malik, Kartikey Parashar, Megha Manchanda, Raj Singh Rawat and Saksham Tiwari were nominated as the Executive Members of the unit and have been listed alphabetically.

The counsel of college Principal Dr. Rakesh Kumar Gupta and Program Officer Dr. Rita Jain has been the most effective in maintaining the standards of deliverance of NSS RLAC, primarily when half of the session continued in an online mode amidst the pandemic and the remaining half was shifted to the offline mode.

With colleges still shut owing to the pandemic, the idea of physical activity was pivotal in the month of August, as is reflected in most of the events being related to sports or physicality – The Home Olympic Games were organized on 3 August 2021 and 7 (3) volunteers participated actively, The National Youth Awards took place on 12 August 2021 wherein 35 (22) volunteers participated, a remote Tree Plantation Drive and a survey in the J. J. Colony were done on 15 August 2021 with all guidelines abided by wherein 10 (5) and 9 (6) volunteers took part respectively, and an event encouraging traditional dances was held on 25 August 2021 wherein all the 3 participating volunteers were females.

Furthermore, respect for the nation wasn't forgotten in this month of independence. Sports made way for art as an expression of patriotism and other things as events in light of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav and Independence Day were conducted on 15 August 2021, wherein 24 (15) volunteers sang the national anthem and 10 (6) volunteers shared videos with slogans from their most beloved freedom fighters. In addition to this, poster-making events were conducted on the occasions of World Organ Donation Day and the fourth intra-unit competition, Tarang, on 13 and 28-29 August 2021 respectively, wherein over 12 (9) and 22 (13) volunteers participated. Traditional wear was encouraged on World Photography Day and an event regarding traditional cuisine took place on 19 and 26 August 2021 respectively, and 12 (9) and 19 (14) volunteers took part respectively. The active month came to an end on World Sports Day, when 9 (7) participants penned down a letter to their favorite sportsperson on 29 August 2021.

September proved to be another busy month for the team, with a total of 18 activities being conducted throughout – right from Poster Making on varying themes including SCI, Nutritional Awareness and

Swachhta Pakhwada on 1, 8 and 20 September 2021 respectively, to Card Making on the occasion of Teachers' Day on 5 September 2021. The involvement of volunteers was massive, as they accounted for 20 (10), 11 (8), 15 (9) and 19 (15) in these events correlatively. NSS also collaborated with PGIMER Chandigarh on three other events apart from the poster making on Nutritional Awareness, which included the Social Networking Ambassadors spread over 5 to 19 September 2021, a Poem Recitation on 13 September 2021 and a Healthy Recipe Competition on 17 September 2021. These events saw a high participation from the volunteers, as they totaled to 34 (19), 5 (4) and 18 (11) in these events.

Over the course of the month, volunteers heightened their sensitivity towards a range of topics through an online group discussion with 21 (11) volunteers on the American invasion of Afghanistan on 11 September, slogan writing with 21 (13) volunteers on Hindi Diwas on 14 September, article writing with 9 (4) volunteers on International Day of Democracy on 15 September, a webinar on Bio-composting by Ms. Neeta Jain attended by 40 (25) volunteers on 18 September, a movie screening on World Rhino Day attended by 31 (19) volunteers on 22 September, video submissions on the International Day of Sign Languages by 32 (20) volunteers on 23 September, and brainwriting by 21 (11) volunteers as a part of Tarang on 26 September in the year 2021. Apart from this, three other important events that marked the successful month were the Run 4 Unity held on 7 September 2021 in which 12 (7) volunteers participated, COVID-19 Vaccination Awareness Drive in a J.J. Colony in Moti Bagh on 19 September 2021 wherein a total of 12 (9) volunteers were present, and the Quiz held in light of NSS Day on 24 September 2021, in which 26 (14) volunteers participated actively.

