EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

HAR GHAR TIRANGA

August 1-10, 2022

To commemorate India's 76th year of independence the government launched the campaign "Har Ghar Tiranga" in order to invoke the many sacrifices made for the independence of our country. The NSS Unit of Ram Lal Anand College, University of Delhi, encouraged their volunteers to take part in 3 projects lasting from 1st to 10th August 2022.

Project 1: the volunteers were required to pin an Indian flag in their home/area and click a selfie with it.

Project 2: they were encouraged to visit 10 households in their local area and spread awareness regarding this campaign.

Project 3: the volunteers were directed to collect data about the unsung heroes of the freedom struggle at the local level.

These projects were successful in inspiring and motivating the volunteers to take pride in our nation and give their service to it as over 30 volunteers participated in this campaign.





COLLEGE DECORATION

August 6, 2022

The event was successful in igniting a spirit of patriotism among the people present, which crossed over 70.






DECLAMATION

DEBATE COMPETITION


September 15, 2022




MOBILE BOOK EXHIBITION

NSS DAY


September 24, 2022

GANDHI JAYANTI


October 2, 2022

WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY


October 10, 2022

October 12, 2022


The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Ram Lal Anand College organised a 4-day series of events under the banner of 'Swachhata 2.0'.

SWACHHATA DRIVE, PHASE - 2




The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Ram Lal Anand College organised a 4-day series of events under the banner of 'Swachhata 2.0'.

October 14, 2022


The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Ram Lal Anand College organised a 4-day series of events under the banner of 'Swachhata 2.0'.

SLOGAN WRITING


October 15, 2022

SEMINAR ON HPV AWARENESS


October 17, 2022

October 17-20, 2022


In collaboration with Goonj - an NGO, the unit organised a 4-day long material donation drive.

PLEDGE + DOCUMENTARY


October 28, 2022

Nearly 80 students joined the meeting and participated in both the activities.






ESSAY / HANDMADE POSTER

The posters were not just artistically impressive but also wisely made. The essays were well-sought and had a lot of information that is lost somewhere between the pages of textbooks.






E-POSTER MAKING COMPETITION

Nearly 180 volunteers took part in the pledge out of which 88 were female volunteers.




WORLD AIDS DAY


December 1, 2022

NATIONAL POLLUTION CONTROL DAY


December 2, 2022

SWACHHATA 3.0


December 12-16, 2022

Upon the completion of the event, the 55 participants (23 female participants) were provided the e-certificates.






KISAN DIWAS

51 volunteers participated in the quiz and showcased their awareness and intellect through their answers.






CHRISTMAS


WORLD DAY OF WAR ORPHANS




NATIONAL YOUTH DAY


INDIAN ARMY DAY

MISSION LIFE QUIZ


January 18, 2023





PARAKRAM DIWAS

ANTI-TOBACCO AWARENESS CAMPAIGN


February 2, 2023


WORLD CANCER AWARENESS DAY DRIVE


INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY


INAUGARATION OF INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

The dignitaries pointed out the importance of the united strength of the nation, and its potential in bringing transformation in the world and praising the triumphs of Indians.






CHANAKYA - A PLAY DIRECTED BY MANOJ JOSHI




NATIONAL YOUTH FESTIVAL