The volunteers geared up for a wider mix of online and remote offline activities as they stepped into the month of October. The month started with two remote activities planned in sync with Gandhi Jayanti and Animal Welfare Day on 2 and 4 October 2021. 7 (5) and 12 (7) volunteers cleaned up the areas around their homes and fed and/or helped the stray dogs in their localities. The activities that followed on 6 October and 10 October 2021 were two webinars by Ms. Siddharti Sharma and Dr. Jyotsana Mittal on the themes of Blood Donation Awareness and World Mental Health Day, which were attended by 46 (31) and 47 (28) volunteers respectively. On 15 October and 24 October 2021, a movie screening and a quiz was held in celebration of World Students' Day and United Nations Day, which saw the participation of 35 (24) and 25 (15) volunteers.

The Vigilance Awareness Week was spread over the six days from 27 October till 1 November 2021, where a different activity was conducted each day – right from slogan writing on a Self-Reliant India and a documentary screening on Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's biography, to poetry writing, quiz, pledge-taking and meme-making on Corruption as a part of Tarang's first round, Vigilance Awareness as its second round, the overarching theme of the week, and raising awareness about Corruption respectively. In its entirety, the week saw a total participation of 148 (94). The month came to a successful end with the Digital Poster Making event by 18 (15) volunteers in light of Anti-Tobacco Campaign on 31 October 2021.

The Vigilance Awareness Week concluding at the beginning of November was followed by a creative burst of events at NSS. On 4 November 2021, 19 (13) volunteers took part in the joy of Rangoli Making. 7 November 2021 was marked by the National Cancer Awareness Day, wherein 17 (12) volunteers actively took part in spreading the word through article-writing. This creative streak was balanced by the reasoning volunteers exhibited on the World Science Day for Peace and Development through their experiments on 10 November 2021, 13 (9) participants reinforced the idea and importance of STEM. On 14 November, Children's Day, 19 (12) volunteers shared the joys of their hobbies with the world. The sincere and solemn spirit of the volunteers was reflected in their participation in a webinar on Organ Donation by Mr. Sujay Goswami when 40 (26) volunteers attended it on 19 November 2021. In a three-fold celebration of The Constitution Day, volunteers read the Preamble of India, took part in a Quiz, and articulated their thoughts

in a creative writing activity spread over 26 and 27 November 2021. The total overall participation in these events was of 93 (56) volunteers.

The last month of 2021 brought with it innovative activities which were both fun and left behind a learning. 18 (13) NSS volunteers embraced the true essence of the motto 'Not Me But You' as they celebrated the International Volunteer Day on 5 December with gusto, spreading the spirit of service for community by doing any act of volunteering they wished to. This connection to their society and community remained strong on 11 December when 24 (12) volunteers answered a quiz in accordance with Human Rights Day. A moment of immense pride for the unit was on 12 December 2021, when two NSS volunteers expressed their thoughts on Women Empowerment in India on All India Radio. The AIR NXT broadcast was heard and appreciated by 37 (23) volunteers.

The rest of the month, too, was filled with a plethora of activities as 24 (17) volunteers wrote slogans on 14 December 2021 on the occasion of National Energy Conservation Day, 26 (18) volunteers lit candles on 16 December 2021 in light of Vijay Diwas, 25 (15) volunteers wrote articles on 23 December 2021 celebrating National Kisan Diwas, and 13 (6) volunteers took part in a secret Santa activity in celebration of Christmas on 25 December 2021. The month ended with a flourish on 31 December 2021 when Tarang encouraged 26 (15) volunteers to take part in a quiz centered on the theme 'Good Governance'.

2022 began with a fresh wave of participation as newly selected volunteers joined in on the activities. On 4 January 2022, 103 (71) volunteers wrote down messages in Braille using lentils in celebration of World Braille Day. The speech competition event in accordance with National Youth Day took place over 11 and 12 January 2022, wherein a total of 144 (93) volunteers actively participated. 12 January also marked the date of National Youth Festival, wherein 121 (77) volunteers tuned in to the Prime Minister's virtual address to the youth of the nation. This youth also embraced the physical activity of performing a Surya Namaskar on the occasion of Makar Sankranti, when 211 (120) volunteers shared their pictures on 14 January 2022.

The twenty days from 21 January to 31 January 2022 set the foundations for the first offline event of the calendar year, when a Cloth Donation Drive took place in the college premises. 50 (28) volunteers took on the role of encouraging the donation which was ultimately distributed amongst those in need. On 22 January, 163 (98) volunteers actively participated in a quiz on the Role of Bengal in Indian Freedom Movement. Furthermore, when 24 January 2022 brought with it the National Girl Child Day, a total of 117 (82) volunteers showed their enthusiasm as the female volunteers shared their selfies with their mothers, and the remaining volunteers drew and designed posters for the event. On 29 January 2022, 189 (110) volunteers celebrated National Voter's Day through a presentation competition for Tarang 8.0. This month, too, came to an incredibly successful end with 178 (106) volunteers attending the Orientation Program held for them on 30 January 2022.

The NSS Unit of RLAC stepped into the month of February with a new determination, the same vision of community service and a more zealous outlook.

To propagate Cancer awareness and burst cancer stereotypes, on 4th February, 2022 (WORLD CANCER AWARENESS DAY) NSS RLA hosted a quiz on the relevant theme encouraging our volunteers to distribute the quiz forms among their kins. The online event engaged 212 (122) NSS Volunteers. In totality, we received 512 overwhelming responses.

On February 8: NSS RLAC in collaboration with ITC's WOW and E-SHREE foundation organized an offline Waste Segregation Drive at Harijan Camp, Lodhi Colony (slum in Central Delhi). The drive aimed at infusing a sense of cleanliness and sanitation whilst encouraging waste sorting and management along

with an interactive survey involving the locals, saw the active participation of our 33 (20) dedicated volunteers.

To bring out the productivity of each of our volunteers and to showcase their latent skills , we planned for an online MEME MAKING EVENT on 12th February(NATIONAL PRODUCTIVITY DAY). There were 61(36) humorous & witty entries.

On the occasion of National Women's Day (13th February) to commemorate the 143rd birth anniversary of 'Bharat Kokila' Sarojini Naidu , the NSS unit screened a documentary revolving around the freedom fighter's life , with the motive to inspire the values of integrity & patriotism in our volunteers. The event was lauded by 145 volunteers (82 girls).

Meanwhile, we handed over the clothes received during our Cloth Donation Drive , joined this time by 13 volunteers (8 females).

Our Tree Plantation Drive (7th episode) attracted 49(33) participants.

With the motto "Service above Self" in mind , we celebrated the WORLD PEACE AND UNDERSTANDING DAY on 23rd February ; wherein we asked our volunteers to share with us a picture of their source of peace. We ended up receiving 69 entries(42 females).

An offline gift distribution ceremony and interactive session with our volunteers on 24th February,2022 to admire their efforts was attended by 147(90).

The NSS Unit , RLAC also hosted an orientation program on February 26 in collaboration with the LADLI FOUNDATION TRUST . The event was graced by the proficient speaker Mr. Devendra Kumar (Founder & CEO Ladli) who inspired our volunteers to work for the betterment of our society. 194 volunteers (111 females) attended.

To raise awareness about & strengthen our resolve against the Rare Diseases , a Webinar organized by NSS RLAC on February 28 enlightened by guest speakers Jazz Sethi(Founder & Director of the Diabetes Foundation) & Deeksha Dev (Community Director at Diabetes Foundation) on the topic "DIABETES" , was met with an active response from our 171(91) volunteers .

We entered March with a Webinar on Road Safety Awareness organized on the 3rd . The event witnessing a participation from 134 volunteers (including 78 females) underscored the importance of traffic rules , was very informative & made super interactive by Guest Speakers Mr. Ravi Sharma and M. N. Joshi (Sr. Officers from Hero MotoCorp Ltd.)

To honor womanhood & inspire our youth with "their" grit , NSS RLA on March 8 (INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY) asked its volunteers to prepare a short video message dedicated to the women who inspire them in their lives. 12 volunteers (6 females) graced the event.

Dr. Santosh George (Director of CIIT) motivated our 60 NSS volunteers (including 32 females) to train the underprivileged & educate the less fortunate , in a Seminar organized by NSS RLAC on March 9,2022.

One of the most noble initiatives of NSS RLAC attracting 140 volunteers (comprising 86 females) was the Education Camp undertaken in the JJ Colony Slums , spanning from 10th March to 7th April ,2022. The camp consisted of an education survey by the assigned volunteers, teaching the young minds the basic reading and writing skills , engaging them through other fun activities like drawing, dancing etc. We also provided them with their stationery kits.

Celebrating the INTERNATIONAL DAY OF HAPPINESS on 20th March , NSS RLAC asked its volunteers to share their ‘moments of happiness’ through pictures / videos. The event was made a great success by the participation of its 62 (42)volunteers.

Volunteers of NSS RLAC were asked to plant and nurture , a ‘Seed of Hope’ on the occasion of World Forest Day (March 21,2022) and share their tenderly love through pictures / videos. This initiative received a diversity of “Human Emotions” in the form of 42 entries (including 25 girls).

To commemorate the sacrifices made by Shaheed Bhagat Singh , Shaheed Rajguru , Shaheed Sukhdev , the NSS unit of RLAC on the occasion of ‘Shaheed Diwas’ (March 23, 2022) hosted an online Slogan Writing & Poster Making Competition. Enthusiastic responses from 88 volunteers (including 47 females) were received.

To empower the ‘Persons With Disability’ , a ‘Swalambhan Yatra’ was organized by IDEA (Inclusive Divyangjan Entrepreneur Association) on March 24 ,2022 . Mr. Devendra Kumar exhorted our NSS volunteers to join the noble cause & spread the message of ‘inclusivity of all’ . 33 volunteers of NSS RLAC (22 females) contributed in the event.

On 1st April ,2022 80 NSS RLAC volunteers joined in for the ‘Pariksha Par Charcha’ event hosted by honorable PM of India Sh. Narendra Modi , to toughen up the students & make them face the exams confidently.

To promote traditional , regional & modern cuisines for a ‘Fit India’ the Ministry of Women & Child Development celebrates ‘POSHAN PAKHWADA’ on April 2nd . NSS RLAC & its 13 volunteers (8 females) joined the movement wherein they prepared a regional dish using any ingredient & offered their cooked meals to the needy & poor.

With the theme “Our Planet, Our Health”, the NSS unit of RLAC celebrated WORLD HEALTH DAY on April 7, 2022 encouraging its volunteers to share pictures/videos of them performing any physical activity. 27 volunteers (16 females) participated .

Ladli Foundation Trust in association with Delhi Police organized a ‘Nukkad Natak’ and a ‘Talk on Women Empowerment’ on 7th April,2022 . The event was bedecked with the likes of Smt. Nuzhat Hassan , IPS , Ms. Shazia Ilmi (Spokesperson , BJP) , Smt. Ranjana Kumari (Social Activist). 13 NSS Volunteers (4 females) gained exposure through the enlightening talk of the panel.

On April 11 the NSS Unit of RLAC kickstarted its annual fest SANKALP ’22 by organizing a Blood Donation Camp in collaboration with the Indian Red Cross Society . The event witnessed a turn up of 42 (18) donor-volunteers.

The preparations of our Annual Fest (April 1 to 12) involved the hard-work, patience and dedication of 98 volunteers including 54 female volunteers. From planning for an Open Mic Competition ,Music Performances , Inter Unit Face-Offs , attracting Fest Sponsors , inviting Sh. Jangjilong (NSS Regional Director, Delhi) to managing all other chores , our resilient volunteers put in their best to make it a success.

Our Tree Plantation Drive, for the month of April (8th Episode, 15.04.22) witnessed participation from 18(10) volunteers.

On 21st April ,2022 NSS RLAC brought up a ‘Best Out of Waste’ Event to mark the WORLD CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION DAY, recognized by the UN. The concept of 3-Rs was dutifully executed in the innovative arts of our 26(19) volunteers.

“Climate Change and Environmentally Geared Economics” was the central theme of the Webinar organized by NSS RLAC in association with the ECO CLUB on 22nd April. Prolific Speaker from Montclair State University , New Jersey , Dr. Nidhi Thakur shared her insights about climate change & its impact on the economy thriving in the present scenario, with our 104 (56)volunteers participating.

On 26th April, 2022 NSS RLA organized a workshop on Emotional Well Being: KEY TO SUCCESS where Dr. Sanjeev Siddharth , the COS & HOD Psychiatry at Miramichi Regional Hospital, Canada and Air Marshal Naresh Verma delivered insightful lecture on the significant yet seldom addressed issue of mental health. The session was attended by 85(44) volunteers.

A momentous event , as the University of Delhi completed its 100 glorious years : on the 1st of May ,2022 ; 6 NSS Volunteers of RLAC (2 females) along with Program Officer Dr. Rita Jain , Principal Sir graced the Centenary Celebrations with honorable Vice President of India Sh. M .Venkaiah Naidu & honorable Education Minister of India Sh. Dharmendra Pradhan being the chief guests.

On May 2 , 2022 (WORLD LAUGHTER DAY) , NSS RLAC organized a Stand-Up / Meme Making Event with a purpose of bringing people together through laughter alone . The event was greeted with a participation from 40 volunteers (25 females).

One of our longest launched initiatives , the Tree Plantation Drive in its 9th episode (15th May,2022) attracted participation from 12(8) volunteers.

On 18th May ,2022 to spread awareness about HIV immunization , on the occasion of WORLD AIDS VACCINE DAY , our NSS RLAC presented to its volunteers an Article Writing Event . 31(18) volunteers with the power of their pens shared some emphatic & informative articles.

A three-day international seminar from May 19 – May 21 ,2022 organized by Department of Political Science, University Of Delhi themed as “Revisiting the Ideas of India from Swaraj to New India” which witnessed a gathering of some the most renowned intellectuals, students & famous personalities like honorable Union Home Minister of India, Sh. Amit Shah & Education Minister of India Sh. Dharmendra Pradhan , gave 11 (including 6 female) of NSS RLAC volunteers , the chance to contribute in the successful conduction of the seminar.

In bid to celebrate & promote the protection of the endangered species , NSS RLAC on 21st May ,2022 hosted an online Face Painting / White T- Shirt painting event central to the theme. The event received 11 (6)entries .

To raise awareness about Menstruation & wipe out the taboos against it , the NSS unit of RLAC on WORLD MENSTRUAL HYGIENE DAY (28th May) asked its volunteers to share a photo of a red dot on hand and a message breaking the social anathema against it. Participation from 51(38) volunteers made the event a success.

On June 1 ,2022, NSS RLAC organized a Story/Post Creating Event with the purpose of sharing the message of ‘the need of securing our Cyberspace’. This event on Cyber Jagrukta Diwas attracted 30(19) volunteers.

A 7.5 km long cycle rally for the students, at National Stadium on the WORLD BICYCLE DAY (June 3,2022) was organized by MoYAS . Two volunteers from NSS RLAC participated in the event aimed at promoting the ‘Fit India’ , ‘Khelo India’ , ‘Clean India’ & ‘ Healthy India’ outreaches of the Government Of India.

The 10th episode of Our Tree Plantation Drive (15th June,2022) received responses from 12 volunteers (including 8 females).

On the occasion of 8th International Yoga Day , NSS RLAC in collaboration with the Yoga & Meditation Committee hosted a two day Yoga Session (20th June-21st June ,2022). 35 NSS volunteers (including 16 female) incorporated Yoga as a healthy habit into their daily lives. Another batch of 30 enthusiastic NSS RLAC volunteers (18 female) on 22nd June , 2022 participated in the Yoga Day Celebrations hosted in the University Stadium, North Campus where Yogrishi Swami Ramdev Ji was present as a Chief Guest.

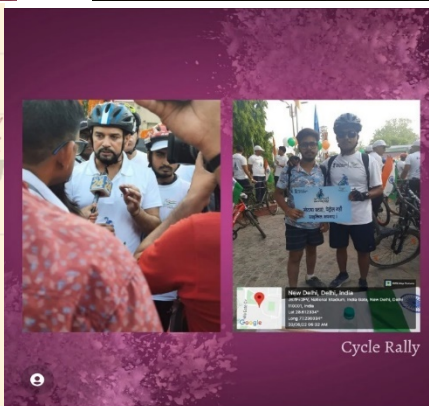
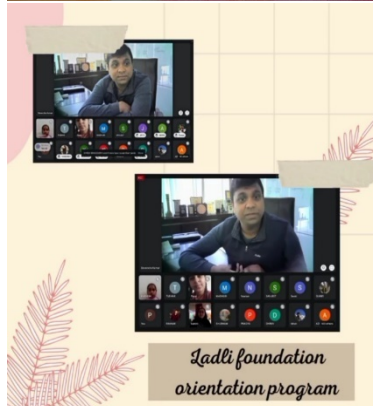
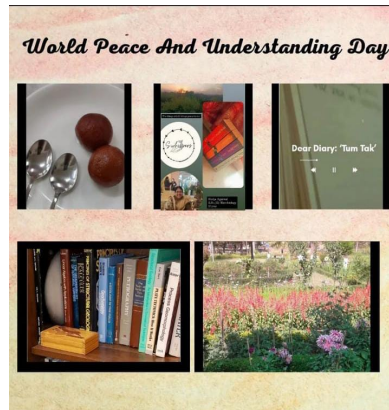

To fight the abusive clutches of Drugs , on the occasion of INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE AND ILLICIT TRAFFICKING (June 26 ,2022) , the NSS unit of RLAC screened a documentation emphasizing the need to free the youth from the perilous embrace of the drugs. A total of 141(97) volunteers joined in . Earlier on, on 24th June , 2022 ‘Nashe se Azadi’ Event attracted participation from our 188(104) volunteers.

In the month of July, on the 9th , 82(41) volunteers of NSS RLAC witnessed a Grand Social Event SHAGUN- A UNIQUE MASS WEDDING OF 51 DAUGHTERS & SOCIAL ADOPTION OF 101 UNDERPRIVILEGED GIRLS. 11 female volunteers & 6 male volunteers coordinated the event exhibiting their sharp leadership skills. With the aim of promoting health , education of girls , eliminate child marriages , gender discrimination the LADLI FOUNDATION TRUST successfully executed their noble initiative with assistance from the enthusiastic , selfless, experienced NSS RLAC Volunteers.

Meanwhile ,15 (10 females) from NSS RLAC volunteered in the Yuva Sammelan Event organized by ‘My Home India’ social organization at Vigyan Bhawan, with the honorable president of India Shri Ramnath Kovind Ji as the Chief Guest , on the same day itself. The objective of the event was Rashtrawaad Par Manthan /Motivating the youth to stand for true national cause.

Meanwhile ,15 (10 females) from NSS RLAC volunteered in the Yuva Sammelan Event organized by ‘My Home India’ social organization at Vigyan Bhawan, with the honorable president of India Shri Ramnath Kovind Ji as the Chief Guest , on the same day itself. The objective of the event was Rashtrawaad Par Manthan /Motivating the youth to stand for true national cause. A seed collection drive in collaboration with Dr. Santosh George was also organized lasted from 6th-19th July, 2022 where 59 volunteers, of which 33 female volunteers collected at least 10-15 seeds of two fruits out of Mango, Jamun and Peach. A 5-Day Plastic awareness drive was conducted from 12th to 16th July, with events such as poster making, spreading awareness inside colleges of Ram Lal Anand, Aryabhatta and Motilal Nehru college, outside areas like JJ colony, Anand Niketan, Satya Niketan, Vasant Gaon and in the neighborhood areas where 75 volunteers of which 35 were female participated.
